female 17-year-old Tzofim (Israel
Scouts) in each. They crisscross North
America each summer as emissaries,
sharing their lives in Israel through
song, dance and story. Participants are
chosen after undergoing an extensive
auditioning and interviewing process,
ensuring that above all, they are true
representatives of Israeli culture and
spirit.

Each teen in the Friendship Caravan
is a member of the 60,000 person strong
Tzofim (Israel Scouts) Movement, which
is part of the International Scouting
movement. The Tzofim Movement is the
only non-political and non-sectarian
youth movement in Israel. Each delegate
must exhibit leadership qualities, a high
level of scouting and extensive knowl-
edge of Israeli and Jewish history.

Tova Mordechai was born Tonica Marlow to a British evangelist minister father and an Egyptian Jewish mother. At the age of sixteen, Tova was accepted as the youngest student at a noted theological college, and within four years she had become an ordained minister. Yet, with all of her success, she could not explain the deep pain she felt inside. She began to wonder about church teachings and practice as well as her mother's heritage. In her autobiography *Playing with Fire* she describes her painful ordeal and transition from Christian asceticism to Jewish observance.

Tova resides in Safed, Israel with her husband and four children.

Chuck Freilich is a Senior Fellow at the Belfer Center at Harvard University's Kennedy School and until recently was Israel's Deputy National Security Adviser. His primary areas of expertise are US-Mid East and Israeli national security policy. He teaches political science at the Tel Aviv and Hebrew Universities and also co-directs a Middle Eastern affairs consultancy.

Chuck was a senior analyst at the Israel Ministry of Defense, focusing on strategic affairs, policy advisor to a cabinet minister and a delegate of the Israeli Mission to the UN. He was the executive director of two non-profits and served in the Israeli defense forces for five years (Reserve Major). Chuck earned his Ph.D. from Columbia University. Born in New York, he immigrated to Israel in his teens.
