# MESSAGE from Leadership



Dear Friends,

October 7 shook us to our core. Yet, even in the face of unimaginable tragedy, it did not shake our unwavering commitment to Israel, our values, or one another. Instead, it strengthened us—bringing us closer together, fortifying our resolve, and deepening our determination to secure our shared Jewish future.

In the days following that horrific event, our community demonstrated the power of unity and generosity. Together, we raised \$2.6 million to help Israelis begin rebuilding their lives and communities—a remarkable contribution to the \$855 million raised nationally. Additionally, through Federation’s 2024 Annual Campaign, we secured \$6.3 million to meet the ongoing needs of Jewish Charlotte, Israel, and Jewish communities worldwide.

This unity has been critical as we faced a troubling rise in antisemitism, both locally and globally. Hate-filled rhetoric and actions targeting Jewish people have surged, underscoring the urgency of standing together to combat prejudice and defend our community.

As we reflect on these challenges, your Federation is addressing four critical priorities that have emerged for our post-October 7 world:

- Standing with Israel
- Combating antisemitism with Outshine Hate
- Securing Jewish Charlotte with LiveSecure
- Engaging, educating, and empowering our Jewish future

Over the past year, your support has helped us make a meaningful impact in each of these areas. Together, we:

- Engaged thousands through community programs and celebrations that strengthened Jewish identity and connection.
- Expanded our community relations and advocacy efforts, culminating in the successful passage of the Shalom Act, which codifies the IHRA definition of antisemitism into North Carolina state law.
- Contributed more than \$500,000 to enhance the security of Jewish organizations throughout greater Charlotte.
- Connected people of all ages to Jewish life and Israel through initiatives like teen leadership programs, Israel Masterclass Series speakers, and PJ Library.

While we are proud of our accomplishments, there is still much more to do. In 2025, your increased support will enable us to expand our impact, ensuring we continue addressing the most pressing needs of our Jewish community.

Together, with our partner agencies and you, we are committed to building a strong, vibrant future for Jewish Charlotte and the global Jewish people. Your generosity and partnership make this vision possible, and we are deeply grateful for your trust and support.

## Solidarity Mission to Israel: Giving Hope and Building Jewish Identity

In January of this year, Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte hosted a powerful Solidarity Mission to Israel, bringing members of our community together to stand in unity with Israel and hear the stories of those deeply impacted by the October 7 attacks. This mission was a journey of connection, education, and reflection, offering participants firsthand insights into Israel's challenges and the unwavering resilience of its people.

The carefully curated itinerary brought participants to communities and regions profoundly affected by the attacks, including kibbutzim and southern towns devastated by Hamas's violence. These visits revealed the stark realities of loss and destruction, but also the glimmers of hope and renewal that persisted.

Participants also felt a shared sense of purpose and determination. Our greater Charlotte Jewish community's contribution of over \$2.6 million to the Israel Emergency Campaign has made a tangible impact. Nationwide, this campaign has raised over \$861 million to provide essential support to Israel, demonstrating the global Jewish community's steadfast commitment. Seeing the direct results of this generosity, mission participants left with a renewed understanding of the critical importance of their contributions.

Throughout the trip, the group of eight Charlotte community members encountered gratitude that deeply moved them. "Every person we spoke to thanked us for being there and for our support," said Lisa Strause Levinson, 2025 Annual Campaign Super Event Co-Chair. She also noted a touching moment of reciprocity when several Israelis expressed their concern for Jewish communities in the United States, recognizing the rise in antisemitism abroad.

The trip highlighted the personal stories of resilience that embody Israel's strength. One particularly powerful encounter came when participants met Noa Beer, a survivor of the Nova music festival massacre. As she recounted her harrowing experience, she left the group with a message of hope: "We will dance again."



Rabbi Lexi Erdheim of Temple Beth El reflected on the depth of the mission, sharing that it created opportunities for genuine human connection. “Hearing these stories firsthand brought an emotional weight and clarity we wouldn’t have experienced otherwise,” she said. Rabbi Rachel Smookler echoed this sentiment, noting the thoughtful planning behind every visit and conversation: “The details of this trip enabled us to fully immerse ourselves in Israel’s reality, its beauty, and its pain.”

Participants also witnessed both the challenges and resilience of everyday life in Israel. Eric Laxer described scenes from Tel Aviv where people were still playing Kadima on the beaches and businesses remained open despite the hardships. “The strength of this country is in its people,” Eric shared. “Israelis are hurting, but they’re still living their lives.”

This sense of resilience extended to Israel’s children as well.

Emily Zimmern recounted a moving visit to an after-school program in Jerusalem created for children displaced from the south. With their schooling disrupted and days shortened due to teacher shortages, this program provided a space for kids to play, learn, and simply be children. “Seeing their smiles, their laughter, and their ability to find joy was incredibly uplifting,” she said.

Former Federation CEO Sue Worrel summed up the mission’s impact: “It was a profoundly transformative experience. Words can’t fully convey the gravity of what we witnessed—or the hope we carried home with us.”

The Solidarity Mission served as more than just a visit; it was a call to action for all of us back home. It reinforced the power of unity, the importance of standing with Israel, and the enduring impact of our community’s support. As we reflect on the experiences of those who participated, we are reminded of our shared strength, responsibility, and the hope that guides us forward.

## The Kulbersh Family: Strengthening Connections, Inspiring Action

When Jon and Sara Kulbersh moved to Charlotte in 2012, they were eager to plant roots and build a sense of community. For Jon, a Columbia, South Carolina native, the move felt like returning to somewhat familiar ground. For Sara, it was a leap into the unknown. “Neither of us knew anyone when we arrived,” Sara shared.

That feeling of unfamiliarity didn’t last long. From the beginning, the Kulbersh family took an active role in finding connection and belonging. They joined the Levine Jewish Community Center (LJCC), where they were directed towards events and Jewish organizations with opportunities to get involved. “I remember calling Federation just to say, ‘Hey, I’m new in town. What should I do?’” Sara reflects. That simple outreach marked the start of their deep involvement in greater Charlotte’s Jewish community.

Through their active engagement, Jon and Sara Kulbersh quickly found themselves at the center of the community. They started by attending events, volunteering, and joining committees, where they made lifelong friends. For

the Kulbershes, creating meaningful relationships was a natural extension of their commitment to Jewish values.

Jon joined Federation’s Bernstein Leadership Group (BLG) class in 2014, right after their first son was born. “Join the Bernstein Leadership Group,” he says, “it’s a great way to learn about the community and figure out your passions.” Both Jon and Sara have since embraced numerous leadership roles within the Jewish community, demonstrating a commitment that has become a hallmark of their involvement. In addition to participating in BLG, Jon has served on the LJCC Board, while Sara has taken on multiple leadership positions. Her contributions include chairing the 2022 Annual Campaign, serving as chair of Women’s Philanthropy’s Lion of Judah Society, co-chairing Federation’s allocations committee. Currently, Sara serves as a board member for Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte and will lead Major Gifts for the upcoming 2025 Annual Campaign. Jon and Sara also co-chaired the Super Event together in 2024.

“I think our travels, our missions with Federation, have been the most impactful,” Sara reflected. “You see our work all over the world—we’re helping Jews everywhere.” The Kulbershes have been to Portugal, Argentina, and will be co-chairing a Federation mission trip to Mexico City in March 2025. Visits to places like Moishe House in Buenos Aires and other international agencies showcase the interconnectedness of Jewish life across the world. Seeing the tangible results of their contributions reinforced the Kulbersh family’s belief in the importance of giving back. “We believed in it,” says Sara, “we still do.”

Whether in social gatherings or leadership roles, the Kulbershes cultivate a welcoming environment that encouraged others to join. After establishing themselves in our Jewish community, they reached out to their friends to get them involved, inviting them to join in community events and grow in their own Jewish identities. **“We’ve had an influential role in some of our Jewish friends’ lives to help them become more involved in Federation. I’m proud of us for that.”** shares Sara.

Over the years, Jon and Sara have witnessed tremendous growth within Charlotte’s Jewish community. New organizations, expanded programs, and a larger, more vibrant population have created opportunities to engage in ways that didn’t exist when they first arrived.

The Kulbershes are proud of how the community has evolved but remain focused on the work that still lies ahead. They see themselves as part of a larger effort to foster a strong, inclusive, and thriving Jewish community. Their hope is that others will follow their example and take an active role in shaping Charlotte’s Jewish future.

The Kulbershes’ advice to those looking to get involved is simple: take the first step. Whether it’s through volunteering, attending events, or finding ways to give back, every action contributes to the greater good. “Getting involved will only enhance your life and your family’s.” says Jon. “You get back more than you put in. There are so many opportunities to create friendships and help your neighbors.”

Through their leadership, vision, and unwavering dedication, Jon and Sara Kulbersh have not only strengthened their own lives but also inspired others to do the same for themselves and for future generations. Their journey is a testament to the power of community and the lasting impact of individuals who choose to lead by example. “As Jews, we have a responsibility to take care of our community.” says Sara. “I want to set an example for my kids. If you want to raise a Jewish family, you have to set the example of being involved. ‘L’dor v’dor.’”

## Strengthening the Greater Charlotte Community: The Impact of Jewish Community Relations Council

Since its reintroduction in 2023, the Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC) has become a powerful advocate for unity, education, and equity in the greater Charlotte area. As the public affairs arm of Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte (JFGC), the JCRC works to foster community-wide dialogue, speak up for our collective needs, and promote shared values that strengthen our society. Through advocacy, education, and coalition-building, the JCRC has made a significant impact by combating antisemitism, fostering inclusivity, and strengthening community connections. With Chair Steve Menaker and JFGC's Director of Jewish Community Relations Douglas Greene at the helm, the JCRC continues to grow, benefiting not only the Jewish community but the larger community as well.

## Growing and Strengthening Partnerships in the Community

To further its mission, the JCRC has significantly expanded its reach by introducing various new strategic committees. Under the leadership of Chair Steve Menaker, the council now includes specialized groups focusing on Education, Government and Politics, Interfaith and Intergroup Relations, Media and Communications, and Business and Corporate Relations. This structure promotes a comprehensive approach by enabling the JCRC to foster new and existing partnerships with schools, religious organizations, businesses, and civic groups. Guided by Jewish Community Relations Director Douglas Greene, these partnerships aim to further strengthen connections and collaboration across greater Charlotte.

"In 2024, the JCRC has significantly expanded its efforts to address the rising challenges facing the Jewish community." Says Douglas Greene, "From combating antisemitism in schools and on college campuses to fostering meaningful interfaith and intergroup relationships, our work has never been more urgent. This year, we've deepened our partnerships, broadened our reach, and strengthened our advocacy to ensure that our community remains resilient, supported, and empowered to face the future."

## Legislative Successes Benefiting All of North Carolina

In 2024, a key accomplishment for the JCRC was the passage of the Shalom Act in North Carolina. This legislation codifies the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) definition of antisemitism into state law, providing government institutions and public schools with a clear framework to identify and address antisemitism. The Shalom Act marks a significant step forward in creating a safer and more inclusive state, serving as a model for combating discrimination and fostering tolerance. The JCRC collaborated with organizations such as Jewish Federation of Greater Raleigh, Greensboro Jewish Federation, Jewish For Good, and Hadassah, to advocate for the passage of this act, showcasing the power of the collective in driving statewide change.

On a national level, the JCRC has been involved in advocating for the federal Antisemitism Awareness Act, which seeks to bring a similar understanding of antisemitism to all U.S. institutions. As this legislation progresses in the Senate, the JCRC's efforts amplify the call for nationwide protection that benefits diverse communities, reinforcing the importance of addressing prejudice and supporting Jewish voices.

## Fostering Community Awareness and Engagement with the JCRC Action Dispatch

This year, the JCRC launched the JCRC Action Dispatch, a newsletter designed to keep the greater Charlotte community informed about critical issues and provide opportunities for meaningful action. Covering topics like antisemitism in schools, the ongoing crisis in Israel, and local advocacy efforts, the Action Dispatch delivers insights and practical tools to help community members stay connected when opportunities for engagement arise. With its focus on actionable steps, the newsletter serves as a vital resource, not only keeping residents informed but also empowering them to drive positive change.

## LOOKING AHEAD:

### Building a More Inclusive 2025

Looking toward 2025, the JCRC is committed to promoting understanding and inclusivity within Charlotte and beyond. Planned initiatives include an interfaith seder, programs for Jewish American Heritage Month, and speaker events that celebrate diversity and shared values. By bringing people of all backgrounds together, the JCRC continues to lead efforts that enrich the larger community, creating a culture of respect, unity, and shared responsibility.

Federation's JCRC stands as a testament to the commitment and resilience of the greater Charlotte community, advocating for values that uplift us all. Through its impactful work, the JCRC is helping to shape a more inclusive and compassionate future for everyone in Charlotte.
