

JEWISH FEDERATION'S ADULT EDUCATION CLASSES AND DAY OF LEARNING

The Jewish Federation's Adult Education classes have enriched the lives of many thousands of Jewish adults since they began more than 25 years ago. Also referred to as Midreshet, classes are taught by Jewish educators, including local rabbis and academics, with an expertise in a wide range of subjects, from biblical times to contemporary Jewish culture.

During fall, winter and spring sessions, adults learn a wide range of topics revisited, renewed, and revised every year. They include titles such as Kings, Prophets & Priests; A Treasury of Jewish Folklore; and American Jews and Their Role in Industry, Business, Arts & Media.

Classes are designed for those who have some basic Jewish education, and are open to everyone. They are interactive, held at the Jewish Federation, and also available via zoom for those unable to attend in the classroom.

An annual highlight is the Global Day of Jewish Learning, uniting up to 500 Jewish communities worldwide through the study of Jewish texts, both ancient and modern. This event typically takes place on a Sunday, and here in Rockland at the Jewish Federation. It is held in coordination with Limmud North America, an organization dedicated to strengthening communities through Jewish learning.

Participants pay a subsidized fee to enroll in our fall, winter and spring sessions. Sponsorship will cover the balance of costs for educators, materials, and space. We count on and greatly appreciate the support of community members in making our educational program available.
