The Women of Vision Philanthropic Fund held its Annual Awards Presentation and Spring Event at the JCC on the evening of June 13th. This year the Fund was able to award \$2,550 in grants to deserving Jewish women and their families in the Harrisburg area.

Arlynn Weber, Chair of the Women of Vision, kicked off the evening with her announcement of the Vi\$ion of Change project. Each women present received a tzedakah box and was asked to fill it with change to aid the **Women of Vision Philanthropic Fund**. This initiative will help to increase the fund balance which will then increase the amount available for distribution to needy women and children in the Harrisburg area.

Dr. Diane Sand, Chair of the Grants Committee, presented the nine grants issued through six agencies, organization or synagogues in the Harrisburg area. These grants spanned a variety of recipients from single mothers, a new immigrant and a holocaust survivor to name a few.

Stephanie Harshbarger and Tracey Lencioni-Smith from Dr. Robert E. Wolf's *watersEDGE* office spoke about dermal fillers, laser treatments, facials and chemical peels. Shelley Adler followed up with attuning our inner beings to look good from the inside out.

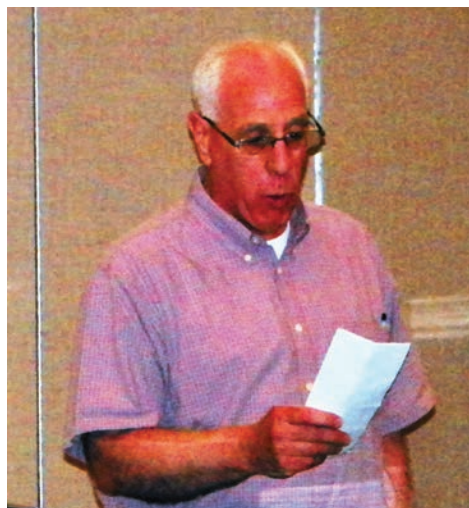

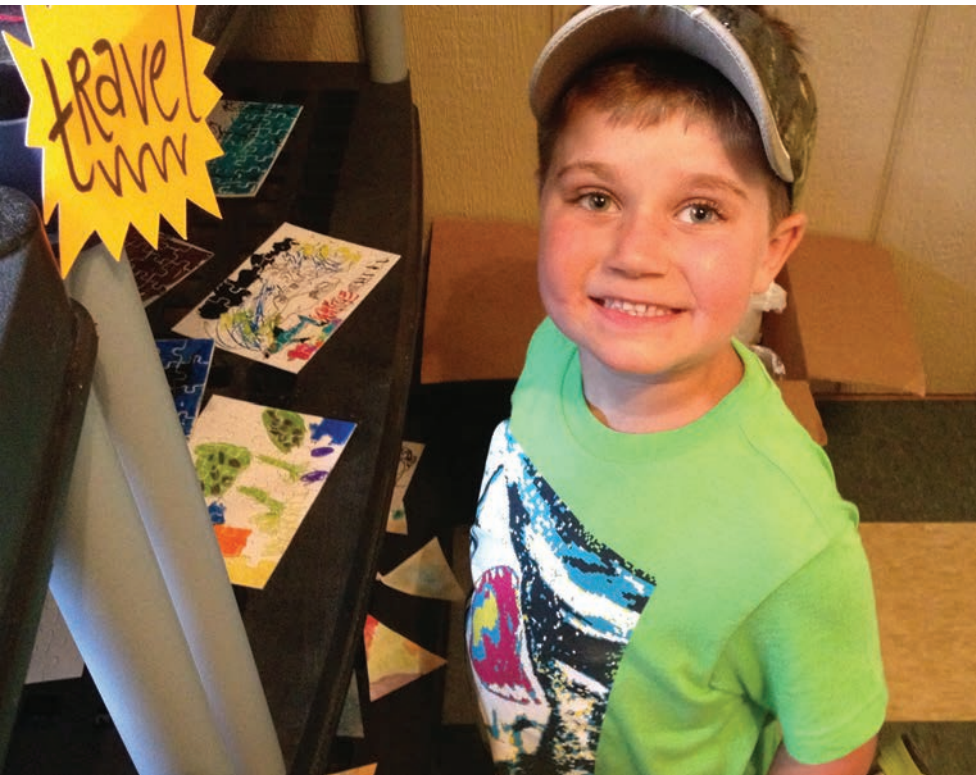

David Kopp, pianist, is Associate Professor and Director of Graduate Studies at the Boston University School of Music, where he is a member of the music theory faculty. A Harrisburg native, David holds an undergraduate degree from Harvard University and graduate degrees from Stony Brook University and Brandeis University. His teachers include Charles Rosen, Nadia Boulanger, Katja Andy, Jules Gentil, and Dorothea Ziegler.

David has performed extensively as soloist and chamber musician in the United States and abroad, including the Edinburgh Festival Fringe; Wigmore Hall, London; and Jordan Hall, Boston. He has appeared as concerto soloist with the Harrisburg and Hershey Symphony Orchestras and the Brandeis Symphony.

With pianist Rodney Lister, David has recorded four-hand music of American composers Arthur Berger, Virgil Thomson, and Harold Shapero for New World Records. He has also recorded for the CRI and ARTBSN labels. Prior to Boston University, David taught at Yale, Harvard, and the University of Washington.

David is the author of the book Chromatic Transformations in Nineteenth-Century Music, published by Cambridge University Press, as well as numerous articles and essays. His first public performance, at age 5, took place in the JCC's Mary Sachs Auditorium.

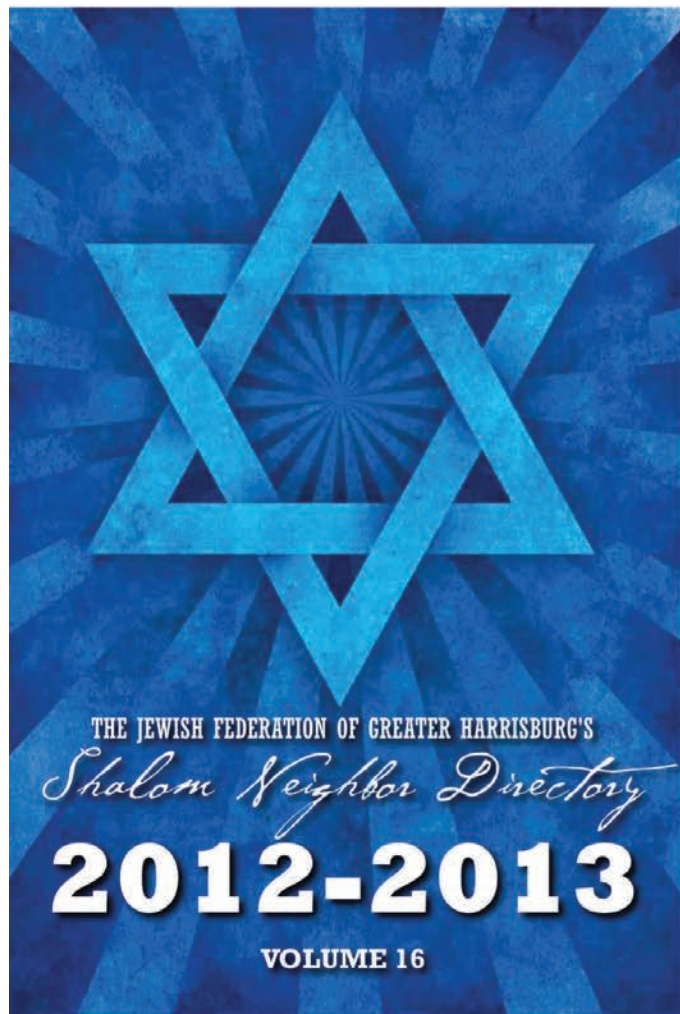
