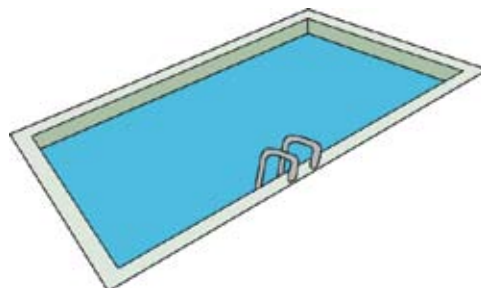

What is the Community Endowment?

It is annual campaign time around the JCC/Jewish Federation of Greater Harrisburg. The campaign leadership is gearing up for Super Sunday and the larger gifts

are being solicited.

As you are probably aware, the JCC/Federation cannot exist on the dues that members pay. Without the annual campaign, the com-

munity could not enjoy all of the programs and benefits brought to us by the JCC/Federation.

You will be asked to give as much as you can, especially this year when,

after the flood of September 2011, the community has added expenses to recover from the damage.

And then you will be asked to give a little more to the Community Endowment, a campaign initiated by the Foundation to assure the future of the community.

What exactly is the Community Endowment? How does it work and why should you give?

This is a pooled endowment (some call it a giving circle) where all members of the community are asked to donate what they can. All of the gifts are pooled into one fund which will be added to the amount donated into this fund last year (only the income from last year's donations is being used by the JCC/Federation this year. The principal amount stays and grows with this year's donations).

Each year, as more and more



money is donated to the fund, the fund grows, as does the income. Each year, the income from the fund is distributed to the JCC/Federation as the first gift to the campaign. Each year, as the cost of the programs of your JCC/Federation increase (inflation is inevitable), the income from this fund – hopefully – will keep pace.

This can only work with all of our participation. Please respond when you are asked. This is the community's endowment; this is the community's future.

When I scanned a popular Jewish website back at the beginning of December 2011, I got a blast from the past. I learned that the Mayor of Lakewood, NJ, Menashe Miller, is also a Chaplain Major in the U.S. Air Force Reserve. According to the article, 37-year-old Mayor/Major Miller would not spend Chanukah

PA. The two summers I spent there as a 9- and 10-year-old boy made a positive impression on me. Despite the fact that my bunk-mates came from different Jewish communities and day-schools, we quickly discovered how much we had in common, and we enjoyed two great summers together.

(The third box of treats was not shipped until December 29th, and its contents will be distributed upon arrival.) He also identified the other kids in the camp photo were; he obviously has an excellent memory.

I feel great about Keshet Israel's effort to support our troops. This

project allowed us to show our brave servicemen and women that we are thinking of them, especially during Chanukah. It also gave me the opportunity to remember some happy childhood experiences and reconnect with an old friend. All of us at KI wish Chaplain Miller the best in his current deployment and that he, together with all of our servicemen and women, will soon return home safely.

all the names of the boys in my bunks, I clearly recalled that one of them was from Lakewood, NJ and was named Menashe Miller. As I looked at the accompanying picture of the Mayor, I was sure that this was the same Menashe Miller who had once been my bunk-mate.

I realized this was an excellent chance to reconnect with a childhood friend, as well as an opportunity for Keshet Israel Congregation to reach out in support of U.S. servicemen and women. I contacted the government offices of Lakewood, NJ. After a receptionist told me how to send care packages to our troops, KI immediately began a pre-Chanukah "Treats for Troops" drive.

I am proud to say that an incredible amount of 'pick-me-up' items were generously donated for our troops overseas. Items included packets of tuna, salmon, instant oatmeal, granola bars, energy bars, nuts, cookies, hot cocoa, tea, instant drink mixes, batteries, hand sanitizers, pretzels, and much more. All told, KI shipped three large boxes of treats to Chaplain Miller who distributed their contents on our behalf to many appreciative soldiers and





SYLVAN "SHAMIE" MELMAN

Shamie Melman, 90, formerly of Middletown and Harrisburg, PA, passed away Sunday, September 25, 2011 in Los Angeles, California due to complications following surgery.

Shamie was a P-47 fighter pilot during World War 11, having flown over 55 combat missions in the European Theatre. He was awarded The Air Medal with 7 Oak Leaf Clusters, as well as The Presidential Unit Citation for "extraordinary heroism and exemplary devotion to duty." His squadron,

the 36th Fighter Group, was "instrumental in striking a blow at enemy transportation and personnel at an important juncture in the campaign in northern France ..." While on vacation in London in 2003, Shamie looked up

a fellow flyer who took him to the field where he was stationed. It was no longer an air field, but Shamie still recognized the place. During the Korean War, he flew C-119s, multi-engine transports used to ferry troops supplies from Japan to the Korean War zone.

Shamie loved flying and was especially delighted to take a turn at

the controls of the plane his son, Jeff, was piloting in 2008. After being discharged from the U.S. Air Force, Shamie returned to Harrisburg and joined his father in the family clothing business, located in Middletown, Pa. After raising their family in Harrisburg, Shamie and Winnie retired to West Palm Beach, Florida in the mid-1990s, where they resided for 15 years. In May 2011, they moved to Los Angeles, California to be closer to their children and grandchildren. An avid tennis player, Shamie played three times a week, well into his late 80s. Shamie is survived by

Winifred, his wife of 66 years; two sons, Jeff and Jim; two daughters-in-law, Lana and Helen; and three grandchildren, Zachary, Luke and Rachel.
