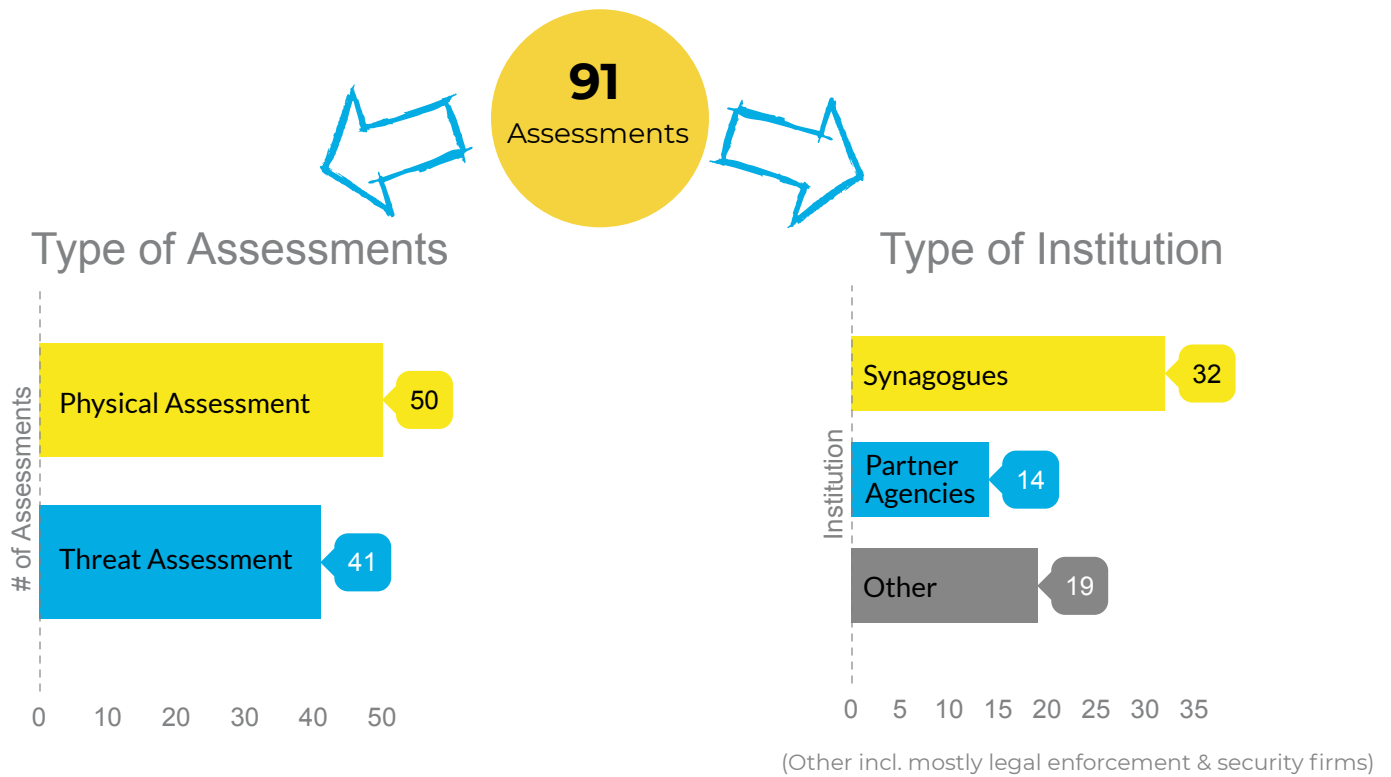

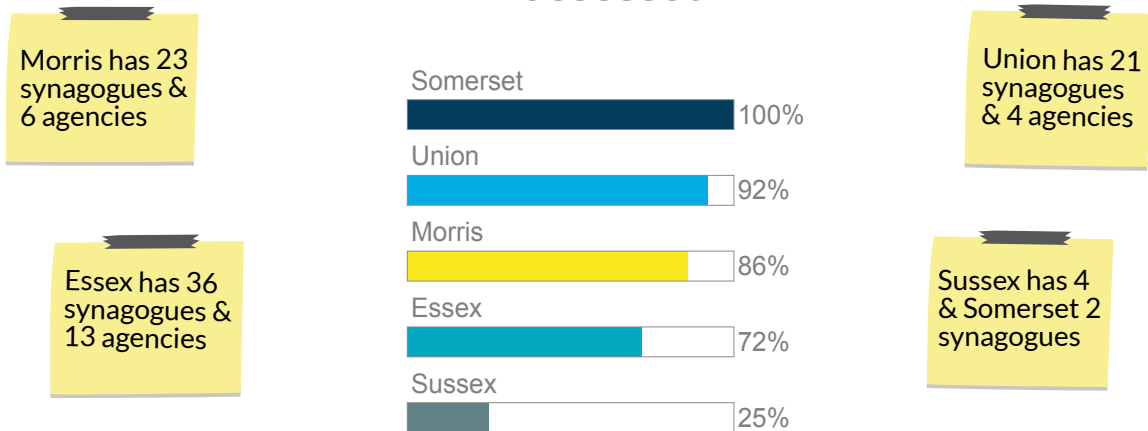

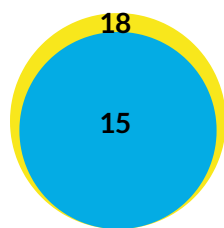


CSO testified before the Senate on the existing threat of Greater MetroWest Jewish community. Received \$1 million in state funding for security at nonprofit organizations.

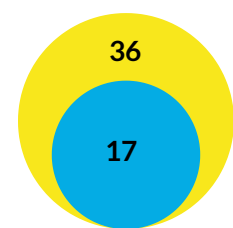

Institutions that reached out to Federation for Security Training

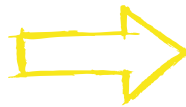
63%
