



From The Desk of Wendy Cedar, Executive Director

This year, we did things a little differently.

At our kickoff event for our 2026 annual fundraising campaign, where we have honored our major donors over the years, this year, we decided to honor some "Quiet Giants". We chose 3 community members whose passions for support of the Jewish community shine through their work and volunteerism; Genie Abrams from Newburgh, Rochelle Marshall from Monroe, and Michael Melasky from Warwick. We brought them together with a presentation from Joel Chasnoff, in



which we celebrated the return of the living hostages, and got a personal view of life on the ground in Israel today.

Genie Abrams is an activist in the Jewish community and also in the general community, focusing especially on helping her synagogue, Temple Beth Jacob; and her hometown, the City of Newburgh. She serves on the Federation's Community Relations Council and on TBJ's Cemetery Committee, and was elected to City Council, representing Newburgh's Ward 2, from 2014 through 2017. She is the current Poet Laureate of Newburgh and can be seen leaving poems around the city of Newburgh for people's enjoyment.

Rochelle Marshall is a beloved and respected member of the Congregation Eitz Chaim community whose life has been defined by service. From her career as an elementary school teacher to her experience as Co-Chair of the Federation's Community Relations Council, and with her ongoing efforts with Hadassah, Eitz Chaim's sisterhood, and as a social justice advocate, Rochelle has always stood up for what matters most. She initiated the only regular rally for the hostages in Orange County, at the lakes in Monroe, and could be seen out there nearly every Sunday until the final living hostages came home. Rochelle was concerned about being honored as a Quiet Giant, because by her account, she is neither quiet, nor a giant!

Michael Melasky is a retired public school administrator/humanities educator, who for well over a decade has co-managed the Temple Beth Shalom cemetery. His life change dramatically after the cemetery was defaced with hateful symbols in 2016. He helped to lead the conversation and educate with respect to this incident, not only telling the story of what transpired, but created an interactive program on how to deal effectively with Hate Speech. He has spoken to thousands of students and administrators in Orange County and beyond, confronting Hate Speech.

Joel Chasnoff is an American-born comedian who made Aliyah right after college. He currently lives in Ra'anana, Israel, with his Israeli wife and their four kids. He has written a book about his life in the Israeli military, and one about things you never knew about life in Israel. He also has as weekly podcast called Inside Israel, and gave us some great insight into life on the ground in Israel, just days after the ceasefire agreement.

All in all, it was a great celebration of the Orange County Jewish community. Gifts in honor of these Quiet Giants will be put into two new endowments initiated by Rochelle and Genie, and for Michael, will support our Zachor Antisemitism Initiative. 




The Harold Levine Named Endowment Fund Program

As we see the continued rise of antisemitism thinly veiled as anti-Zionism in modern day America, we must pay attention to the ways in which "everything old is new again." Just as Arthur Miller wrote *The Crucible* to engage modern audiences about McCarthyism in his day, a new play written by the award winning playwright Jenny Lyn Bader entitled *Mrs. Stern Wanders the Prussian State Library speaks* to ours. Unlike Miller's Salem of 1692, this gripping drama is set in 1933 Berlin, and the only accused subject is a graduate student denounced by a librarian for copying antisemitic materials for foreign



distribution. Alarmed by the rise of antisemitism, Hannah

became associated with a group of Zionist activists and conducted research in the Prussian State Library in Berlin—research which was illegal under martial law at that time. Inspired by

real events, this play offers a deep dive into the life and mind of Arendt, exploring themes of power, resistance, and the cost of standing up for one's beliefs. Regretfully, many of these issues remain prescient and dangerous.

After its critically acclaimed Off-Broadway run, "Mrs. Stern" (Arendt married Günther Stern in 1929) transferred to Luna Stage, a small theater in West Orange, NJ., I encourage you to join me and other members of the Jewish community of Orange County in experiencing this play on its final performance on Sunday November 9 at **3pm**. I have arranged to have an audience Q & A session with the playwright after the performance. The Luna Stage is committed to ensuring that ALL can have access to professional theatre performances and arts education! This is why there is a sliding scale for ticket prices. If you are able to do so you can pay the suggested price of \$50 per ticket, half-off for \$25, or even \$15 for an older adult matinee.

America's first great organized-crime lord was a lady—a nice Jewish mother named Mrs. Mandelbaum.

A Jewish mother of four, a gracious society hostess, a beloved member of her community—and the first widely renowned crime boss in America, Fredericka Mandelbaum traveled to New York in 1850 in steerage and worked as a breddler on the streets of Lower Manhattan. By the 1870s she was a widow with four children, a fixture of high society, and an admired philanthropist. What had enabled a woman on the margins of American life to ascend from tenement poverty to immense wealth?






