We are so grateful that our community has rallied around the idea of growth and change – two concepts that can cause stress and anxiety – or excitement and energy – and usually all of the above. At JCS of Hawaii we are getting calls and emails almost daily about activities for the calendar on our website, about new partnership ideas, about new community groups that want to collaborate with us, and about grant opportunities to grow our services. People contact us as soon as they move here and ask, "where the Jews are and what are they doing?" We are busy and it's a great problem to have.



In 2022, we served more people than ever before and grew our staff to reflect the needs of our Jewish community across the state. We heard loud and clear

that people want to know and feel more connected to each other. In fact, this is nothing new! Since the beginning of time, humans have lived in community and thrive in community. JCS is at a point in our evolution that we are now poised to try to meet more of that need. We also know that we are an important part of the safety net which is made up of all of our Jewish community groups and partnerships across the islands. As we work to help connect the community, we will never forget our roots in human services.

JCS is here to help the Jewish community of Hawaii feel safe, healthy, and connected.

This year we are partnering with the University of Hawaii Thompson School of Social Work and Public Health to add a case management intern to provide support to even more people. And hopefully, in the near future, we will have more Masters-level mental health support through this collaboration as well.

This year we are offering support groups (visit our website), more individual assessments, and hopefully will continue the fun exercise class that focuses on balance, cardiac health and muscle strengthening.




And this year we plan to increase our collaborative efforts with all of the islands. We brought on Board Members from Maui, Kauai and Hawaii Island – to reflect this commitment.


2023 will be an exciting year of growth for JCS, and we hope for you too.







"I don't play the Bingo. No one cares either way. I just love the exercise!" Anonymous


