I see so much strength in our community and know that our Jewish Federation and family of agencies are destined for even greater things as we embark on the next 100 years. Today, we are

building the foundations of a sustainable future through new and innovative revenue streams and creating the infrastructure to be agile and responsive to the needs of our community. As we look to the future, we do so with abundance in our hearts and our minds. In doing this, we can remain true to our mission to care for those in need, enhance Jewish life, and ensure the continuity of a vibrant Jewish community here in South Jersey, in Israel, and around the world.

A Message From President Harry A. Platt

For the past 100 years, the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey has been a central and constant institution in our community. The Federation was formed in 1922 by a group of 29 local leaders who saw the need to assist less fortunate people. That was the start of what is now a multi-faceted organization that serves thousands of people worldwide each year. In the past decade alone, our programs have expanded. We have become advocates and service providers for so many more people than the Federation founders could have dreamed of.

We learn from our past. Looking back at the history of our community, we think of the thousands of volunteers who created the Federation and worked so hard to reach people in need. Past leadership had the vision to establish a Jewish Community Center, now the Katz JCC, to provide a focal point for our Jewish families. Our founders began advocacy for the State of Israel as soon as the state was established. They created The Jewish Community Voice newspaper to inform everyone of what was happening in the region, and began

Jewish Family Service, now Samost Jewish Family & Children's Service, to better serve the needs of our growing Jewish families that were establishing South Jersey as their home.

We celebrate our present. For my entire life, I remember my parents and my friends' parents adapting to the changing needs of our community. They created the Jewish Community Relations Council, relocated Jews from the Former Soviet Union to Southern New Jersey, and began to focus attention on our special needs community.

We quickly mobilized to raise money to help Jews worldwide whenever the need arose. The Federation has sponsored emergency campaigns to help in places like Israel, Ethiopia, and most recently, Ukraine. I couldn't have been prouder of our community than I was when we delivered 1,000 pounds of medical supplies to the Ukraine-Poland border and raised hundreds of thousands of dollars to aid the refugees from Ukraine. Our Federation brought the largest number of supplies to the Ukraine-Poland border on our mission. Our entire region knows how to act quickly and more importantly, gives from the heart.

Our staff of professionals has grown and are recognized as leaders in the Jewish communal field across the country. They continue to grow our Federation through projects like Weinberg Commons, our Regional Security Department, Aleph Home Care, and recent personnel changes to the Jewish Community Foundation, Inc. Supporting our incredible professionals are boards of lay leaders and countless volunteers who know that a successful community is one that works hard to give back in any way possible. Thank you all for your hard work to support and sustain this wonderful community.

We look to our future. As professionals, lay leaders, and volunteers, we hope to inspire our children and grandchildren to expand on the building blocks that have been established in the past and have been strengthened throughout our 100 years of existence!

L'dor V'dor. We have learned from our past 100 years, celebrate our present, and look to our future to ensure the continuation of a strong and vibrant Jewish community locally and around the world. My family and I are grateful to be a part of our Federation system. We look forward to the next generation living in a thriving Jewish world that we are all helping to create.

Jewish Community Relations Council

The biggest advances for the Jewish Community Relations Council of Southern NJ in our 80 plus year relationship with the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey has been our growing visibility and maturity. The responsibilities and programs of the JCRC continue to increase and include an agenda of vital community issues, including advocacy for Israel, incidents of antisemitism, and the security of our community. We have focused on the separation of church/state as it affects Jews in South Jersey, Holocaust commemoration and education, and Jewish outreach to other races and faiths in the community, among other issues.

Education, support, and advocacy for Israel, has remained a top primary concern for the JCRC throughout Israel's seven decades. The JCRC was the local organizer for the massive march of hundreds of thousands on Washington for Freedom for Soviet Jews in the 1970's. South Jersey had more participants than nearly any other community in the country. The JCRC also brought a delegation of Federation and JCRC leaders, together with then Congressman James Florio, to the Soviet Union to meet and support Jewish Refuseniks. In the 1980s-90s, as the annual community Holocaust Observance of

the JCRC became a major community event, it became apparent that more resources needed to be allocated to Holocaust Education. The JCRC created the Holocaust Education Center, and its subsequent Museum in the Federation building. Our nationally recognized center works closely with the NJ Commission on Holocaust Education in getting more and more school systems to initiate education on the Holocaust and training teachers how to teach it more effectively. Thanks to a dedicated cadre of volunteers and donors, Holocaust education throughout South Jersey has grown exponentially. More than 30,000 students and adults are annually educated in the museum, by its speakers and programs in schools throughout the region, both in person and virtually.



JCRC's Esther Raab Holocaust Museum and Goodwin Education Center provides docent-led tours to school students, teachers, and community members about the lessons and history of the Holocaust.

The JCRC made major advances in interfaith relations with our literacy program BookMates with JCRC and interfaith leaders of the Diocese of Camden working together to create this impactful program. The JCRC and the Interfaith department of the Camden Diocese created the Catholic-Jewish Commission (CJC) to bring the two faith communities closer together with many classes and discussions. This relationship was the impetus to create the Jewish Catholic Muslim Dialogue (JCM) which still continues to this day as its own entity.

There were innumerable programs and resources that the Federation supported to ensure the JCRC has become and continues to be an advocate for our community. Our Federation's voice, at the State, national, and international community, has bolstered our JCRC's prominence and reputation as a leader in the community relations field. The JCRC looks forward to the future with our Jewish Federation of Southern NJ as we continue to build relationships, make an impact with elected officials, keep our community safe and welcoming to all, and continue to combat antisemitism and all forms of hate.

JCV: Telling The Federation Story For 81 Years

On September 19, 1941, the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey published the very first issue of The Jewish Community Voice. It was then called “The Voice of the Camden County Jewish Community.” When Federation started the Voice, the Jewish world was very different than today. The Holocaust was engulfing the Jews of Europe. The State of Israel had yet to be reborn. The American Jewish community was predominantly one of immigrants. In Southern New Jersey, the Jewish community lived in a few areas, particularly Camden.

Today, much has changed. The Jewish community here in Southern New Jersey has grown and prospered. There are many synagogues, day schools, and Jewish institutions to be proud of. Israel is one of the most advanced countries in the world. After wars for its very existence, it has peace treaties with a number of its neighbors as well as with several other Arab countries in the region. The American Jewish community, although facing growing anti-Semitism, is still one of the world’s most secure and prosperous Jewish communities.

The Voice, thanks to the support of the Jewish Federation, has reported

on all of these local, national, and international developments. We have informed and educated the community about the activities of the Jewish Federation and its family of agencies, of which we are a part.

“Our paper, The Voice, literally speaks to and for the Jewish community in South Jersey, but our beating heart and backbone is our parent, Jewish Federation,” said Jodi Berman, president of the Voice Management Board. “Without the leadership and support of Federation, The Voice and other agencies just would not be.”

Berman added that the Federation’s dedication to and love for the Jewish community at home and around the world ensure that the Jewish community is prosperous, safe, and thriving. “Federation leadership under President Harry Platt and CEO Jennifer Dubrow Weiss, the Federation Board, staff, and management team understand the importance of keeping our Jewish values and identity at the forefront of our lives. By maintaining this focus, Federation’s energy is transferred to the Jewish people of South Jersey. The Voice is here to transmit the message.”

The Federation’s support has enabled The Voice to expand from that four-page paper in 1941 to a vibrant publication with a website (jewishvoicesnj.org) and social media presence. As a Federation agency, the Voice not only includes the paper,


but also Voice at the Shore, done in partnership with the Jewish Federation of Atlantic & Cape May Counties, Attitudes, our lifestyle magazine, and Connect, our annual community guide.

The Voice would not be here without the loyal support of our readers, our advertisers, the Voice Board and staff, and our publisher, the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey. The Federation has played a key role in building this community and in supporting Jews around the world.

May the Federation continue to go from strength to strength.

Samost Jewish Family & Children's Service

Samost Jewish Family & Children's Service (JFCS) has a long and rich tradition of serving our South Jersey community. For more than 75 years, the JFCS story has been one of change and flexibility, reflecting a singular goal: to bring help and hope to our neighbors in need. We are proud of our past, optimistic about our future, and deeply committed to meeting the needs of our community as they arise.

JFCS has evolved into an agency that looks quite different from its early days. Our roots began during World War I, when the Camden section of the National Council of Jewish Women met the "welfare and relief" needs of Jewish "indigents" living in Camden County. The Great Depression in the early 1930's gave rise to the Hebrew Ladies Charity. The Hebrew Welfare Society conducted similar work until the early 1940's. In the mid-1940's, the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey employed its first professionally trained social worker—marking the beginning of what would become today's Counseling Department. In December 1949, our name was changed to Jewish Family Service to better reflect our vision and the nature of our work. Jewish Family Service then became an official department of Federation. In October 1993, we changed our name to Jewish

Family and Children's Service—as it remains today.

JFCS has always worked to identify and address the most pressing issues in our community. Whether it is meeting the critical needs of our local Holocaust Survivors (along with their children and grandchildren), working to overcome the increased rates of anxiety, suicide, and addiction among our youth, or providing a welcoming and affirming space for our LGBTQ+ friends, JFCS is there. Through the countless challenges of COVID-19, our agency continued to grow and embrace the hundreds of new families who came to us when they had nowhere else to turn in the face of unprecedented economic challenges. Today, we support more than 14,000 individuals living in Camden, Burlington, and Gloucester counties, as well as Holocaust Survivors living in Cumberland County. We accomplish our life-sustaining work through five departments: Counseling, Disability

Services, Family Assistance (including food pantries and domestic violence support), 60+ Services, and Volunteers.


offer seniors the very best in healthcare and socialization services.

Jewish Community Foundation, Inc.

When a generous donor creates a legacy gift in any amount to benefit a nonprofit of their choice, they want to ensure the future through an endowment fund. Legacy gifts last for many generations, and the Jewish Community Foundation, Inc. (JCF) is the South Jersey Jewish community's source for ensuring that happens.

Originally founded over 40 years ago in Cherry Hill as the Bequest & Endowment Society, the JCF served as a department of the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey. With growing interest in endowment funds and planned giving in the community, this department worked with donors to create endowments to benefit the Federation and its family of agencies, as well as the broader Jewish and secular community over time. Each endowment fund provides vital annual income for the beneficiary organization, in perpetuity.

In the 1990s, the department's name changed to the Jewish Community Foundation, and in the early 2000s, the Federation spun-off the JCF to become a separately-incorporated 501(c)(3), a supporting organization of the Federation. In addition to managing endowment funds, the JCF also administers donor advised funds (DAFs), which are akin to charitable

checking accounts. DAFs allow donors to donate money into their funds, earn immediate tax benefits, and then recommend grants to any qualified charitable organizations at any time.

Today, the JCF holds a total of approximately \$40 million in endowment funds and donor advised funds, making us the largest community foundation in South Jersey, and, effective in April of this year, the JCF is even more closely connected with the Federation as a result of new personnel alignments.

Furthermore, between grant distributions from DAFs and endowment funds, the JCF provides close to \$2M each year to the Federation system, and nearly \$3M each year to the South Jersey Jewish community as a whole.

The JCF also provides over \$60,000 in JCF Grants annually to enable local nonprofits to launch new and innovative programs and services, and we distribute over \$30,000 each year to benefit local scholars pursuing post-high school education, thanks to donors who established endowed funds for these purposes.

Lastly, since 2014, the JCF has served as the SNJ liaison to the LIFE & LEGACY® initiative of the Harold Grinspoon Foundation (HGF), which was launched to enhance legacy giving in Jewish communities across

the country. Reflecting the strength and dedication of so many generous and forward-thinking community members, South Jersey ranks among the most successful out of all the 70+ participating communities in terms of legacy commitments received, with nearly 900 on file through 2022. Though the initial LIFE & LEGACY program ended for our community in 2018, the JCF looks forward to launching the new LIFE & LEGACY PLUS with HGF in fall 2022 to further build legacy giving locally.

Today, with more funds under JCF's management now than ever before and with broad support by donors to leave legacy gifts and create more endowments in coming years, the SNJ Jewish community stands to remain strong and vibrant for many future generations.

The Story Of Saltzman

It's only through generous donations and funding that the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey and its family of agencies can fulfill its important mission and make a meaningful impact both in the South Jersey community and around the world.

Perhaps one of the most substantial and inspiring examples of such needed generosity is The Raymond & Gertrude R. Saltzman Foundation. Established in 1978 by Gertrude R. (Ruth) Saltzman—who was fiercely passionate about strengthening the Jewish community—the special endowment fund, or Foundation, operates as a supporting organization of the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey and its family of agencies.

Each year, the Foundation makes grants to fund new and innovative programs, or to expand existing programs, in accordance with Ruth's wishes.

In fact, the Foundation provided \$2.5 million to jumpstart the construction of the beloved Katz Jewish Community Center (JCC) in Cherry Hill and \$8.5 million to support the development of Lions Gate, a Continuing Care Retirement Community (CCRC) in Voorhees rooted in Jewish values, culture, and tradition. To date, the Foundation has

made approximately 150 grants, awarding over \$90 million throughout its 44-year history. Many of these grants have run for more than 20 years, spanning educational and cultural programs, support for Holocaust survivors, meals for hungry seniors, critically needed support for those with special needs, and more.

Examples of grants awarded by the Foundation to support Jewish seniors and Jewish children who live in Burlington, Camden, and Gloucester Counties include the following and beyond:

- ACHaD (Achieving Community Hopes and Dreams): A special needs program for all ages at the Katz JCC
- Child and adolescent counseling: Samost Jewish Family & Children's Service (JFCS) provides children ages 2-18 with individual and family counseling
- JCC Camps at Medford Summer Camp scholarships
- Day school scholarship programs: Funding for local students attending local Jewish day schools
- Life Long Learning Institute: College-level courses for seniors offered at the Katz JCC
- Patient Partners: JFCS provides clients with patient advocates

In honor of the 100th anniversary and

moving forward, the Foundation's endowment fund recently increased its annual \$50,000 JFund gift to \$100,000. JFund financial support helps the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey carry out important programs and services across its five Areas of Impact: Older Adults, Special Needs, Global Connections, Community Engagement, and Family & Youth.

"The story of the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey and its 100th anniversary cannot be told without the Saltzman Foundation," said Saltzman Foundation Executive Director Vicki Zell. "Ruth was a pioneer of her time, recognizing that there were ways she could have an everlasting impact on the Jewish community to help it thrive for years to come. Ruth's legacy lives on through the Foundation and her values have been kept alive through the Saltzman Foundation. Her dream was that others would follow in her footsteps and leave their legacy gifts to sustain our community forever."



Multigenerational Families are Lifeblood of Federation's Success

The Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey (JFED) and its family of agencies wouldn't be the same--let alone mark its 100th anniversary--without the abiding support of countless volunteers and their families. Because of multigenerational service, the greater JFED community continues to flourish and lend a helping hand. As the Federation celebrates its 100th anniversary, a few of the many multigenerational families shared their thoughts on why they serve.

Harvey Shapiro, a career attorney, is one of those difference-making volunteers. A past president of The Raymond & Gertrude R. Saltzman Foundation, Jewish Community Foundation, Inc. (JCF), and the Federation, he's also a significant benefactor to several Jewish organizations over the years.

"So much in our community to be thankful for!" Shapiro said. "Weinberg Commons, Lions Gate, robust synagogues, Federation and its agencies, day schools and more. Look how far we've come in 100 years."

Harvey's wife, Gail, said she's been double blessed to serve as both a Federation employee and volunteer. In the 1980s, she served as director of volunteers for Samost Jewish Family & Children's Service (JFCS). For the JCC, she was the first curator of the Appel Art Gallery and has been involved with the JCC's Arts, Books and Culture Festival for over three decades. "I look at my children and say: 'I'dor v'dor.' Who could ask for more!"

Son Mark Shapiro has been doing his part since he was a teenager volunteering with his mother at JFCS. An attorney, he became a JFCS

Board member and later served as the agency's president. For 25 years, he served on Federation's Board and just completed a term on the Jewish Community Foundation, Inc. (JCF) Board. "It's in my blood," he said. "We all are better with a strong community." Mark's wife, Alison, also served as Vice President of JCRC.

In the early 1980s, Judie Morrow became chair of the Young Leadership Council (now Young Adult Division, YAD) and served on JFED's Board. Former president of the Women's Campaign, she loves learning about the Jewish community and having an outlet to be creative. Currently, she serves on the Jewish Community Voice (JCV) Board, of which she is a past president. With husband Harry Morrow, she co-chaired Super Sunday three times.

"I got involved to show my kids that they have a responsibility in the Jewish community," she said. "How lucky I was to participate in something bigger than me with people who I have such admiration for."

As board member of the Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC), JCV, and YLC, Harry Morrow has been volunteering his time for 40 years. "Volunteering sets a great example for your children, gives you a sense of purpose, allows you to meet like-minded people, and can be good for your career and business," he said.

Iris Snyder, daughter of the Morrows, told her mother upon leaving for college that she wanted to do what she did, only get paid for it. This led

to a college internship with JFED to better understand what it means to be a Jewish communal professional. During the past 12 years, she's worked for JFED in various roles: Marketing assistant, YLC director, women's philanthropy director, and now in her current post of project manager. "I've just always felt a love for the Jewish community. I feel strongly about preserving a sense of community and strengthening it."

Carrying on his father's legacy, Harry Platt currently serves as president of JFED. A former chair of the Weinberg Commons Building Committee, among many other roles, Harry said that JFED has always been a constant institution in the community. "We look forward to the next generation living in a thriving Jewish world that we are all helping to create," he said.

Alison Platt-Tarnopol, daughter to Bernie and Judy, is a past president of Federation Senior Housing Associates and a past Federation Board member. From her teenage years in BBYO, to her adulthood caring for seniors through Jewish Senior Housing and Healthcare Service (JSHHS), which she worked for and served as president, "Federation and its agencies have always played an essential role in my life," she said.



Celebrating 100 Years Of Impact

In 1922, a group of 29 people with vision and compassion for others created an organization to serve the Jews living in Camden, New Jersey. From humble beginnings focused on the delivery of food, clothing, and shelter, the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey has grown into a family of agencies dedicated to serving the needs of tens of thousands of Jews and others in South Jersey, Israel, and 70 countries worldwide.

Over the past 100 years, the Federation has made an impact by caring for those in need, enhancing Jewish life, and ensuring the continuity of a vibrant Jewish community locally, in Israel, and around the world, all while growing to meet the evolving needs of our community. During this time, we witnessed the formation of our current family of agencies: the Katz Jewish Community Center (JCC), Samost Jewish Family & Children's Service (JFCS), Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC), Jewish Community Voice (JCV), Jewish Senior Housing & Healthcare Service (JSHHS), Jewish Community Properties (JCP), and Jewish Community Foundation, Inc (JCF).

We watched these agencies grow and thrive with the addition of vital programs and services, such as the JFCS Project SARAH (Stop Abusive Relationships at Home) program, the JCRC Esther Raab Holocaust Museum & Goodwin Education Center, the JCRC BookMates program, the JSHHS Lions Gate community, JCC Life Long Learning, and more.

We saw the Federation introduce new programs and services, including the Gift of Israel program, the South Jersey chapter of PJ Library, the Federation Leadership Institute, the Young Adult Division (YAD), the Jewish Business Network (JBN), and Aleph Home Care & Adult Day Center.

We witnessed how a dream can turn into reality with the completion of the Weinberg Commons project, an affordable housing community for older adults 55+ and adults with special needs. This project has already received two major awards for its innovative approach and serves as a model for other Jewish organizations looking to provide affordable housing in their communities.

We grieved the losses of two beloved leaders in our community, Don Love z"l and Susan Love z"l. Don Love was a pillar of the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey. He served as President of JCF, was a member of several boards and committees, and he was a trustee of the Saltzman Foundation. Through it all, he was a visionary and sought to make an impact.

Susan Love served as the CEO of Federation's Jewish Senior Housing and Healthcare Service (JSHHS) since 2016. It was her leadership that made Lions Gate a premier 5-Star community and Saltzman House the most desirable affordable living community.

We learned just how resilient and adaptive our community is during the COVID-19 pandemic. When programming moved from in person to virtual, the Federation launched JLink, its online streaming platform. Through

JLink, community members can access a variety of digital content from the Federation and its family of agencies.

We also realized how one person's legacy can change a community through Ruth Saltzman, a remarkable woman whose generosity and vision had a profound impact on the South Jersey Jewish community – an impact that continues to live on today through The Raymond & Gertrude R. Saltzman Foundation. Since its establishment over 40 years ago, the Saltzman Foundation has provided over \$80 million to the community through more than 130 grants to support Jewish seniors, Jewish children, and Jewish people overseas.

It is people like Ruth Saltzman, Don Love, Susan Love, and this year's Love Impact Award honorees that make our South Jersey Jewish community thrive. We are grateful to everyone who helped us make an impact over the past 100 years and we look forward to continuing our life-changing work over the next 100 years.
