A | Strengthen **ECONOMIC WELL-BEING & RESILIENCE** *in the Jewish Community*

The changes we're working toward:

- Reduce financial hardship by ensuring reliable access to core supports (food, housing, healthcare, employment, financial assistance)
- Strengthen safety-net system coordination so agencies work together more effectively
- Increase awareness and understanding of how and where to seek help within the Jewish community

B | Strengthen **JEWISH ENGAGEMENT** *at High-Impact Life Stages*

The changes we're working toward:

- Expand investment in young family engagement as a key entry point into sustained Jewish life
- Enhance meaningful experiences that strengthen Jewish identity and resilience for youth and teens
- Develop new pathways for mid-life adults focusing on renewed exploration of Jewish identity, leadership and purpose

C | Strengthen **JEWISH PEOPLEHOOD** *and Sense of Belonging*
