The antecedents of this project are found in the Documentation and Research Center of the Ashkenazi Community of Mexico, founded 25 years ago by a group of students and teachers who realized the urgency of preserving our historical memory for future generations. The CDIJUM is made up of a library, a newspaper archive, a file, a photo library, an oral history file and various databases.

Upon arrival to the **Zócalo** your guide will have an explanation of the **Metropolitan Cathedral** and the Templo Mayor. This beautiful, imposing cathedral dominates the vast expanse of Mexico City's central square, or zócalo. The Metropolitan Cathedral is not only one of Mexico's most treasured architectural masterpieces; it is also Latin America's largest and oldest cathedral.
