

# Calendar of Jewish Holidays

Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, and Passover are the most-observed holy days of the Jewish year. Jewish students will attend prayer services and convene with family and, therefore, might miss school and extracurricular activities. For Passover, the first two nights are the most observed. Rosh Hashanah	Wed night, Oct 2 - Fri, Oct 4, 2024
Yom Kippur	Fri night, Oct 11 - Sat, Oct 12, 2024
Sukkot	Wed night, Oct 16 - Wed, Oct 23, 2024
Shemini Atzeret / Simchat Torah	Wed, Oct 23 - Fri, Oct 25, 2024
Hanukkah	Wed night, Dec 25, 2024 - Thu, Jan 2, 2025
Purim	Thu night, March 13 - Fri, March 14, 2025
Passover	Sat night, April 12 - Sun, April 20, 2025
Shavuot	Sun night, June 1 - Tue, June 3, 2025

## Academic Year 2025 - 2026

Shabbat	Weekly Sabbath from Friday sunset to Saturday night
Rosh Hashanah	Mon night, Sept 22 - Wed, Sept 24, 2025
Yom Kippur	Wed night, Oct 1 - Thu, Oct 2, 2025
Sukkot	Mon night, Oct 6 - Mon, Oct 13, 2025
Shemini Atzeret / Simchat Torah	Mon, Oct 13 - Wed, Oct 15, 2025
Hanukkah	Sun night, Dec 14, 2024 - Mon, Dec 22, 2025
Purim	Mon night, March 2 - Tue, March 3, 2026
Passover	Wed night, April 1 - Thu, April 9, 2026
Shavuot	Thu night, May 21 - Sat, May 23, 2026

The Jewish day begins and ends at sundown. Thus, all holidays begin at sundown on the first day and end at nightfall on the last day shown in the calendar above.
