What is Greater MetroWest CARES?

CARES is a collaboration between Jewish Federation of Greater MetroWest NJ (Federation) and its partner agencies to create a continuum of care for adults 60+ in response to a broad range of concerns, including physical and mental health care, spiritual health and well-being, social and vocational services, and transportation and housing needs.

The mission of CARES is to bring together agency professionals and community leaders to leverage resources and strengthen the community's capacity to deliver services to mature adults to foster their independence, reinforce their community involvement, and ensure their dignity. CARES also provides leadership on eldercare issues by identifying trends to meet the emerging needs of the Greater MetroWest community, promoting advocacy, facilitating aging in place, and encouraging support for family caregivers.

Who does CARES serve?

CARES serves adults 60+ (and the people who care about them) who range from vital to frail, those living independently or in supportive residential settings, and targeted populations including seniors with low incomes, aging parents of people with developmental disabilities, older adults with psychiatric disabilities, and Holocaust survivors.

Where does CARES provide services?

Services are provided in Essex, Morris, Sussex, Union, and parts of Somerset counties.
