Israeli culture, traditions and Hebrew language

Through fun programs and interactions, the ShinShinim bring Israeli culture, traditions and Hebrew language to our youth. The ShinShinim are trained facilitators who come to Ottawa prepared to share Israel's history and diversity.

Some of the programs include:

- · Israeli music and food
- The life of Yitzak Rabin and Rabin Memorial Day
- · Controversial Israeli Laws
- · Hebrew Slang
- Who is an Israeli? A lesson in ethnic and culture diversity in Israel. Israelis are Polish, Arab, Ethiopian, Druze, Moroccan, and so on!
- · Army service and the IDF
- · Israeli sports
- · Holocaust remembrance and modern-day antisemitism
- · Yom Hazikaron commemoration & Yom Haatzmaut celebration

At synagogues, they deliver *D'var Israel* and share views on current events with congregations. During summer months, the Shinshinim work at Camp B'nai Brith, and support youth leadership.

The ShinShinim are loved by both the students and teachers.

Host Family Experience

Shinshinim are hosted by up to three local families in a year in Ottawa. Despite their busy schedule, a special bond often forms between the Shinshinim and host families. Our families provide a unique bridge to the community and play an important role in the success of the program. They balance out the hectic itinerary and provide much needed home comforts. They also offer our young Israeli guests a chance to learn about Jewish life in the diaspora: our values, challenges, sense of community and identity.
