Executive Director's Letter



Dear Friends:

I write to you this month with a heavy heart. The recent events in Toulouse, France are a sad reminder that the scourge of anti-Semitism remains in our world. It should be noted a full picture about the murderer of four innocent Jews, who may have also killed three French soldiers, is not yet known. Nonetheless, while apparently the attacker was an Al Qaeda adherent, can there be any doubt that hatred of Jews lurked as an underlying cause?

In recent years, particularly here in the United States, some have speculated we are entering a post anti-Semitic era. There is no doubt visible signs of anti-Semitism in the west have declined, certainly when compared to the period before and including the Holocaust. This line of thinking sees anti-Semitism as declining and, where it does exist, as something that happens "over there", notably in Europe and the Middle East. While I understand this feeling, I wonder whether this is true.

Kenneth Waltzer, MSU professor and Director of Jewish Studies, recently spoke in Grand Rapids about 'The New Anti-Semitism' in a program sponsored by Congregation Ahavas Israel, Temple Emanuel and the Jewish Federation of Grand Rapids. Professor Waltzer expressed the viewpoint during his talk that this new form of anti-Semitism focuses on the collective Jew, i.e. Israel. If so, this new strain of anti-Semitism follows in a long line of its predecessors dating back at least to the time of Moses.

Professor Waltzer's thesis also raises the question: how much of the seemingly intractable conflicts Israel faces in the Middle East are caused by anti-Semitism? Do the Palestinians refuse to make peace due to rational disputes over land, or irrational hatred of the Jewish people? Do the Iranian leaders seek to acquire nuclear weapons to gain power in the Middle East and across the globe, or to wipe Israel off the map?

Like many such questions, I suspect the answer may be some of each. Of note, it is my

view we as Jews should be careful to not charge anti-Semitism whenever problems arise between Jews and non-Jews. There can be many reasons for disputes that have nothing to do with the hatred of Jews. On the other hand, it would be naïve to assume that anti-Semitism plays no part in certain situations (e.g. violent attacks against civilians), whether against individual Jews such as in Toulouse, or the State of Israel.

As troubling as these questions are, the more fundamentally difficult question to answer is, of course, 'why'. It is hard to believe we now live 70 years after the days of Nazi Germany's infamous 'Final Solution'. The Holocaust has been studied and analyzed as much as any event in modern times, yet it seems we are no closer to the answer of what drives anti-Semitism. Why does hatred of Jews persist?

As I've searched for answers over the years, it seems more questions are raised than answers found. Is anti-Semitism a psychological disease? Is it a phenomenon of certain cultures or religions? Is it a pernicious strain of racism, hatred and fear of 'the other'? Is it all of the above....and much, much more?

As with past issues raised in this space, I look forward to your thoughts on this troubling, timeless problem we face as Jews. When we sit down for our Seders, we will once again review and consider the many lessons Pass-over teaches us, including the reality that anti-Semitism has been around a long time, and we can expect it to remain with us, perhaps in some new forms, for the foreseeable future.



It is customary to make a donation to a Ma'ot Hittim fund at the time of *mekhirat hametz* to help others fulfill the mitzvah of Pesah.


