

ASPIRATION (ultimate impact) CREATING OUR HOME TOGETHER

A flourishing community of belonging where all have access to a full and meaningful life.

CORE ASSUMPTIONS (rationale)

As humans, we need to belong—to one another, to our friends and families, to our culture, to our city, to the wider world. Belonging is fundamental to happiness and well-being. In the 2019 community study, all agreed, Judaism is a matter of community. Community and belonging go hand in hand.





GUIDING PRINCIPLES (values)

We want community members to feel that Judaism, Jewish values, traditions, people, and the community have **relevance** in their lives; they are **empowered** to create their own Jewish journeys; they are **connected** to each other, to the Jewish community, and to the Jewish people.



PRIORITIES (objectives)

 **Engagement:** Expand participation in Jewish life empowering individuals to choose their own manner of Jewish engagement in or expression thereof.

 **Caring:** Secure the health, wellness, and safety of those in need.



Wider World: Build bridges of understanding; advocate for a just and safe society for all; contribute to a better world.



Communal Health & Resiliency: Nourish deep and authentic partnerships that support thriving organizations in our community for sustainability and increased communal impact.



IMPACT AREAS (goals)

Belonging and Inclusive: Community members, reflective of the diversity of the Jewish community, have equitable opportunities to engage and feel a sense of value and belonging in the communal life nurtured by a diversity of viewpoints.

Healthy: Community members know how to and can successfully access resources that support healthy living at every age. This includes resources and support for mental health services and the spiritual and social connections that advance their mental health.

Caring: Community members feel supported, valued, and cared for in the ways that are right for them by Jewish Friends in their networks, community, groups, and organizations during times of need. Individuals have opportunities to engage in acts of kindness, generosity, and service.

Active: Individuals know and feel comfortable advocating for the Jewish community's public affairs agenda, are involved in issues and policies that affect the community, and work to promote change and progress.

Engaged: People take part in Jewish experiences and are connected to other Jews/Jewish families in their community.

Educated: Individuals develop an ongoing practice of learning for themselves and their children and seek to apply Jewish teachings to their daily lives. Community members have access to Jewish education, both formal and informal, and engage in Jewish learning at all stages of life.

Safe: Community members, reflective of the diversity of the Jewish community, are secure and protected from harm and discrimination. Individuals believe that their larger communities, including non-Jewish members, care about their security and wellbeing.

Connected to Israel and Global Jewry: Individuals have a meaningful relationship with Israel and feel connected to Jewish communities around the world.

SHARED SUCCESS FRAMEWORK

A C2030 Task Force will be comprised of cross-sector community partners/members representative of the Cincinnati Jewish Community ecosystem. The Task Force will **provide strategic direction for the C2030 Common Agenda (shared vision for change), shared measurement, and champions its work.** C2030 Work Groups will be created to support the C2030 Strategic Opportunities. There will be four Task Force groups for each priority (i.e. Engagement, Wider World, Caring, and Communal Health & Resiliency).
