#### 3. Who is eligible for CEs through NASW? Are CEs available for other disciplines?

#### 4. How do I receive CEs for the course?

To successfully complete the course, you must review all required written and video content, complete the required assignments, and obtain a score of 80% or higher on all four assessments. You may attempt the assessments as many times as you would like.
