What is the aim of the National Mission?

The National Mission will offer an inspiring, fun-filled, educational, and immersive experience in Israel, connecting you to the land and people of Israel and deepening your understanding of the different populations and cultures that contribute to Israel's diverse society.

What makes the National Mission different from a regular tourist experience?

The experience will take you off the beaten track, introducing you to individuals and communities that you'd never get to know otherwise. Hear firsthand about their history and customs, achievements, and struggles, and how their personal story interfaces with the national story still being written.

Will there be some opportunities to just have some fun Israeli-style?

As a Mission participant, you'll do it all. Treat your tastebuds to a wide range of Israeli cuisine, get your feet tapping to Israeli music, interact with Israeli locals, and even pick up some Israeli phrases and the latest slang.

Do I need to be part of a specific group to come on the mission?

Nope. You can travel with a cohort of friends and leaders from your community, solo, with family members, or as a pair – whatever suits you best. (Tip of the Day: The National Mission is also a great opportunity to meet with other Federation leaders, build meaningful connections, make new friends, and strengthen your bond with the North American Jewish community.)

Will there be opportunities to see some of the actual work Federation is doing in Israel?

Absolutely. On the National Mission, you'll spend time with Federation partners and experience firsthand the impact of projects by other Federation-supported organizations. You'll gain an on-the-ground understanding of the vital work we do in Israel and the importance of your support.

What about opportunities to explore Judaism more deeply?

The mission will include meaningful encounters with the multiple faces and expressions of Judaism – plus a very special Shabbat experience together in Tel Aviv!

I want to participate in the National Mission and the General Assembly; how will that work?

Great –that’s exactly the plan! The National Mission will flow into the General Assembly experience (North America’s premier Jewish leadership conference), where you’ll join with hundreds of Federation peers and leaders to set our communal agenda for the year ahead.

Day 1: Wednesday, April 19

Theme: Bruchim Habaim! Welcome to Israel, with Federation!

Welcome to Israel! The General Assembly National Mission is a great opportunity to travel with other Federation leaders, build meaningful connections, and strengthen your bond with the North American Jewish community. The mission will kick off with a welcome dinner in true Israeli style. You’ll have the opportunity to meet your fellow travelers and start to build new friendships from across the Federations system and enjoy the world-renowned Tel Aviv night life.

The mission will begin on Wednesday evening. Participants should plan to arrive in Tel Aviv at 3:00PM on Wednesday to check in to their hotels and settle in. JFNA will provide transportation from the airport to your hotel.

Visit Judaism's holiest location, the Western Wall in Jerusalem and then let your spirit soar with an authentic Israeli Kabbalat Shabbat (welcoming of Shabbat) at sunset in Tel Aviv.

Day 6: Monday, April 24

Israel at 75 General Assembly

Take part in a day-long gathering to explore key issues facing the global Jewish community in 2023 together with leaders and partners from North America, Israel and around the world.

Location: Expo Tel Aviv International Convention Center

In the evening, we will observe Yom Ha'Zikaron, Israel's Memorial Day, with a special experience at Latrun, the site of fierce fighting during the 1948 War of Independence. This evening is hosted by MASA Israel Journey, which provides long-term immersive experiences for thousands of young Diaspora Jews every year. We will join thousands of current MASA participants for this special event that transitions us into Israel's most somber day of the year.

Day 7: Tuesday, April 25

Israel at 75 General Assembly

Yom Ha'Zikaron continues, we will join a Mifgash ("Encounter") in small groups of General Assembly participants, guided by Israeli educators, former Schlichim, and others. Groups will take part in ceremonies to honor the fallen and engage in a series of conversations designed to convey the special meaning of this solemn day for their Israeli counterparts.

In the evening, we will shift to celebrating Yom Ha'Atzmaut, Israel's 75th Birthday, with a mega Yom Ha'Atzmaut event open to all!
