Message From the President

Winter.... I love sunshine on the snow, pretty soft snowfalls, and even shoveling if it isn't too cold. Snow forts, snowball fights and sledding are all great memories. Trudging through the drifts to school, not so much. As I have aged (I prefer matured), I am finding that the lack of sunshine, dampness and cold temperatures affect me physically and mentally much more. It is a reminder that many are in need of social services, especially in the winter.

The Springfield Jewish Federation is ready to help those in need of social services any time during the year. Over the past year, there were 16 contacts requesting social service assistance. This was 100% increase over the previous year. Yes, this could be a statistical blip, however, it might also reflect the aging of our community. Assistance through referrals is available for physical and mental health issues, living adversities including but not limited to shelter, utilities, and food, and legal issues. Support is available to locate care giving services and other similar needs. We have a licensed social worker on staff to provide crisis intervention and assessment services. In certain situations, the Federation can provide financial support through reimbursement to service providers. All contacts with the Federation are confidential.



More than a place to get a meal, the Jewish Deli is community forged in food. "I'll Have What She's Having: The Jewish Deli," explores how Jewish immigrants, most from Central and Eastern Europe, imported and adapted traditions to create a uniquely American restaurant. Organized by the Skirball Center, this traveling exhibition reveals how Jewish delicatessens became a cornerstone of American food culture.

Lincoln Land Community College and the Jewish Federation of Springfield, IL are partnering for a one-day trip to the Illinois Holocaust Museum in Skokie, Illinois to tour this traveling exhibit. Rabbi Barry Marks, a true food "maven," will be joining us on the bus to provide background on the Jewish Deli in America. Kaufman's Delicatessen & Bakery in Skokie will provide us with a traditional deli lunch at the museum.

The Illinois Holocaust Museum and Education Center opened in 2009 and is the second largest Holocaust museum in the United States. The museum not only honors the memory of the millions who were murdered during the Holocaust but salutes the courage and resilience of survivors.

FBI SPRINGFIELD HONORS THE JEWISH FEDERATION OF SPRINGFIELD, IL, WITH NATIONAL AWARD

[Springfield] – David Nanz, Special Agent in Charge of the FBI Springfield Field Office announces the Jewish Federation of Springfield, IL, as the recipient of the 2023 FBI Director's Community Leadership Award (DCLA).

The FBI established the DCLA in 1990 to publicly acknowledge the achievements of those working to make a difference in their communities through the promotion of education and the prevention of crime and violence. Each year, one person or organization from each of the FBI's 56 field offices is chosen to receive this prestigious award.

The organization has partnered with many community groups on projects to help unite the Springfield community, strengthen relationships, and provide a deeper understanding of tolerance and acceptance.

For me, an integral part of Federation's mission is connecting; connecting within our Jewish community and connecting with the larger community that surrounds us. Our Federation programs, first and foremost, are designed to bring us together and are based, hopefully, on your varied interests. Wine lovers connect at the winetasting, film lovers connect at the film series, preschoolers and their families connect at PJ Play Date. Knosh & Knowledge connects the curious and active with some of Springfield's own resources.

We are grateful to all of you who shared your connections and opened doors for us in the greater Springfield community. Connecting and creating partnerships with organizations outside the Jewish community is a critical component of Federation and the hallmark of our Jewish Community Relations Council. It is the keystone for building understanding. While we have forged partnerships over the years, there were decades when this was very rare for Jewish organizations and individuals. It is an honor to work with organizations outside the Jewish community whether we ask or are asked and to be invited to present to these groups.

In recent years, our community has helped those who are food insecure through JCRC's long standing relationship with Central Illinois Food Bank. What started as a one-time a year healthy food distribution has evolved into several and into a partnership with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Central Illinois as well. Through the Rosenwald Initiative, convened by Federation, co-sponsors of the first screening of Rosenwald movie then showing on the iconic protest song "Strange Fruit" included Central Illinois and Springfield African American History Museum, Frontiers International, Ministerial Alliance, NAACP, Union Baptist Church, Velma L. Carey Foundation. It opened the door for a continuing relationship with the Lincoln Home National Historic Site and with the Lincoln Foundation that continues. The NAACP reached out to us to co-host the community meeting after the incident with the former police officer who posted antisemitic remarks online. We partnered with the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum (ALPLM) for the opening of their "Stories of Survival" exhibit, for the Federation's Holocaust Memorial Commemoration and in years before to bring in Jonathan Sarna to talk about his book "Lincoln and the Jews." When we hosted our Partnership2Gether's

Women Leading a Dialogue, we partnered again with the ALPLM for a program in partnership with the Greater Springfield Islamic Society. We worked with the National Historic Park, Lincoln Land Community College and the Chancellor's office at University of Illinois at Springfield, all of whom hosted programs with our visitors. We partnered with Great Rivers Presbytery to sponsor noted New Testament scholar Amy Jill Levine.

The recent Violins of Hope programs which Federation sponsored this past September provided an amazing opportunity to the entire Springfield community to hear stories of resilience during the tragic years in the 1930's and 1940's and to enjoy beautifully played music. Our partners making it possible included Illinois State Museum for displaying the violins and auditorium for the first performance, Hoogland Center for the Arts, Ilinois Symphony Orchestra, Lincoln Land Community College, and University of Illinois at Springfield School of Music and Performing Arts Center, Lincoln Land Community College, Bank of Springfield, and Capitol Blueprint. The JCRC program, "Lighting the Path" was created to serve as a vehicle for us to reach out to schools, places of worship, civic clubs, and organizations to share knowledge of our Jewish community, faith and culture. I apologize for what I likely have left out, but I would be totally remiss if I failed to mention how important and invaluable our partnerships and connections are within our own Jewish community for joint programming and serving as a venue for Federation and JCRC events. I am grateful to all.
