

Wings of hope אפקט התקווה

The butterfly effect by Edward Norton Lorenz was originally explained metaphorically, suggesting that a flap of a butterfly's wing in one corner of the world could cause a tornado elsewhere weeks later. Popular culture has largely embraced the butterfly effect metaphor to describe that while it may sometimes seem that our individual decisions and actions have little to no impact on the big picture, our collective action and interconnectedness can cause our small actions to have larger, collective outcomes.

On Israel's 77th birthday, you can help spread the message of individual and collective Jewish hope for Israel by wearing a "Wings of Hope" butterfly pin made available to us through the Jewish Agency for Israel.


