FEDERATION ANNUAL CAMPAIGN PROVIDING STABILITY IN UNCERTAIN TIMES

With a 40-year inflation high on the heels of the pandemic, community members—and the organizations that serve them— are feeling the pinch.

Skyrocketing costs are forcing more people to turn to our partners for help, while our partners struggle to keep up.

We are all familiar with the high price tag to live in this region. However, the latest report from platform <u>liv.rent</u> finds renters in Metro Vancouver are now spending more than half of their income on rent, far beyond the recommended percentage and up 16% from August.

For families, students and seniors on fixed incomes, that can mean choosing between rent, paying bills or putting food on the table.

When it comes to affordability in our community, we know that often the first thing to go is Jewish community life experiences. People may opt out of joining synagogues, sending their children to summer camp, or attending Hebrew school to cut costs. Organizations may also cut back on programs and services or community events that are not deemed essential. That hurts us all.

Our partners are grappling with rising costs that can't be passed on to clients.

Our partners were already stretched. Everything they bring in goes to the people they serve. Now, higher operating costs and a tight labour market are hampering their ability to meet increased demand for their services.

One of our partners reported a 15% increase in demand over the last few months alone. Now they must make tough choices. This in turn has a ripple effect on the programs and services they provide.

Organizations that provide nutritious meals to seniors have had to be more diligent in the type of food they are purchasing and the quantities they are providing.

Most of our partners rely on volunteer drivers to deliver things like meals to those in need. But with the high price of gas, it is harder for volunteers to afford to do this extra driving. Organizations are working to offset these increased costs so they can continue to rely on these volunteers.

Many of our partners are challenged to attract or retain staff now that the labour market has shifted. Simply providing their staff with a modest cost





of living increase is out of reach for many. Yet they cannot afford to lose their staff to better paying jobs or jobs where they don't have to commute.

For those organizations in social services, housing, or residential care programs their major concern is the level of care they would be able to provide with reduced staffing.

Jewish Federation takes a holistic approach to community needs.

As a Federation we have a unique vantage point. We see the bigger picture and bring to bear our strengths in community planning, convening partners, inspiring collaborations and generating the funds to meet community needs.

Through a recent survey that we conducted, Jewish community organizations expressed significant concern due to rising costs.


