



STRENGTHENING OUR

COMMUNITY

ONGOING SUPPORT FOR EATON FIRE VICTIMS

Shortly after the Eaton Fire broke out and we witnessed the devas-

tating destruction it caused, our Jewish Federation began developing a plan to support those in our community who were most affected. This included heartfelt conversations with several families who lost their homes. During one of these conversations, a community member shared that, as they were evacuating, they considered removing their mezuzah, but decided not to.



That moment sparked a meaningful idea. Our Jewish Federation committed to gifting a specially commissioned mezuzah to Jewish households in our

community that lost their home in the Eaton Fire. We reached out to a wood artisan, who partnered with a metal artist to craft a beautiful and unique design. We also contacted MyZuzah, an organization founded in 2018, whose mission is to place a kosher mezuzah on the front door of every Jewish home. Thanks to their generosity, each of the mezuzot we are gifting will include a kosher scroll.



In the coming weeks, our Jewish Federation staff, board members, and volunteers will begin delivering more than 100 mezuzot to affected households. This initiative was made possible through the generosity of those who donated to our Eaton Fire Relief Fund.

As families rebuild, we hope these mezuzot will bring comfort, blessing, and renewed strength to each home.

In addition to this, we offered full scholarships to Camp Gan Shalom not only to families who lost their homes in the fire, but also to those displaced by the Eaton Fire. Thanks to generous donations to our Eaton Fire Relief Fund and a grant from Mt. Sinai Memorial Park and Mortuaries, children were able to enjoy a summer surrounded by friendship, laughter, and the warmth of our Jewish community

MARCH:

30th ANNUAL MEETING

continued as over 130 volunteers (aged 9-96) read aloud thousands of names of Holocaust victims for 24 hours. There was also an art project coordinated by the Armory for the Arts. This year's exhibition was presented in partnership with Anne Frank LA.

PJ LIBRARY'S OUTREACH TO FAMILIES AFFECTED BY THE EATON FIRE

In the Jewish Federation's ongoing efforts to support fire-affected families, our PJ Library staff has made significant efforts to stay connected and assist its PJ Library families. YOM HASHOAH STAGED READING

For the last several years, our Jewish Federation's JFed Players have staged Holocaust play readings as part of the National Jewish Theater Foundation (NJTF) - Holocaust Theater International Initiative (HTII) Remembrance Play Readings. This year's play, Exodus: The Shanghai Jews, commissioned by



L.A. Theater Works, uses survivors' own words to tell their stories of how they escaped Nazi persecution and made their way to freedom in Shanghai. We are proud to have brought this play to our community in commemoration of Yom Hashoah.

JFED PLAYERS: LIVE RADIO SHOWS

For several years, our JFed Players have wanted to host a live radio show, and this year proved to be the opportune time. In May, our JFed Players performed two radio versions of Arsenic and Old



Lace and Starstruck, directed by Lew Snow. Temple Beth David's pulpit was transformed into our radio stage. Each performance included outstanding Foley (live sound effects) and recorded sound (plus an in-house piano player), and refreshments provided by craft services. As people left the live event, they commented on how much they enjoyed the performance.



JEWISH COOKING CONNECTION

After a short hiatus, our Jewish Cooking Connection resumed, featuring three new recipes, including two direct from Israel that are not well-known to American Jews – Kichery (a dish made as families get their homes ready for Shabbat) and Muffuletta (a special crepe dish made with lots of flour, honey and butter and prepared as Passover ends so



people can have a bite or two of something not "Kosher for Passover." Our last video featured a recipe from Barbara Schwartz – her parve Wacky (chocolate) cake, prepared in a single cake pan with just a fork.

SHIR DELIGHTS

Kol HaEmek (KHE) had a few new additions to the choir this year and worked diligently to prepare some new songs, as well as brought back several of audience-favorite songs that had not been performed for many years. REPLACING JUDAICA EVENT
