TOUR 1 - OLD CITY OF JAFFA

Ascend from the Old Port, through the renovated alleyways to the Jaffa Overlook for an introduction to Tel Aviv. Stroll through the famous Jaffa Market – "Shuk Hapishpishim".

TOUR 2 - NEVE TZEDEK & "WHITE CITY" ARCHITECTURE

The first Jewish neighbourhood outside of the port city of Jaffa, built as a suburb. Its oriental architectural style, combined with quaint, narrow streets and boutiques, makes Neve Tzedek one of the trendiest areas in Tel Aviv. Enjoy a short stroll down Rothschild Boulevard and view intriguing Bauhausstyle architecture from the 1930s.

Mr. Dan Tadmor, CEO of Beit Hatfutsot, has extensive experience in content development and management.

In the IDF he served as an officer in an elite intelligence unit.

CHAIR BEIT HATFUTSOT

IRINA Nevzlin

Irina Nevzlin serves as Chair of the Board of Directors of Beit Hatfutsot–The Museum of the Jewish People, and President of the Nadav Foundation. She is currently leading an extensive renewal project to recreate Beit Hatfutsot as a unique global cultural center for the Jewish People, due to open in 2018.

As President of Nadav, Irina oversees the strategic management of the Foundation, which supports initiatives that promote Jewish Peoplehood, builds collective Jewish identity and forges lasting ties between Jews around the world. In addition, Irina serves as the Founding Co-Chair of the Israeli Center for Better Childhood (ICBC). She previously sat on the Board of Directors of the Jewish Funders Network (JFN) and on the Prime Minister's Round Table, a strategic planning forum bringing together the private and non-profit sectors for positive change in social policy in Israel. Irina also serves as the Chair of the Board of 'Liberal,' a Hebrew monthly, covering Israeli political life, communications and culture.

A native of Moscow, Irina holds a BA and MA in Economics from Moscow Lomonosov State University. She has worked in government relations, lobbying and strategic communications in both Moscow and London, and has extensive experience in PR for private and non-profit organizations.

AMBASSADOR

DEBORAH LYONS

Deborah Lyons joined the Department of Global Affairs Canada in 1999 and was immediately posted to Tokyo as Commercial Counsellor for Canada's high-tech industries. After serving in Japan for 5 years, she returned to the departmental headquarters in Ottawa where she held a number of key positions; Director, International Finance; Director-General, North America Commercial Affairs; and Assistant Deputy Minister for Strategic Policy and Planning and Chief Strategist. In 2010, Ms. Lyons was appointed as Deputy Ambassador at the Embassy of Canada in Washington, D.C. In 2013, Governor General David Johnston appointed Ms. Lyons as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Canada to the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, initially for 1 year; however, given the importance of the work, Ambassador Lyons served a total of 3 years. In 2016, Governor General Johnston appointed Ambassador Lyons as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Canada to Israel. Ambassador Lyons formally presented her credentials to President Rivlin on December 12, 2016.

Ambassador Lyons was recently recognized for her work in Afghanistan by the Community of Democracies at their September meeting during UNGA. The Community of Democracies awarded Ambassador Lyons the Mark Palmer Prize for 2016. The Mark Palmer Prize is conferred by the non-governmental International Steering Committee of the Community of Democracies to a Diplomat who has employed bold and effective means to encourage states and assist civil societies to advance democracy and human rights.

Prior to joining Global Affairs Canada, Ambassador Lyons held positions of increasing responsibility with the Department of Natural Resources, Privy Council Office, and the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency.

Before joining the world of government, Ambassador Lyons was a small business owner of a national energy consulting company and owned and managed an outdoor recreation centre.

Ambassador Lyons is a graduate of the University of New Brunswick (and a recent honorary degree recipient). In 1993 Ambassador Lyons took part in a year-long study program at Canada's National Defence College.

Ambassador Lyons has a large and extended family and a wonderful daughter, Tessa, who works in California at Facebook.



ISRAELI POLITICIAN

TZIP I IVN

Tzipi Livni is an Israeli politician who has served in eight different cabinet positions throughout her career. Widely considered the most powerful woman in Israel since Golda Meir, Livni has set the record for most government roles held by an Israeli woman. Consequently, she has achieved a number of milestones in Israeli government, as the first female Vice Prime Minister, Justice Minister, Agriculture Minister, and Housing Minister.

After serving as a lieutenant in the Israel Defense Forces, in 1979 Livni began studying law at Bar-Ilan University. The following year she was recruited by the Mossad, and her studies were interrupted in 1983 when she was sent on a mission to Paris. She left the agency shortly thereafter and married accountant Naftali Shpitzer, with whom she later had two sons. In 1984 she completed her degree, and from 1984 to 1996, she practiced law, specializing in real estate and corporate law.

Livni entered politics following the 1995 assassination of Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin. She believed that Israel's political right had been unfairly discredited by the assassination and was determined to reverse the Oslo Process Rabin had led.

Born to a prominent right-wing, revisionist Zionist family, Livni has become one of Israel's leading voices in support of a two-state solution—one that ensures Israel's security and identity as a Jewish and democratic state.

From 2006 to 2008, Forbes magazine ranked Livni on its List of 100 Most Powerful Women three years in row, while Time included her in its 2007 "Time 100," for which U.S. Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice penned an op-ed. In Israel, Livni has earned a reputation as an honest politician who sticks to her principles.

From 2001 to 2009, Livni served in the cabinets of Ariel Sharon and Ehud Olmert, most notably as Israel's Foreign Minister, during which time she led multiple rounds of peace talks with the Palestinians. In September 2008, Livni prepared to take office as Prime Minister of Israel, but the political climate in the country prevented her from forming a government. The following year, she led her party to win a plurality of seats in the Knesset, but was again blocked from becoming prime minister, due to the rightist parties' majority in the Knesset. Consequently, she served as Leader of the Opposition from 2009, until her resignation from the Knesset in 2012.

Later that year, Livni founded a new party, Hatnuah, to compete in the 2013 elections, after which she was appointed Justice Minister in the 33rd government of Israel, again leading a new round of Israeli–Palestinian peace talks. In December 2014, a number of policy disputes within the government led Benjamin Netanyahu to dismiss Livni from his cabinet and call new elections. In the 2015 election, Livni joined forces with Labor Party leader Isaac Herzog to create the Zionist Union, a unified bloc of their two parties.

On February 11, 2017, it was reported that UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres had offered Livni the post of Under-Secretary-General of the United Nations. Livni would be the first Israeli to serve in such a senior position at the organization.

Youth Futures is one of Israel's leading positive-intervention programs. Operating on a national level since 2006, Youth Futures aims to empower and advance young children and youth at-risk who live in Israel's social and geographic peripheries. The vision of Youth Futures is one of children. families, and communities with the security, tools for success, and egual opportunities to realize their unique, individual potential. Each of the 36 low-income communities in which Youth Futures operates has a Family and Community Coordinator, who works to help children and parents access the available social services to which they are entitled, teaches parenting skills, encourages parents to be more actively involved in children's lives, helps parents manage the family economy, and harnesses the resources of the community to build a positive educational environment for all children. Additionally, Youth Futures "Mentors" in each school – young adults specially trained for this role – work with individual children and their families to help them strengthen their interpersonal, intrapersonal, and academic skills. We will meet Mentors who will introduce you to Youth Futures and to the children with whom they work. Join together in an interactive activity that will help boost their selfesteem and interpersonal skills.

Amigour: Subsidized Housing in Israel provides quality housing throughout Israel, serving thousands of vulnerable senior citizens, the majority of whom are Holocaust survivors along with others who participated in World War II as soldiers and partisans. We will meet with the Director of Amigour and some of the residents, who will share their personal stories. Together, with the Amigour Choir, we will sing. Young Activism engages young Israelis who seek to be social change agents in their local communities through volunteerism, activism and entrepreneurship. Meet with the Director of Young Activism and learn how The Jewish Agency is developing meaningful opportunities for young Israelis to become leaders, social entrepreneurs and skilled volunteers who widen the circles of impact.

Born in 1969.

LLM. and LLB. in Law from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

In the past, Zach Granit held several managerial positions in the communication field, including the General Director of the Regional Radio Stations Association and the Programing Director of Channel 10 TV.

Since 2003, he has held several senior positions in the field of culture, including Head of Culture Administration at the Ministry of Culture and Sports, and Deputy Director of the Israel Museum. In 2017, he was appointed the General Director of the Israeli Opera.

In addition, he was a lecturer for Communications Law and for Cultural Policy at the Tel Aviv-Jaffa Academic College and led several educational projects at the Tel Aviv-Jaffa Municipality.

MAYOR OF JERUSALEM

NIR Barkat

On November 11, 2008, Nir Barkat was elected the 9th Mayor of Jerusalem. Since assuming office on December 2, 2008, Mayor Barkat has inspired thousands of Jerusalemites with his relentless work to turn Israel's poorest city into one rich in culture, youth, tourism, education, and sustainable economic development. This work, coupled with his message of respect and pluralism for all residents of Jerusalem, all served as the basis for his re-election for a second term in 2013.

For the five years preceding his election as Mayor, Nir Barkat served as the leader of the opposition in Jerusalem's City Council. In his term as City Councilman, Barkat set out on a path of active civic engagement and reform beyond the city council to address education, negative migration of Jerusalem's young adults, and the need for lasting economic development. Since assuming office, members of the City Council have formed a wide, diverse coalition behind Mayor Barkat, a testament to his leadership and vision.

Mayor Barkat's marked successes in his public service are rooted in his previous work as a tech entrepreneur. In 1988, Mayor Barkat co-founded BRM Technologies, which developed and marketed ground-breaking anti-virus software now standard on personal computers throughout the world. BRM eventually transitioned into a venture capital firm that invested in CheckPoint Technologies. He has brought his business acumen and entrepreneurial approach to City Hall, fostering a municipal culture dedicated to constant innovation and swift execution.

Mayor Barkat's dedication to education prompted him to retain the city's Education Portfolio. His commitment to education reform began far before his mayoral appointment, when he and his wife Beverly co-founded The Snunit Center for the Advancement of Web Based Learning in 1999. Since assuming office, education reform has remained one of the core tenets of his work as Mayor, and his overhaul of the education system has completely reversed the declining enrollment figures he inherited when he assumed the post.

Mayor Barkat has grown the municipal budget by an average of 10% each year in office, spurring dramatic growth in employment, investment in infrastructure and cultural development. Accordingly, Jerusalem has become a national leader in resident satisfaction, youth engagement and Zionist sector enlistment in the IDF. Mayor Barkat has already begun to develop plans for large scale public-private-partnerships and has set a goal of ten million annual tourists by 2020.

Mayor Barkat received the rank of Major during his six years of service in the Israel Defense Forces. During his time as a paratrooper, he led soldiers inside enemy territory as a company commander during the First Lebanon War. Following his army service, Mayor Barkat returned to Jerusalem where he attended Hebrew University and earned a degree in computer science.

He is married to artist Beverly Barkat, with whom he has three daughters.

Marik Shtern is a scholar and a lecturer whose field of research is Jewish-Arab relations in Jerusalem and identity politics in Israel.

Marik also has extensive experience as a social activist, working in community empowerment and strategic consulting for 3rd sector organizations. Marik is one of the founders and the current chair of Hatnua Hayerushalmit, a movement whose goal is to advance Jerusalem as a strong, pluralistic and inclusive city. He was CEO of the The Yuri Shtern Foundation, a memorial organization that works to support people dealing with cancer through subsidized treatments. He is also the founder and a board member of the social group Generation 1.5, which aims to educate for more civic participation, political tolerance, and cultural integration of the Israeli Russian-speaking community.

As a scholar, Marik lectures on many subjects that are crucial to Jerusalem as a contested city and to Israel as a multicultural society. Marik has published many articles in Hebrew and English and has given interviews on leading Israeli news channels and websites. He has also published several research papers on the East Jerusalem labor market, interactions between Jews and Arabs in Jerusalem and local politics in Israel.

In addition to undergraduate and graduate degrees in Geography and History from the Hebrew University, Marik is a PhD candidate in the Department of Politics and Government at Ben-Gurion University of the Negev. Marik is a researcher at the Jerusalem Institute for Israel and lectures on planning policy at the Open University of Israel.

Marik lives in Jerusalem with his wife Chaya and their son Michael.

Attending the Anglican International School in West Jerusalem, and later graduating in Business Management and Tourism from the University of Utah in 2003, he lived in Boston for seven years before returning to his childhood home in Jerusalem. He has worked for TIME Magazine since 2010.

Rami has extensive journalistic experience for outlets like TIME, Reuters, Der Spiegel and David Shipler. His ability to simultaneously interpret between English and Arabic along side his connections with the most influential members in the State, allow him to move freely and safely across borders. He accompanies church leaders, politicians, film producers, tourists and other luminaries in the streets of Ramallah, Nablus and Hebron; and in villages and refugee camps in the West Bank.

Rami's lifelong dream is sharing with people from all walks of life, the reality on the other side of the border. His knowledge and exposure allows his listeners the opportunity to discover the reality of Palestinian society and to gain a raw and authentic lens of the difficult political and emotional terrain of Palestine and Israel.

NATAN SHARANSKY

Natan Sharansky was born in 1948 in Donetzk, Ukraine. He graduated from the Physical Technical Institute in Moscow with a degree in computer science. After graduating, he applied for an exit visa to Israel, which he was denied for "security reasons". Very quickly he became involved in the struggle of Soviet Jewry to earn their freedom and emigrate to Israel. At the same time, he joined the human rights movement in the Soviet Union led by Andrei Sahkharov. He became one of the founding members of the Moscow Helsinki Group which united Soviet dissidents of all types. Natan Sharansky soon became an unofficial spokesperson for both movements.

In 1977, a Soviet newspaper alleged that Mr. Sharansky was collaborating with the CIA. Despite denials from every level of the U.S. Government, Mr. Sharansky was found guilty and sentenced to thirteen years in prison including solitary confinement and hard labor. In the courtroom prior to the announcement of his verdict, Mr. Sharansky in a public statement said: "To the court I have nothing to say – to my wife and the Jewish people I say "Next Year in Jerusalem". After nine years of imprisonment, due to intense international pressure and a campaign led by his wife, Avital Sharansky, Mr. Sharansky was released on February 11, 1986, emigrated to Israel and arrived in Jerusalem on that very day.

Upon his arrival to Israel he continued the struggle for opening the gates of the Soviet Union. The final chapter of this historic struggle for the release of Soviet Jews was the momentous rally of over 250,000 people on December 7th, 1987, of which Natan Sharansky was the initiator and driving force. The rally coincided with Soviet President Gorbachev's first visit to Washington and was influential in pressuring the Soviet Union to ease its restrictions on emigration. Ten years after arriving in Israel, Sharansky founded the political party Yisrael B'Aliyah which means both "Israel on the Rise" and "Israel for Immigration." In 1988, in expectation of the opening of the gates of the Soviet Union, Natan Sharansky formed together with other former Refuseniks and Aliya

(immigration to Israel) advocates the Soviet Jewry Zionist Forum, an umbrella organization of former Soviet activist groups dedicated to helping new Israelis and educating the public about absorption issues. From 1990 to 1996 Mr. Sharansky served as Associate Editor of "The Jerusalem Report" and in 1994 co-founded Peace Watch – an independent non-partisan group committed to monitoring the compliance to agreements signed by Israel and the PLO.

SUNDAY, NOV 05 - YAD VASHEM TOURS

The party was established to accelerate the absorption of the massive numbers of Russian immigrants into Israeli society and to maximize their contribution. From 1996-2005 Natan Sharansky served as Minister as well as Deputy Prime Minister in four successive Israeli governments. In November 2006 Natan Sharansky resigned from the Israeli Knesset and assumed the position of Chairman of the newly established Adelson Institute for Strategic Studies at the Shalem Center in Jerusalem. He is also the Chairman of One Jerusalem and Beit Hatfutsot, the Jewish Diaspora Museum in Tel Aviv.

In June 2009, Natan Sharansky was elected Chairman of the Jewish Agency for Israel. Natan Sharansky was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal in 1986 and the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2006. He has continued to lead human rights efforts both through his writings as well as public activities. His memoir, Fear No Evil, was published in the United States in 1988 and has been translated into nine languages. His New York Times bestseller, The Case for Democracy: The Power of Freedom to Overcome Freedom and Terror attracted wide-spread attention. After reading the book, President George Bush was quoted saying: "If you want to understand my political DNA, read this book." His latest book, Defending Identity, Its Indispensable Role in Protecting Democracy published by Public Affairs, was released in June 2008.

Natan Sharansky is married to Avital. They reside in Jerusalem and have two daughters, Rachel and Hanna and two grandchildren.

Born in 1959, Eshel was drafted into the IDF in 1977.

After graduating from the IAF Flight Academy as a fighter pilot in 1979, Eshel flew the A-4 Skyhawk and later went on to fly an F-16.

Between 1993 and 1995 Eshel commanded 201 Squadron at Tel Nof and he led the squadron during Operation Grapes of Wrath.

Between 1997 and 1999 Eshel headed the IAF's Operations Department and in 1999 he was assigned command of Ramon Airbase.

In 2004 Eshel became head of the IAF's Air Group, commanding all operational assets and in January 2006 was appointed IAF Chief of Staff, a role he filled during the 2006 Lebanon War. Eshel was subsequently credited with the improvements to air-ground integration implemented after the war.

In March of 2008, he was promoted to the rank of Major General and appointed head of the IDF's Planning Directorate.

In February 2012, Eshel was named Commander in Chief of the Israeli Air Force. Eshel completed his term as Commander of the IAF on August 10, 2017.

In September of 2003, Eshel, the son of Holocaust survivors, led a formation of three Israeli Air Force F-15 Eagles on a fly-over of the Auschwitz concentration camp, an incredibly meaningful and powerful event.

We will visit a Situation Room and learn how JAFI operates special missions and responds to emergencies throughout the world.
- Pioneering @ 2017: Neve Midbar Youth Village for Bedouin in Nitzana - Nitzana Educational Community is a cutting-edge residential and learning community, where young people of all backgrounds come together for educational experiences that emphasize tolerance, mutual understanding and respect for each other. Neve Midbar is a unique program specifically catering to young Bedouin men. The curriculum focuses on helping students achieve academic success. You will meet with Bedouin youth and hear about the impact that this program has on their lives.
- Exploring Borders Drive along the Egyptian Border for an overview of the successes and challenges following the peace agreement and the new players in the Sinai Desert (pending security clearance.)



UJA PROJECTS IN ISRAEL

1. OVERVIEW - WHY WE PARTNER WITH ISRAEL

Over the past 70 years, UJA Federation of Greater Toronto has forged a strong bond with the State of Israel with investments in aliyah and absorption, vulnerable populations, education, healthcare and cutting-edge technology.

These investments all contribute to a prosperous, resilient and successful Israel which offers future generations opportunities to make the most of their and the state of Israel's potential.

Through our strategic partnerships with the Israeli government, philanthropists and private foundations, UJA Federation of Greater Toronto supports programs having significant social impact, while leveraging matched investments of many millions of dollars for meaningful impact.

2. ISRAEL COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

BAT YAM

Context:

- Despite its location in the center of the country, Bat Yam currently has limited resources and few prospects for economic growth.
- With 160,000 residents in Bat Yam, almost 35% of the residents are immigrants from the Former Soviet Union and Ethiopia; 40% are senior citizens and it is the second most crowded city in Israel.
- Recently there has been an influx of new immigrants from the Ukraine and France moving to Bat Yam.

Goal:

STEEM – SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, ENGLISH, MATH: EDUCATION AS A VEHICLE FOR SOCIO-ECONOMIC MOBILITY IMPACT OF UJA'S PARTNERSHIP:

- 780 pupils are receiving access to advanced math, science and English programs
- 43 teachers are receiving professional development programs in math, science, English and cyber studies
- 700 children are provided with and inspired by field trips to science and technology centres in Israel
- 100's of children are participating in cyber and science competitions every year
- Development and building of new science and language labs in Bat Yam
- 18 young Ethiopian adults have received scholarships to study Nursing

EILAT/EILOT

Context:

- The remote location presents many challenges in successfully providing essential Education Services, Health Services and employment opportunities that ensure the stability and prosperity of Eilat/Eilot

Health Care (Yoseftal Hospital):

- \$1 million investment leveraged against \$5 million matching funds to build a new emergency room to better serve community needs
- Revamp and upgrade of entire hospital
- Recruitment of much needed human resources including doctors and nurses to the region through incentives

Innovation and Employment:

 Development of R&D facility for renewable energy which positions the region as the green Silicon Valley of Israel

Education:

- Positioning the Eilat campus of Ben-Gurion University as a local hub for STEEM studies
- Dormitories created in a Built-to-Own model
- Development of scholarships to incentivize students to live, learn and settle in the region

STEEM Initiatives:

- · Improving the ratio of teachers to pupils
- · Upgrading outdated science facilities and curriculums
- Implementing a problem based learning (PBL) approach to STEEM studies from 9th Grade and onwards
- Ensuring greater access to STEEM studies for pupils in Elementary and junior high
- Developing skills for pupils to work in a global environment including Robotics twinning between Toronto and Eilat/Eilot schools

STEM Success Highlights:

- 2,541 students are currently directly involved in STEM Programs
- Two joint STEM programs with Elementary Schools in Eilat and Toronto
- 20% increase in students choosing advanced mathematics in Eilot
- 10% increase in 9-11 Grade student averages grades for Math and Science
- 30 high school students have trained to become science instructors in after-school science and technology programs, instructing 80 elementary school students
- Robotics programs have been set up in every elementary school in Eilat
- Implementation of two joint programs between high schools in Eilat and Toronto
- Over 100 full scholarships awarded for BA and BSC Programs at Ben- Gurion University in Eilat
- Opening of a new science education program at Ben-Gurion University, Eilat campus

As part of the partnership between Eilat–Eilot and UJA, the twinning school robotics program continues to expand. This year the program includes four Jewish day schools from Toronto and four from Eilat. On October 16, a delegation of 10 teachers from Jewish day schools in Toronto travelled to Israel on a week-long study tour. Toronto schools participating in the program are: Robbins Hebrew Academy, Bialik, Leo Baeck and Associated.

SDEROT

Context:

- · 25.000 residents in Sderot
- For the past 13 years, Sderot has suffered considerably by living with the threat of daily rocket attacks. Since the summer of 2014 there has been a period of relative quiet, but the enormous task of rebuilding the community remains

Goal:

 Ensuring Sderot's resilience by investing in education and community programming that offers opportunities for the next generation to become Israel's community and economic leaders

IMPACT OF UJA'S PARTNERSHIP

Community:

- Fortified Sderot's Community Center (as a JFC-UIA National project)
- Developed a strong, vibrant Youth Department for Sderot, now fully operated by the municipality
- Stabilized formal and informal activities and services in the city, over the years, in times of peace
- Ability to operate independently in times of Emergency and to help other communities in Israel when under stress

STEEM Success Highlights:

- 360 kindergarten children are taking part in the Robomath program
- 500 elementary school children are using five new science laboratories
- 200 junior high and high school pupils are taking part in a researchoriented math program
- 20 teachers of math in elementary and high schools are taking part in in-service training
- Matriculation rates in Sderot are ranked top among all towns in southern Israel
- Providing educational guidance and job counselling to thousands in the Netivim centre for Young adults
- 250 students received full college scholarships.

3. JAFI

Since 1929, JAFI - the Jewish Agency for Israel has been bringing Jews to Israel, Israel to Jews and helping build a better society in Israel and beyond by inspiring Jews throughout the world to connect with their People, heritage and homeland, while empowering them to build a thriving Jewish future and a strong Israel.

JAFI was instrumental in founding and building the State of Israel and continues to serve as the main link between the Jewish state and Jewish communities everywhere, helping to address the challenges every generation of Jewish people have faced.

In the spirit of collective Jewish responsibility, UJA Federation of Greater Toronto partners with JAFI on the following:

- The Shlichim Program, with nine shlichim this year comprised of one regional shalicha, four community shlichim, one youth movement shaliach and three Israel Fellows.
- The ShinShinim Program, with twenty-five ShinShinim embedded in over 40 organizations throughout Toronto, including synagogues, day schools, youth groups, Hillel and other community organizations.
- Shevet; once ShinShinim return to Israel following their year of service in Toronto, they become members of the alumni group, the Shevet. Through this group they receive opportunities to build upon their meaningful experiences and to become change agents in their communities, helping strengthen relationships between Israel and the Diaspora.
- The Jack Weinrib z"I Memorial Fund and Fund for the Victims of Terror (FVOT) which provides special one-time grants of \$3,500 CAD, in coordination with UJA, to victims of terror.
- The Masa Israel Teaching Fellows (MITF) which was offered this
 year to 31 Fellows (2 from Toronto) who began their placement in
 16 schools across Bat Yam. A further three Torontonians are Fellows
 based in Ashdod.

4. JOINT DISTRIBUTION COMMITTEE (JDC)

JDC is the world's leading Jewish humanitarian assistance organization, impacting millions of lives of the world's poorest and most vulnerable Jews in more than 70 countries. Their efforts help revitalize Jewish life in remote communities, build tomorrow's leadership among Jewish youth and rescue victims of global emergencies.

JDC, founded during World War I to alleviate the suffering of Jews suffering in Ottoman Palestine was the first Jewish organization to provide large-scale funding for international relief. Over the years JDC played a significant role in sustaining and resettling Jews and rebuilding devastated Jewish communities both pre and post WWII.

Active today in 70 countries, JDC works to alleviate hunger and hardship, rescue Jews in danger, create lasting connections to Jewish life and help Israel overcome the social challenges of its most vulnerable citizens, both Jewish and non-Jewish.

In the spirit of collective Jewish responsibility in vulnerable overseas Jewish communities, UJA Federation of Greater Toronto partners with JDC on the following:

- Aiding vulnerable communities of Holocaust survivors in Moldovia
- Aiding Jewish communities in crisis
- Supporting Jewish leadership and Identity programs in Hungary and Bulgaria

5. ISRAEL ENGAGEMENT

BIRTHRIGHT

An opportunity for young people, 18-26, to visit Israel for a unique educational experience at no cost to them. This partnership is sponsored in the Toronto area by the Government of Israel, UJA Federation of Greater Toronto, The Jewish Agency for Israel and leading Jewish philanthropists.

MARCH OF THE LIVING

A two week educational experience in Poland and Israel for students in Grades 11 and 12, which marks three of the most important dates in Jewish history.

On Yom Hashoah students participate in a three kilometer International March from Auschwitz to Birkenau as a silent tribute to victims of the Shoah and then observe Yom Ha'zikaron and celebrate Yom Ha'atzmaut (Israel's Independence Day) in Israel.

DILLER TEEN FELLOWS PROGRAM

The UJA Federation of Greater Toronto has been supporting the delivery of the Diller Teen Fellow Program in Eilat. It is UJA's premiere leadership development program for Jewish teens in grades 10 and 11. Now operating in 30 communities in the United States, Canada, South Africa, Australia, England, Argentina and Israel, the goal of the Diller program is to develop future generations of active, effective leaders with a strong Jewish identity, commitment to the Jewish people, respect for pluralism and love of Israel.
