group BBYO and the Jewish Federation in the Heart of New Jersey are the lead sponsors of Monmouth and Middlesex counties' 2018 JSERVE, hosted by the Middlesex County Fire Academy in Sayreville and supported by additional Jewish youth groups, including NCSY, NFTY, USY and CTeen, as well as the global, nonsectarian Good Deeds Day. This year's JSERVE planning was led by a teen advisory committee. Participants will engage in hands-on projects such as helping at a local food pantry, starting a garden for preschool children, making teddy bears with children with special needs decorating mezuzahs and candle sticks for Houston families who lost their homes in Hurricane Harvey, making video greetings for lone IDF soldiers in Israel, visiting with Holocaust survivors to hear their stories then make commemorative gift for the survivors, learning how to advocate for Israel, learning basic emergency response with Hatzalah EMS and socializing with seniors at an assisted living home.
