We helped 5 low-income seniors get on the waitlist for a newly refurbished and truly affordable subsidized senior apartment building on Oahu.

We prevented a man from losing his housing again when his housing grant was suddenly dropped. We helped him stay in the same apartment building where he has lived for 8 yrs by quickly moving him from an unaffordable one-bedroom to a studio apartment that he was able to afford.

When our volunteer Carol was doing a home visit to a disabled kupuna she notified us that the client was suddenly dropped from Medicaid <u>and</u> lost her Meals on Wheels. We got her meal assistance back and are working on the Medicaid challenge.


NJHSA Lay Leadership Award

Malama Village – Innovation at JCSH

Malama Village, a partner program of JCSH, has launched and is for all Oahu residents 55 and older who want connection, support and new experiences as they age. It's a village without walls and the first in Hawaii (although the newly forming village on Kauai is a close second!).

There are many benefits of Village membership:

- 1. **A sense of belonging** through fun gatherings, activities, and outings.
- 2. Access to the **Volunteer Give and Get Bank** ask for what you need help with, and volunteer for how you can help others. Need a ride to the MD? Help with your phone? Can you give someone a ride? Call someone who is sick, or lonely?
- 3. **Quick connection to JCSH for resources**, transportation, help with benefits, home help, support, and more.
- 4. Hanai **family who notices** how you are doing and reaches out when you may need support or resources.

The Malama Village director, Skye Morrison, LSW, is a trained social work professional and specializes in helping us age with health, passion and grace. She works tirelessly building Malama Village based on the national model, rooting it in our Hawaii culture and values.
