# Message from the Chair and CEO of Federation

Dear Friends,

We write this letter for the Annual Report and reflect on 2019 under the highly trying times of June 2020, as the world faces an unprecedented global pandemic and economic crisis.

We remain proud of the rapid construction of the Jewish Superhighway that took place in 2019. As you know, the Jewish Superhighway is a metaphor for meaningful Jewish experiences and journeys; where Jewish life is vibrant, and no one is left behind.

With new strategic funding, Federation successfully implemented two signature initiatives – Microgrants to help build Jewish life and the fully subscribed Jewish Jumpstart program that incentivized new members to join either a synagogue/temple of their choice, or the Soloway Jewish Community Centre. Federation significantly increased funding for Jewish Day Schools,

the vulnerable and Jewish experiences. Federation adopted and has begun implementing a new, bold five-year strategic plan. While simultaneously increasing the Annual Campaign, we are pleased and proud to partner with other Jewish organizations in an effort led by the Ottawa Jewish Community Foundation to secure Legacy gifts through the new Life & Legacy program.

In short, 2019 was a terrific year, filled with accomplishment and promise.

While there is currently much uncertainty, we are heartened by two constants of Jewish Ottawa: caring community members and the stellar leadership of Jewish institutions. We know that some aspects of the Jewish Superhighway will be delayed as the community deals with emergency needs. But we know that our core remains strong, and delays will be temporary.

We are grateful and appreciative for our dedicated board and volunteers, our incredible Annual Campaign Co-chairs Rabbi Reuven Bulka and Dr. Karen Palayew, our hard-working staff, exceptionally generous donors and wonderful community – thank you, everyone!
