Jewish Federation of Ottawa

Purpose: To fund new and creative initiatives that contribute to vibrant Jewish life. Federation will fund events, activities and programs that connect people, meet a unique need, and/or fill a gap in our Jewish community.

Deadline: Ongoing and open

Purpose: For Federation-funded agencies and synagogues to strengthen and improve their organizations, programs, and services through a one-time allocation of funds.

Deadline: Two rounds of applications, one in November and one in April/May.

3. Security Matching Grants for Federal Government of Canada Security Infrastructure Program (SIP)

Purpose: To provide matching funds to local Jewish organizations who have successfully obtained a Government of Canada SIP grant.

Deadline: Deadline are dependent on the SIP grant timeline and change each year. (Previous deadlines were early October).

Ottawa Community Foundation

The Ottawa Community Foundation has been allocated \$2.245M from the Community Services Recovery Fund (CSRF) to support organizational systems and processes that will enable Community Service Organizations (CSOs) in Ottawa to emerge in strength from the pandemic. This is one of three CSRF streams available to CSOs.

Helping Protect Communities Against Racism and Hate:

Purpose: Helping protect communities against racism and hate through the province's new \$1.6 million Anti-Racism Anti-Hate Grant Program. Eligible organizations, including community-based, not-for-profit organizations, can apply for grants of \$40,000 over two years for independent projects, or \$100,000 over two years for partnerships between two or more organizations.

Deadline: This application is now closed.
