Jewish Jumpstart was an incentive program to help Jewish individuals and families, who were not yet members, join an Ottawa synagogue, or the Soloway Jewish Community Centre. This two-year membership discount made belonging possible for more people in our community.

Advocacy and Community Relations

On issues from human rights to security, antisemitism and social welfare, we promote our interests to government and community stakeholders, together with our partner Centre for Israel and Jewish Affairs (CIJA).

non-Jewish organizations joined CIJA's coalition to combat online hate, leading to a June 2019 Parliamentary Report entitled "Taking Action to Combat Online Hate" that included many of the recommendations CIJA made when testifying at the House of Commons Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights.

Election 2019

Roundtable meetings with candidates from the Liberal, Conservative, NDP and Green Parties in advance of the October Federal Election allowed our community leadership and students from OJCS to ask the candidates questions on issues ranging from support for Israel to community security.

Antisemitism

The federal government adopted the International Holocaust Remembrance Association (IHRA) definition of antisemitism as part of its new anti-racism strategy in June 2019. The IHRA definition recognizes anti-Zionism as a form of modern antisemitism.
