

Jewish Federations thank Rep. Ryan for continued work to free hostages still held by Hamas, including American citizens and the families of Hudson Valley residents.

KINGSTON, NY, January 17, 2024- Just over 100 days since Hamas's brutal attack on Israel, representatives from the Jewish Federations of Dutchess, Orange, and Ulster Counties presented Rep. Pat Ryan and his staff with a thank you letter, with nearly 400 local signatures, for his ardent support of Israel's right to exist, his ongoing fight against antisemitism, and his continued efforts to free hostages still held by Hamas, including American citizens and Hudson Valley residents. The Jewish Federations peacefully presented their thank you letter at Rep. Ryan's Kingston office, which was besieged by anti-Israel protestors nearly two weeks ago.







#### UJF Announces Creation of the Lilly Reiser Scholarship

United Jewish Federation of Stamford, New Canaan, and Darien (UJF) announces the creation of the Lilly Reiser Scholarship; \$10,000 college scholarships per year for nine Jewish students from Connecticut and New York. Awards will be based on a combination of both need and merit.

Lilly E. Reiser (1924-2020) was born in the small town of Moravska-Ostrava in the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic (now the Czech Republic). Having suffered the inhumanity and indignity of forced labor and internment during the Holocaust at Theresienstadt, Auschwitz, and Bergen-Belson, Lilly was eventually liberated from Bergen-Belson by British soldiers. She emigrated to the United States in 1945 and was only able to obtain her degrees because of the generosity of various Jewish communal organizations, that provided her with the scholarships necessary to do so.

Lilly completed her undergraduate education at Hunter College and went on to achieve a graduate degree from Columbia University's New York School of Social Work. She proudly served as a social worker in the New York City Public School for over 50 years. Ever thankful for the financial support she received from the organized Jewish community, Lilly wanted to provide similar support to deserving and financially challenged students of Jewish faith.

"I can't think of a more special way to honor Lilly's memory, than by honoring her wishes to assist young Jews achieve their academic dreams like she did," said Eric Ross, UJF Deputy Director.






Jewish Family Service-Support for Holocaust Survivors is collecting the following items, below.


