Cleveland's Jewish community by the numbers:

- 38,000 Jewish households
- 80,000 Jewish people
- 23% children (under 18)
- 58% adults (age 18 to 64)
- 19% seniors (age 65+)




Economic Vulnerability in Our Community Surprising findings from the 2011 Population study.






Economic Vulnerability in Our Community Surprising findings from the 2011 Population study.



How does our community compare?



- The generally accepted definition of Poverty is household income within 200% FPIG
 - 2019 level for a family of 2 = \$29K annually
- 12% of families reported incomes below 150% FPIG
- 7% reported household income between 150 - 200% FPIG

- Better access to affordable or free kosher food and basic necessities
- Sustainable jobs
- Affordable housing in Jewish neighborhoods








The Cleveland Chesed Center and Gesher Cleveland are conceived

- Cleveland Chesed Center: Putting food (and much more) into the hands of our Jewish neighbors
 - Providing free access to kosher food and household necessities, while ensuring dignity remains intact
 - 9,000 square feet of space
 - Over 4,500 cubic feet of cold storage
- Gesher Cleveland: Empowering families and individuals to gain financial stability and security.
 - Navigating social service benefits programs
 - Career development and job placement services
 - Healthcare and senior assistance


Putting food (and much more) into the hands of our Jewish neighbors


- Monthly shopping for food, personal care and household necessities worth hundreds of dollars
- Weekly shopping for produce and other staples
- New and gently used clothing and shoes for the whole family
- Cross referrals to other organizations (see collaborations)
- Extra support at financial crunch times, such as the Jewish holiday seasons, winter, and the start of the school year
- Financial literacy education to further stabilize their financial solvency



Additional programs

- Secondhand clothing: over 40,000 pounds of used clothing processed yearly
- Holiday clothing: 800-1200 items sold at significantly subsidized prices each year
- Passover distribution:
 - Over 350 packages in 2019
 - 900 chickens
 - Over 2000 lb. meat
 - 500 packages frozen vegetables
 - 100+ cases grape juice



Our model

- We are currently serving approximately 220 families each month
- 95% of families are served during our open hours
- Private appointments are available throughout the week for the 5% of clients who request them




