## Background

The tragic event on October 7th left around **240 orphans under the age of 18**, with a considerable number of them being double orphans who lost both parents. Families caring for these orphaned children face increased challenges; the responsibility of offering support to the young ones who have experienced significant trauma while concurrently processing their own trauma and the mourning process.

NOVT extends assistance to 100 families through a specialized initiative, offering immediate support following October 7th.

- This encompasses:
- Logistical support
- Provision of food and supplies
- Acquisition of furniture and electrical appliances
- Household cleaning and management
- Transportation to medical treatments
- Advocacy for their fundamental rights





## Healing through Enjoyable Family Moments

Having received timely and crucial support from NOVT for young orphaned families, numerous households face difficulties in cultivating a sense of unity within their recently formed family unit. These families need assistance and encouragement to come together for joyful and cohesive experiences rather than being immersed in grief-stricken ones.

We are firm believers that aiding families in crafting meaningful quality time plays a pivotal role in the family's rehabilitation process.

Such activities and gatherings can revolve around **anything the family is interested in**, such as a meal at a restaurant, a movie night, bowling, a nature outing, or a weekend getaway, among other possibilities. The task at hand involves **collaboration with local businesses**, allowing each family to select their family time based on their preferences and the phase of their grieving journey.
