



Wishing you all a safe, happy, healthy new year, as we approach the High Holidays of 5786.



## Rabbi's Blog

Dear Friends,

Life is filled with seemingly opposing dichotomies: true and false, science and religion, caring for oneself or caring for one's neighbor, red and blue politics, and many more.

Commonly, we either take positions, or equivocate between poles when we face demanding, dichotomized conditions. It is not easy to serve two, apparently distinct truths.

The Talmudic rabbis called this situation a machloket – a situation of two opposing truths. Our task, they taught, was to recognize and validate them both, and choose between them, if necessary.



Hence, as we approach the coming High Holy Days – the Yamim Nora'im – the Days of Awe, we encounter a basic theme of this season: the conflict of God's might and God's mercy.

Every time that we open the Ark and rise for Avinu Malkeinu, we face this tension. Is God primarily the powerful arbiter of our lives, the one who metes out reward and punishment for our deeds? Or, is God the gentle nurturer of our souls, the one who mercifully engenders atonement and offers second chances for our misdeeds?

Essentially, can God be Almighty and Mercifully simultaneously? Are they mutually exclusive? Or, does might become awesome in the context of seeking mercy, and does mercy become kindly when facing the possibility of might? Perhaps, the two qualities of God are in fact interdependent?

It is akin to good cop/bad cop. The two behaviors require measures of the other in order to be effective.

In is a powerful scene in Schindler's List, Oskar Schindler encounters Amon Goth, the Nazi commander of the Plaszow Concentration Camp, randomly shooting Jewish inmates from his porch. Schindler confronted Goth, urging him to show mercy because he had the ultimate power to kill someone. Goth corrected Schindler, saying that ultimate power was the power to allow someone to live.

The bad cop is only empowered because there is the opposite possibility.

Approaching the High Holy Days, we see again how nuanced the world truly is. Reviewing our lives, we see that which makes us proud, and that which makes us cringe. Like God, we have our own, inner dichotomies. Our lives are living machlokot – competing truths. It is best that we not dwell on only one side, nor recognize only one, but that we entertain awareness of all of our being. Only then can we truly face ourselves, and make our lives into blessings.

The Art of Presence: Listening Beyond Words

In our dedicated work as volunteers, we often focus on the tangible aspects: transportation to doctor appointments or assistance with grocery shopping. Yet, two of our most profound contributions lie in the seemingly simple, yet deeply skilled, acts of active listening and the power of presence. For trained volunteers and caregivers also, these aren't just soft skills; they are cornerstones of truly impactful support.

Active listening with older adults, especially those navigating memory challenges or complex life stories, goes far beyond merely hearing words. It means tuning into the nuances of their tone, observing subtle non-verbal cues, and understanding the emotions behind repeated narratives.

When a senior recounts a story for the fifth time, our trained response isn't just polite acknowledgment, but a genuine effort to understand what feeling or memory they are trying to express. Validating their experience, even if the details shift, builds trust and honors their lived history. It's about creating a space where they feel genuinely heard and valued.

This profound listening is intrinsically linked to the power of presence. In a world that often rushes by, simply "being there," consistently, calmly, and without judgment, can be the most significant gift we offer. It's the quiet comfort of a shared silence, the steady hand, the knowing glance. Sometimes, there are no tasks to complete, no words that need to be spoken.

Our presence alone helps combat the pervasive loneliness many seniors face, creating a safe and reliable anchor in their day. It assures them they are not forgotten, their well-being matters, and that a caring neighbor is indeed there.

Together, active listening and authentic presence transform routine visits into meaningful connections, fostering dignity and enhancing the quality of life for those we serve. These are the unsung victories that truly define our program.
