With thanks to a generous lead gift from the Alan and Linda Cohen family, JFGI is in the midst of permanently and fully endowing the PJ Library program in our community. This program is one of the most successful and engaging national Jewish initiatives, on par with Birthright with its impact on families. Gifts to the PJ Library Endowment Fund will help continue bringing Judaism into households and bringing Jewish families together through meaningful experiences. Contributions through April 2025 will also be matched by 25% from the Harold Grinspoon Foundation (HGF), and JFGI will also receive a \$1,000 grant from HGF for each legacy (after-life) commitment to the Fund.



PJ Library reached more than **2,000 Jewish households** through programming in 2023 and has delivered more than **100,000 books** to Jewish households in central Indiana since 2009.



Jewish Family Services (JFS) fosters a community in which no person faces life challenges alone. Gifts to JFS enable them to offer a range of services across the lifespan. While unrestricted gifts are always appreciated, JFS has several specific areas of recurring need, such as providing food and household supplies through Popsie's Pantry, helping Jewish families and older adults with basic needs like rent or utilities through Emergency Funds, holiday support through Adopt-a-Family (Chanukah) and the Passover Food Drive, and social services for Holocaust survivors through the Kavod program.




Indianapolis continues to need resources to stand against hate and better secure Jewish places and spaces. A gift to the Safe Indiana community security initiative or Combatting Antisemitism Fund will help bolster security, fund community trainings and educational programs to fight Jewish prejudice, and facilitate emergency communications.



JFGI offers various opportunities to strengthen and protect Jewish life, thereby sustaining a vibrant Jewish community. Supporting the Shaliach (Israeli emissary) program allows Indianapolis to have an emissary to provide a living connection to Israel by promoting Israeli experiences, facilitating Jewish social activism and speaking authentically about faith and culture in the Jewish and general community.



More than half of the southside Jewish cemeteries no longer have active synagogues to manage and preserve their hallowed grounds. Caring for these cemeteries is one of the highest mitzvot the community can collectively achieve. The JFGI Cemetery Maintenance Fund ensures care for the Jewish cemeteries is available today and in perpetuity.

JFGI provides academic scholarships as well as grants to support children attending Jewish summer camps or Jewish trips to Israel. Whether for undergraduate or graduate students in college, first time trips to Israel, or helping a family send their child to camps like Goldman Union Camp Institute (GUCI), this is an impactful way to support the Indianapolis Jewish Community. A new Scholarship Fund can be established with a minimum gift of \$10,000 and represents an investment in the community's future through academic and experiential opportunities.





Enshrine your name in perpetuity as a supporter of the JFGI Annual Campaign with a Perpetual Annual Campaign Endowment (PACE) Fund. These funds are invested with other endowment funds and distribute 4% of their balance annually to the Annual Campaign. A PACE Fund can be established with a minimum gift of \$10,000. For women, an endowed Annual Campaign gift of at least \$100,000 is a Lion of Judah Endowment (LOJE) Fund, which recognizes the donor as a Forever Lion. This legacy gift can be fulfilled in part or in its entirety from your DAF or can be funded through your estate plans.
