# Enhancing quality of life for those in need



## Our Opportunity:

Hundreds of people call on UJFC beneficiary agencies each year for help with avoiding eviction, overdue utility bills, medical needs, medical related transportation and other immediate financial issues. Many have lost jobs and are struggling to put food on the table. Together as a community, we get them back on their feet.

## Your Gift Made a Difference Last Year:

- More than 153 job-seekers received help finding work and enhancing job skills.
- Eighty-one households received financial emergency grants totaling \$47,938.
- More than 200 children and adults with physical and developmental disabilities participated in inclusion programs.
- Government affairs initiatives secured nearly \$25 million in government funding for St. Paul agencies and schools.

## Bringing comfort and care to the elderly

### Our Opportunity:

Forty percent of all elderly Jews in our community live alone and many have no family nearby for support. These community members need access to social activities, healthcare, transportation, housing, food and counseling. Together as a community, we ensure they live out their lives safely and with dignity.

### Your Gift Made a Difference Last Year:

- The Kosher Meals on Wheels program delivered 21,863 meals to elderly and disabled residents of greater St. Paul.
- More than 2,000 older adults received services such as home delivered meals, transportation, health screenings, information and referral, and tax assistance.
- Russian speaking seniors received interpreter services for about 5,720 doctor appointments.
- In guided exercise programs, seniors received help from trained instructors to maintain their physical health.

## Sustaining our connection to Israel & the world



### Our Opportunity:

It can be difficult for new immigrants and Ethiopian-Israelis to find work. Elderly Jews in the former Soviet Union face crippling poverty. Together as a community, we support our brothers and sisters and ensure our connection to the global Jewish community.

### Your Gift Made a Difference Last Year:

- Israel's youngest Ethiopian immigrants received help through a summer camp designed to close educational and cognitive gaps.
- St. Paul's Israeli Emissary worked with the community to enhance the connection between Israel and Minnesota.
- In the former Soviet Union, 250,000 people received urgently needed medications, home health care, winter relief and Jewish social services daily.
- More than 100 presentations at local churches, schools, senior facilities and community centers helped shape public understanding of the Arab-Israeli conflict.

### Our Opportunity:

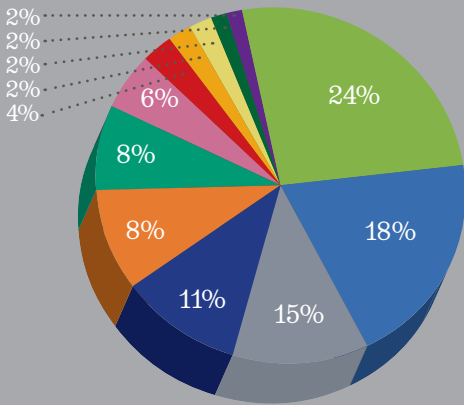
