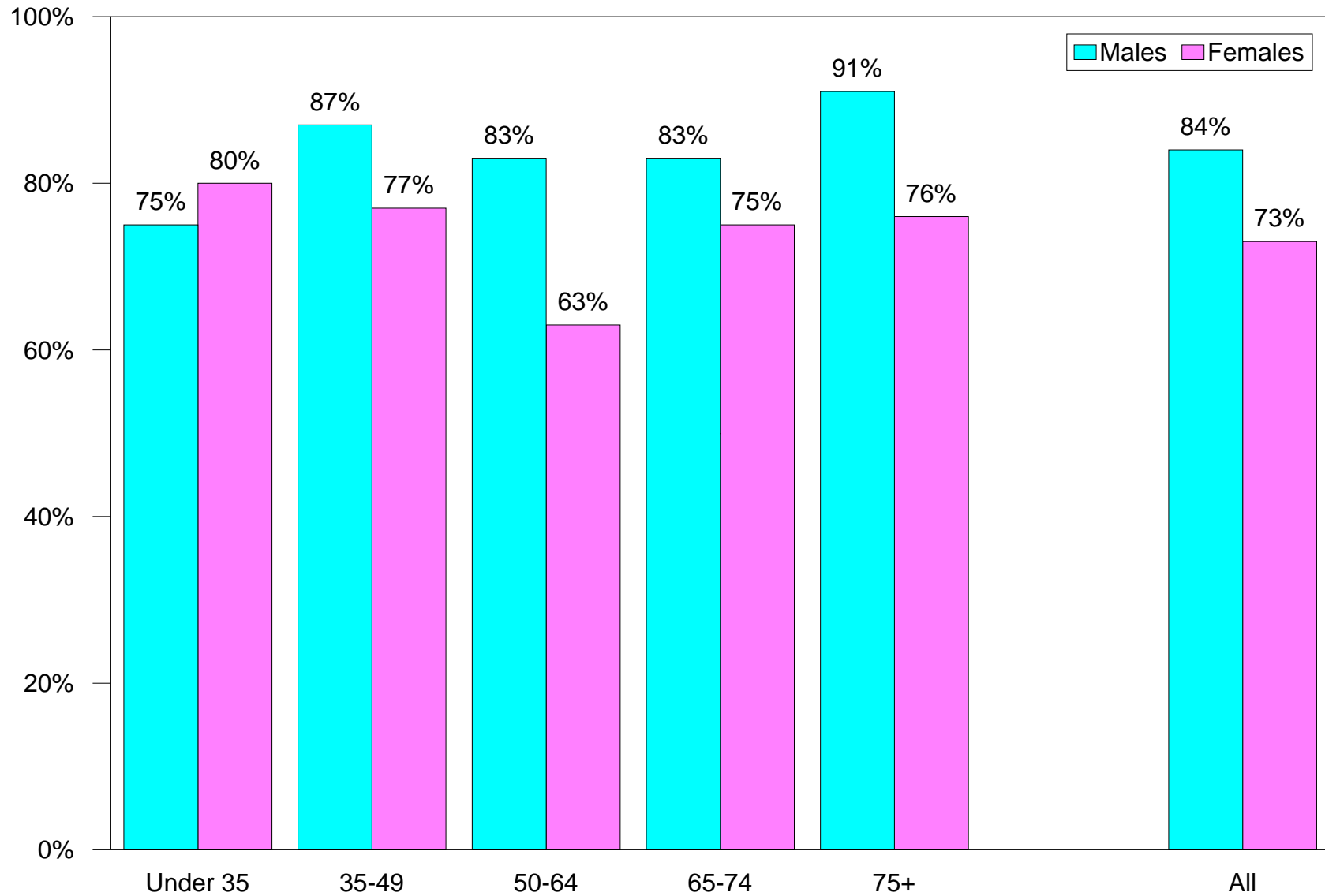
Received Some Formal Jewish Education as a Child

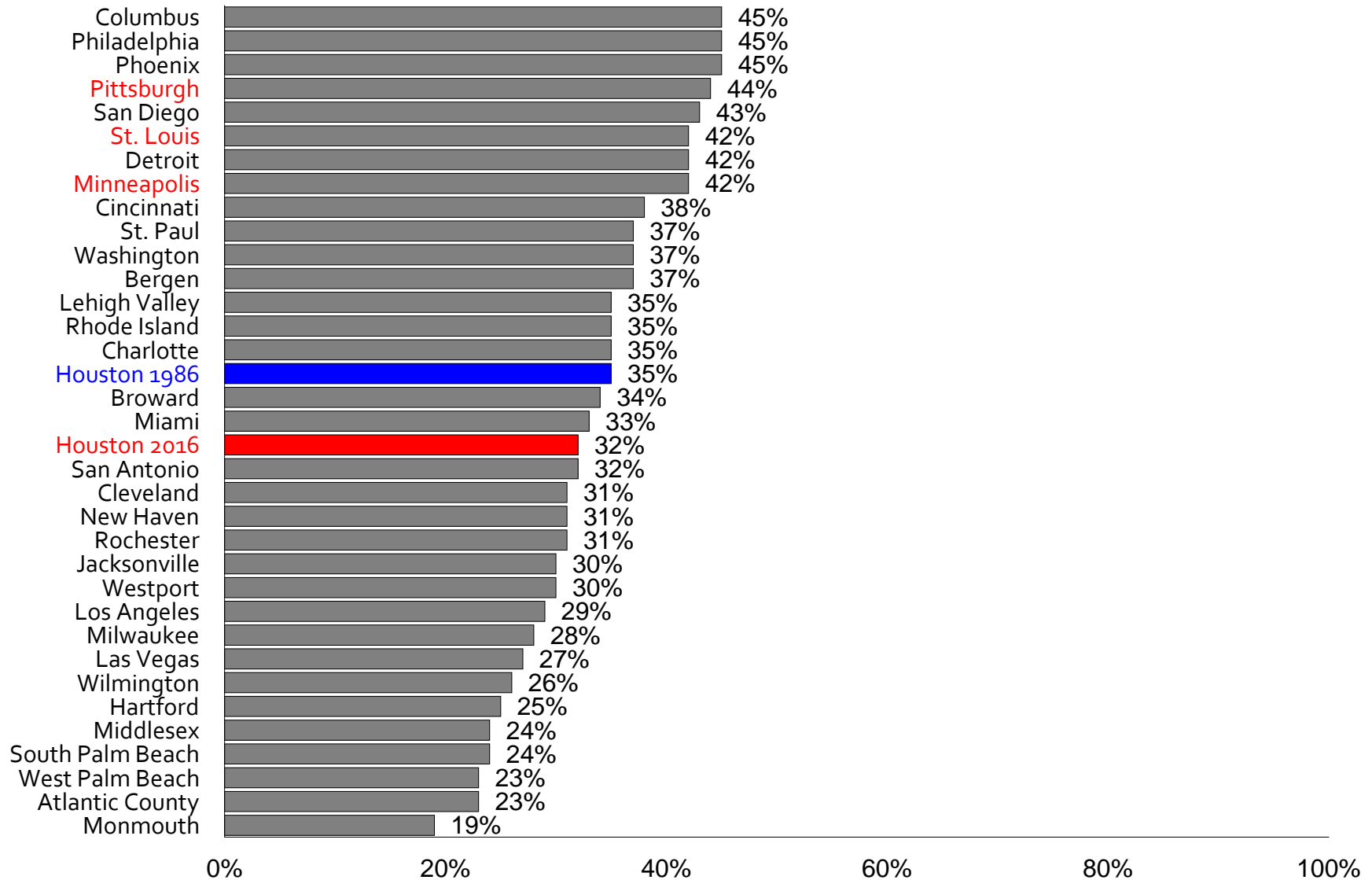
Households in Which The Respondent Received Some Formal Jewish Education as a Child

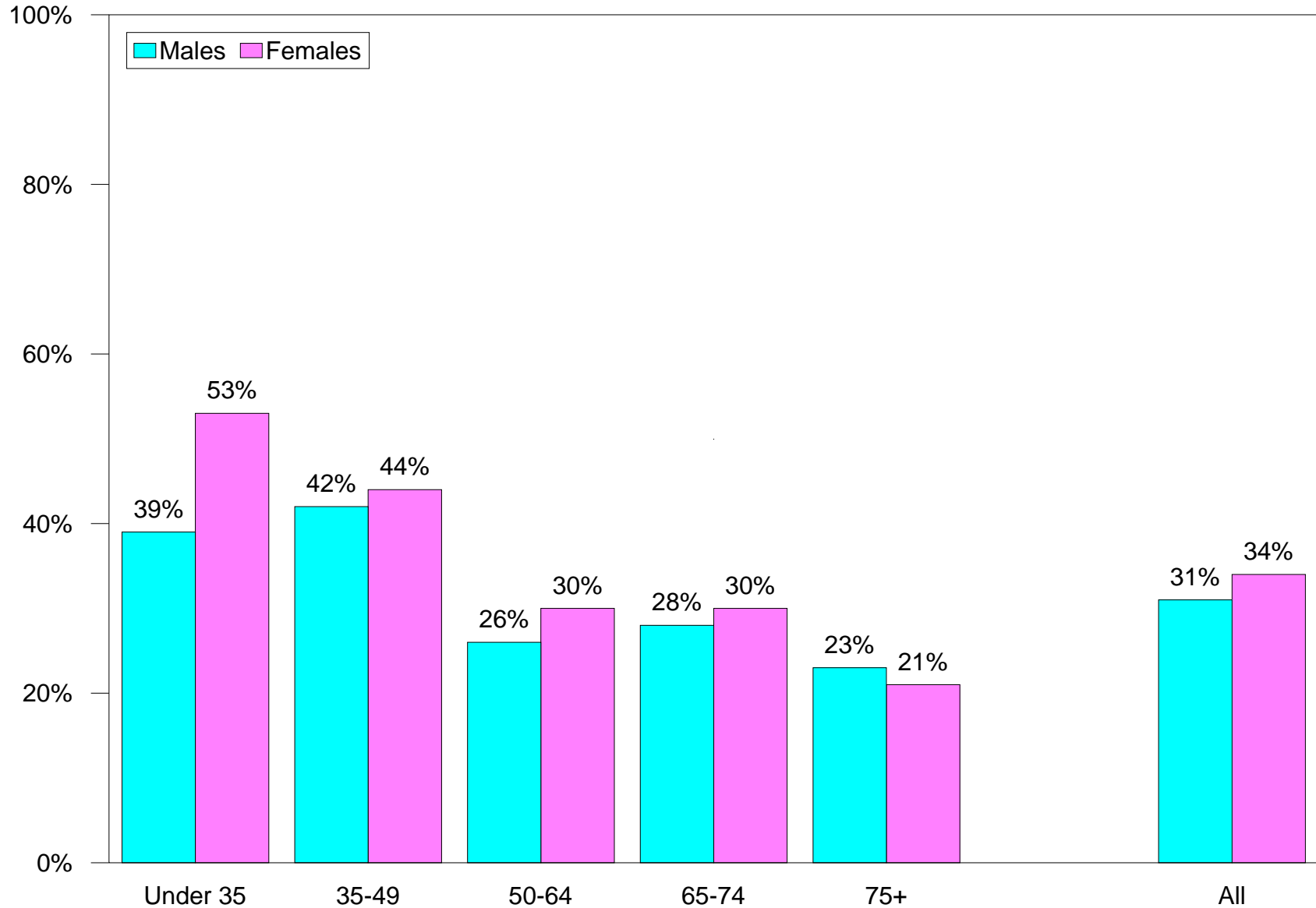

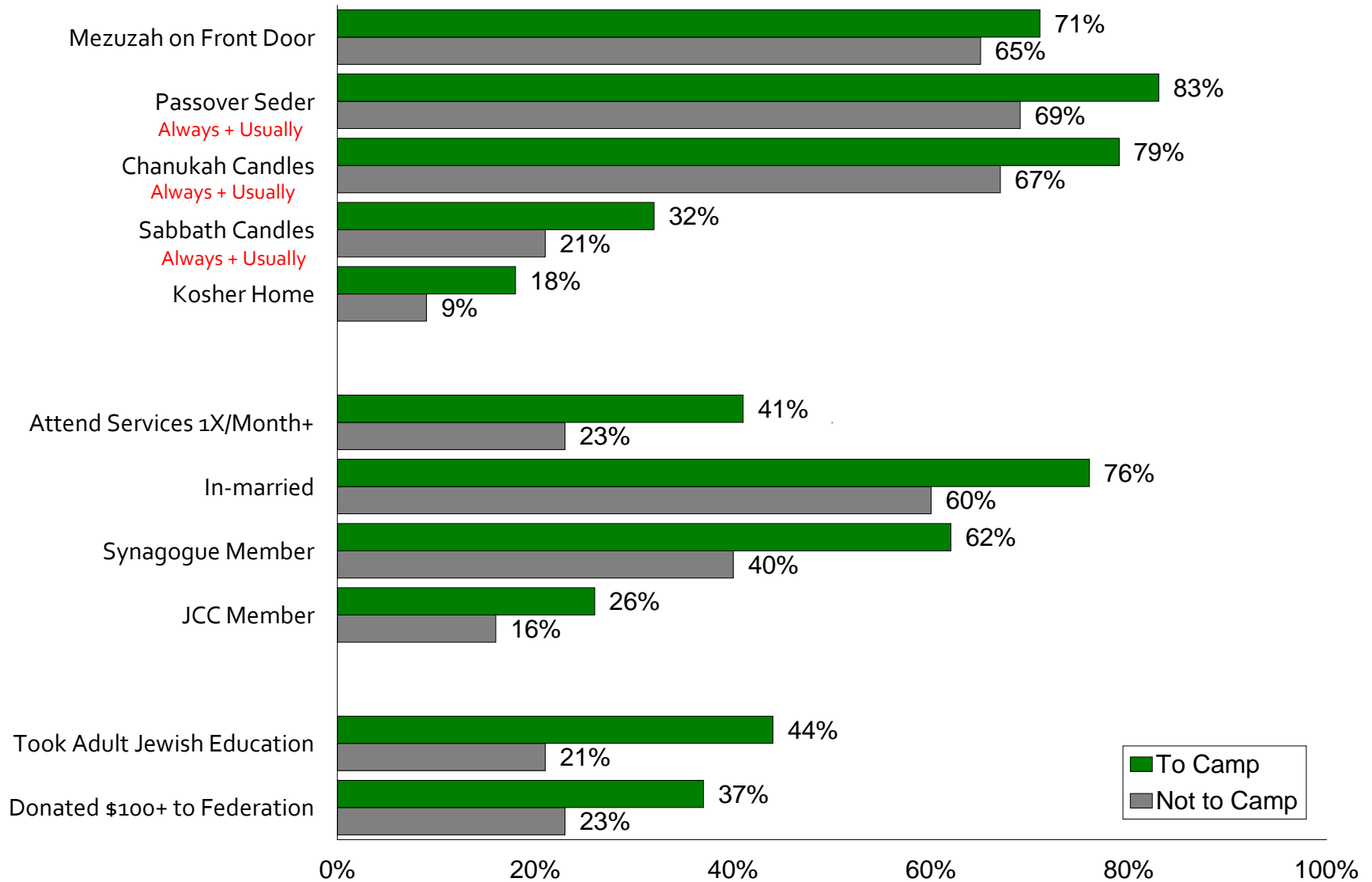
Attended or Worked at a Jewish Overnight Camp as a Child by Age

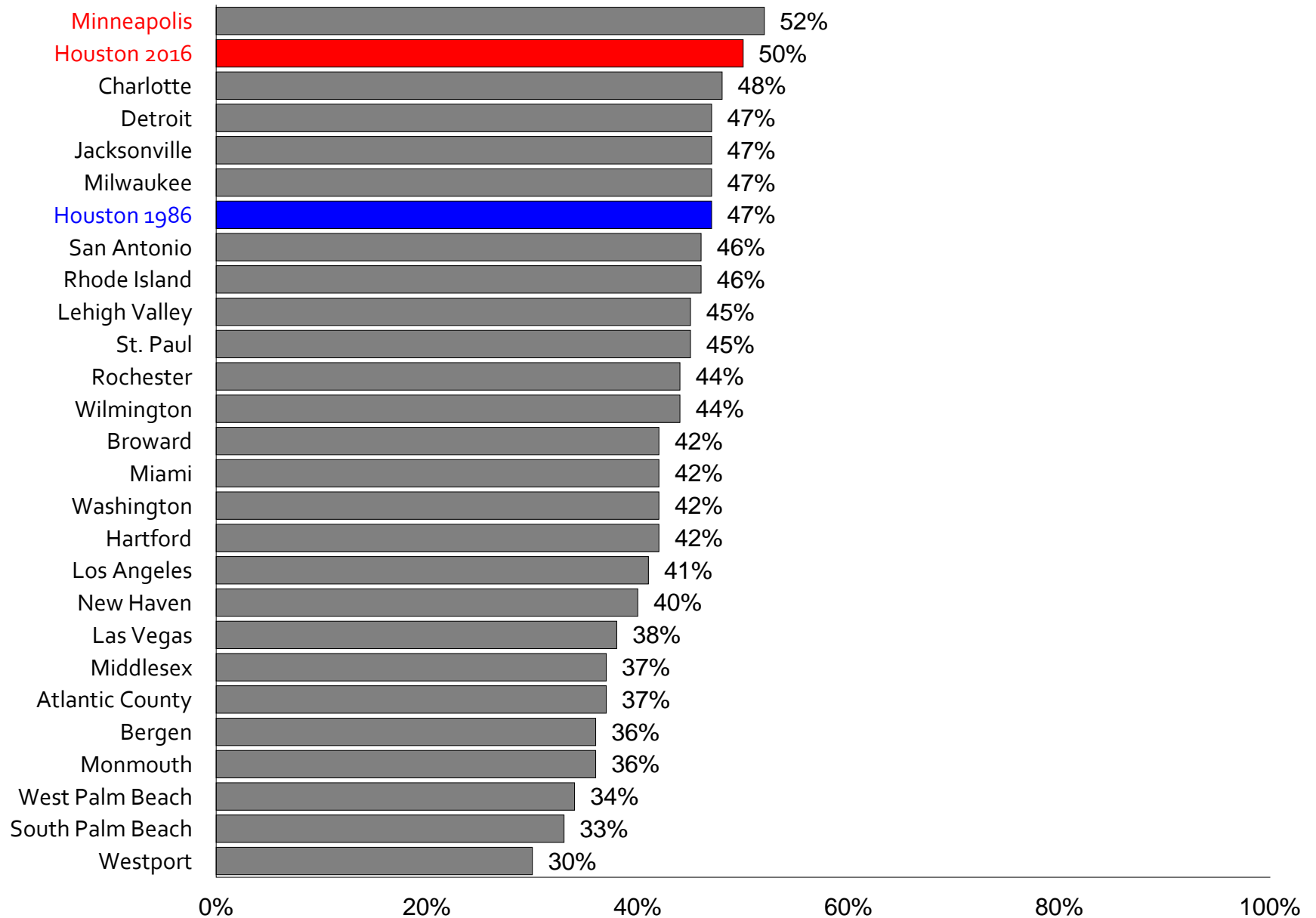

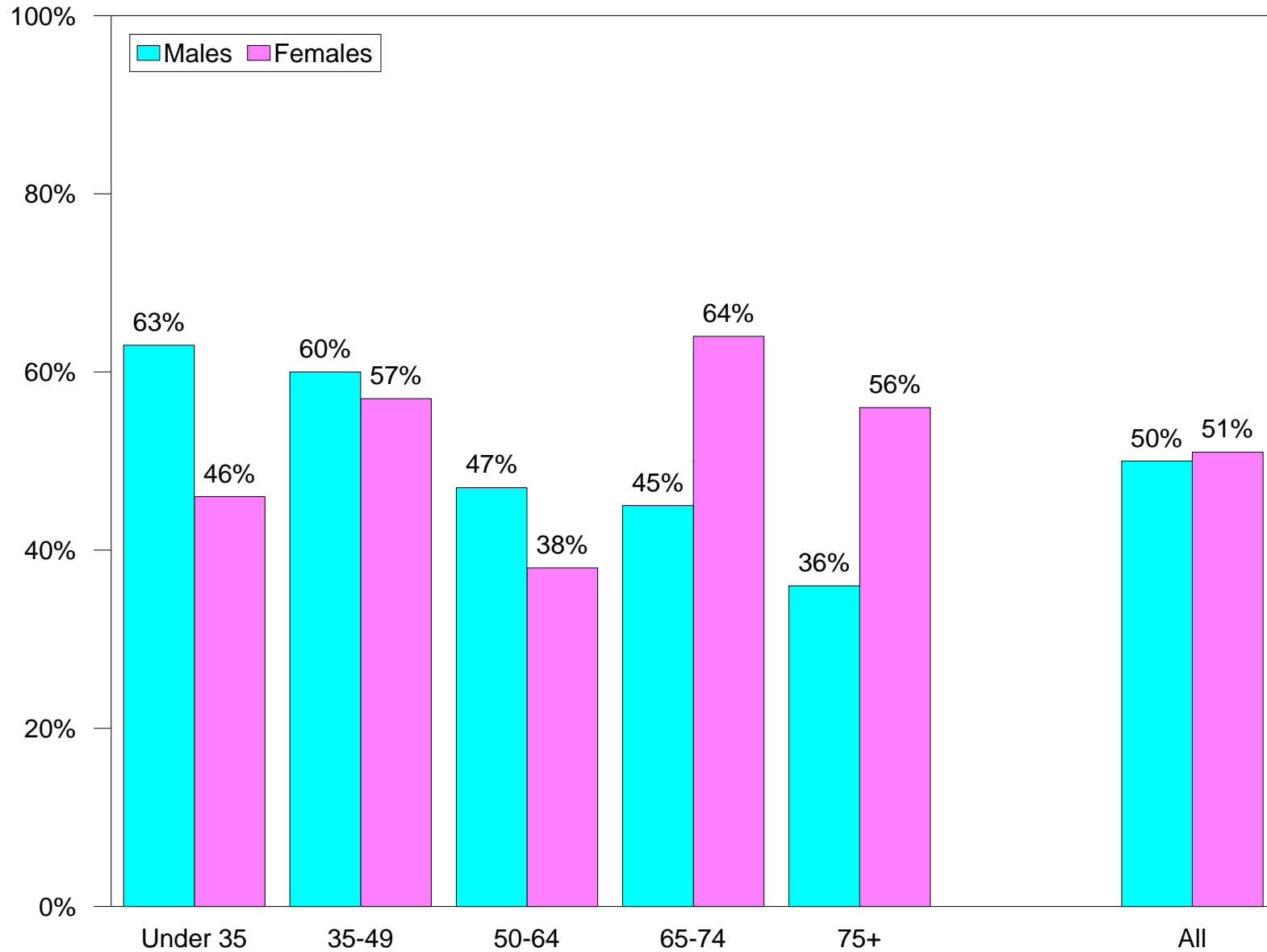

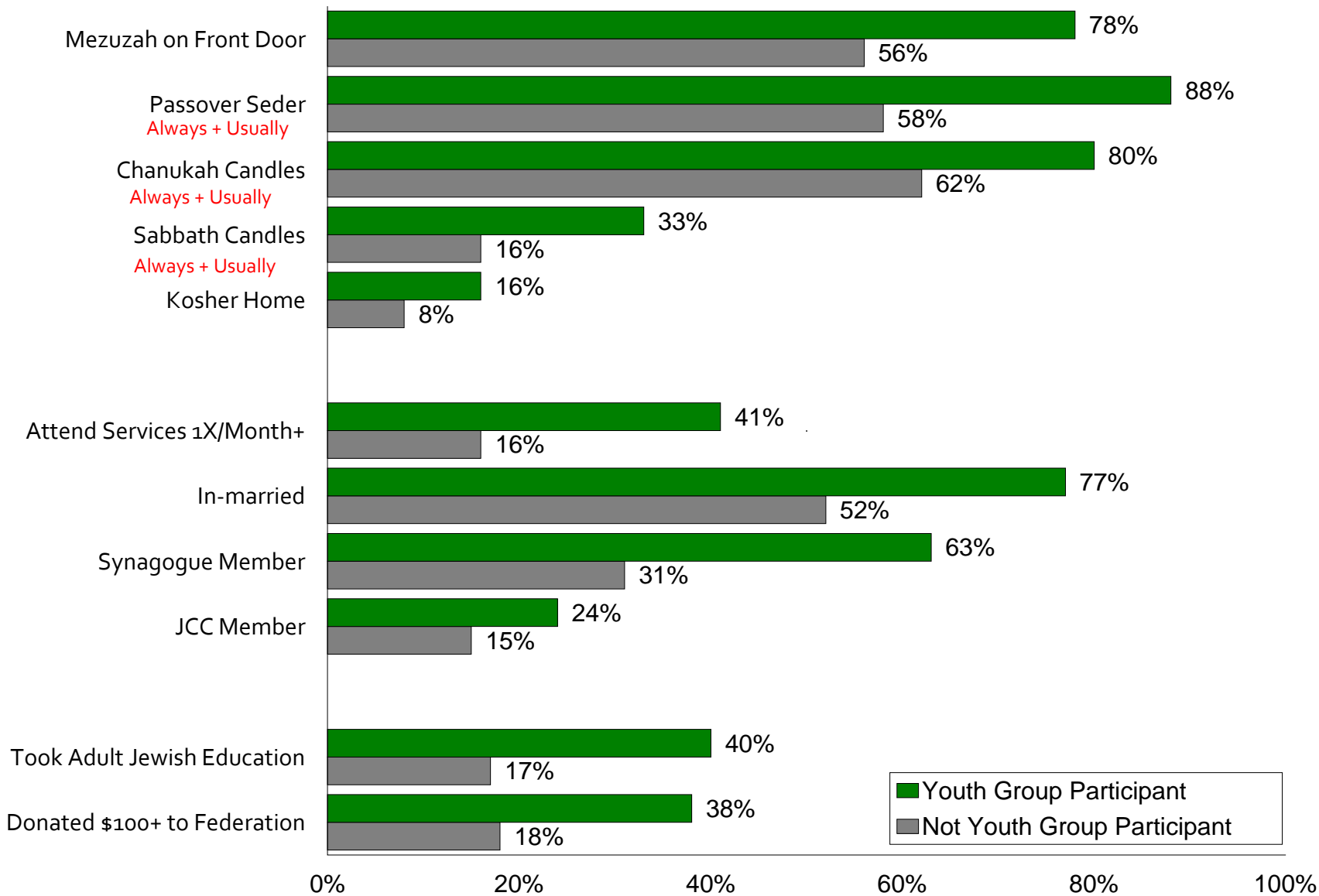

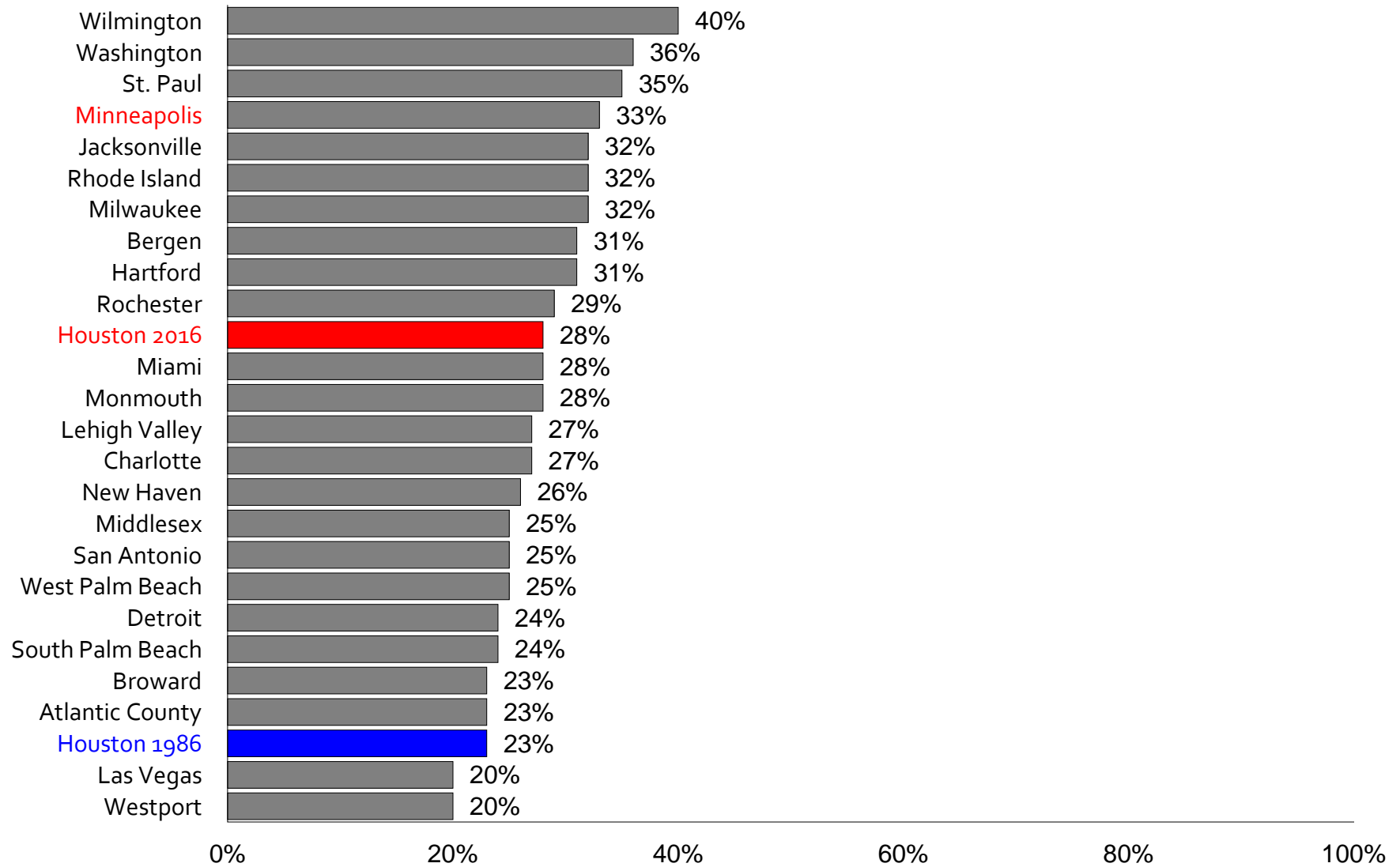

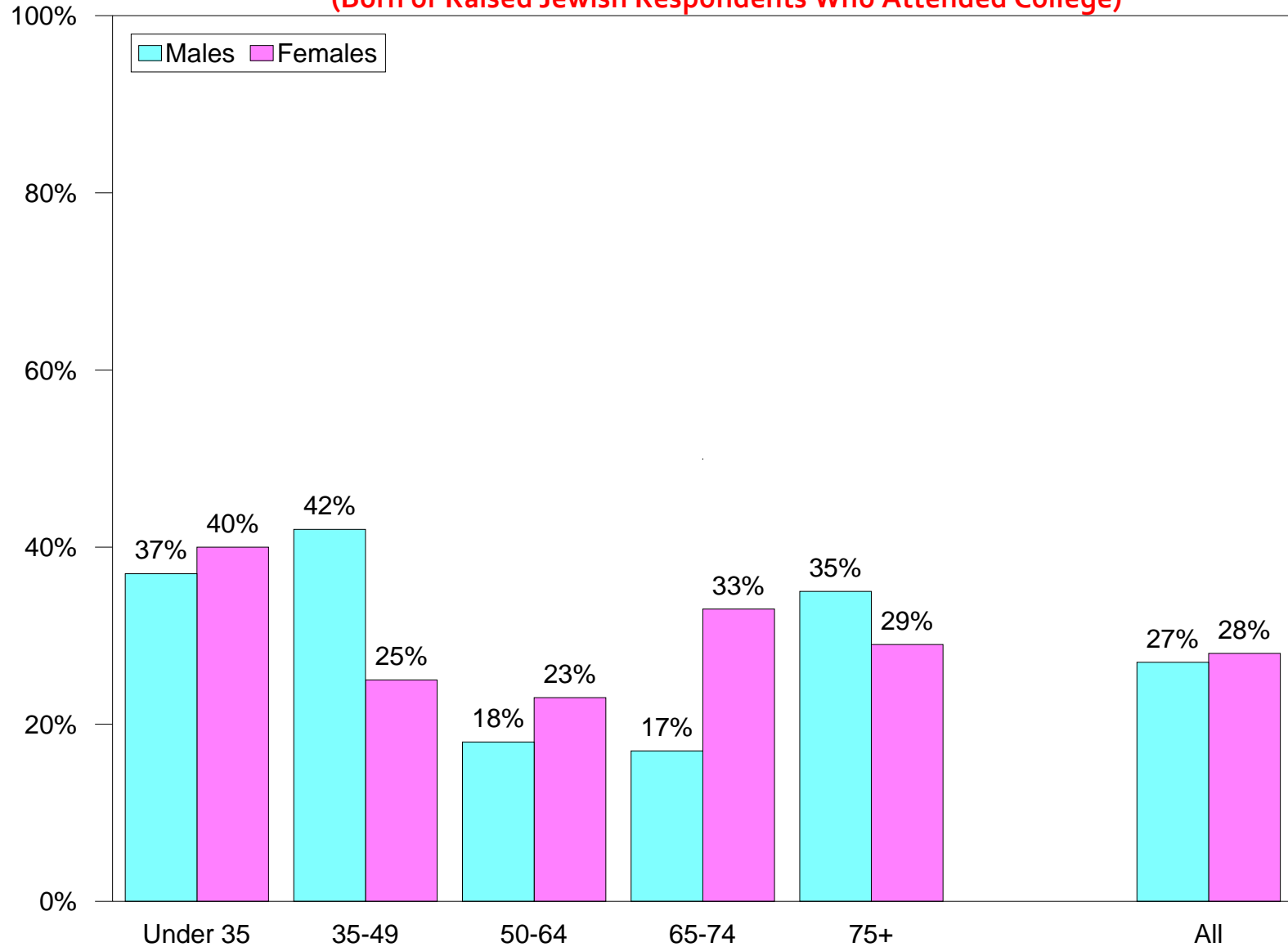

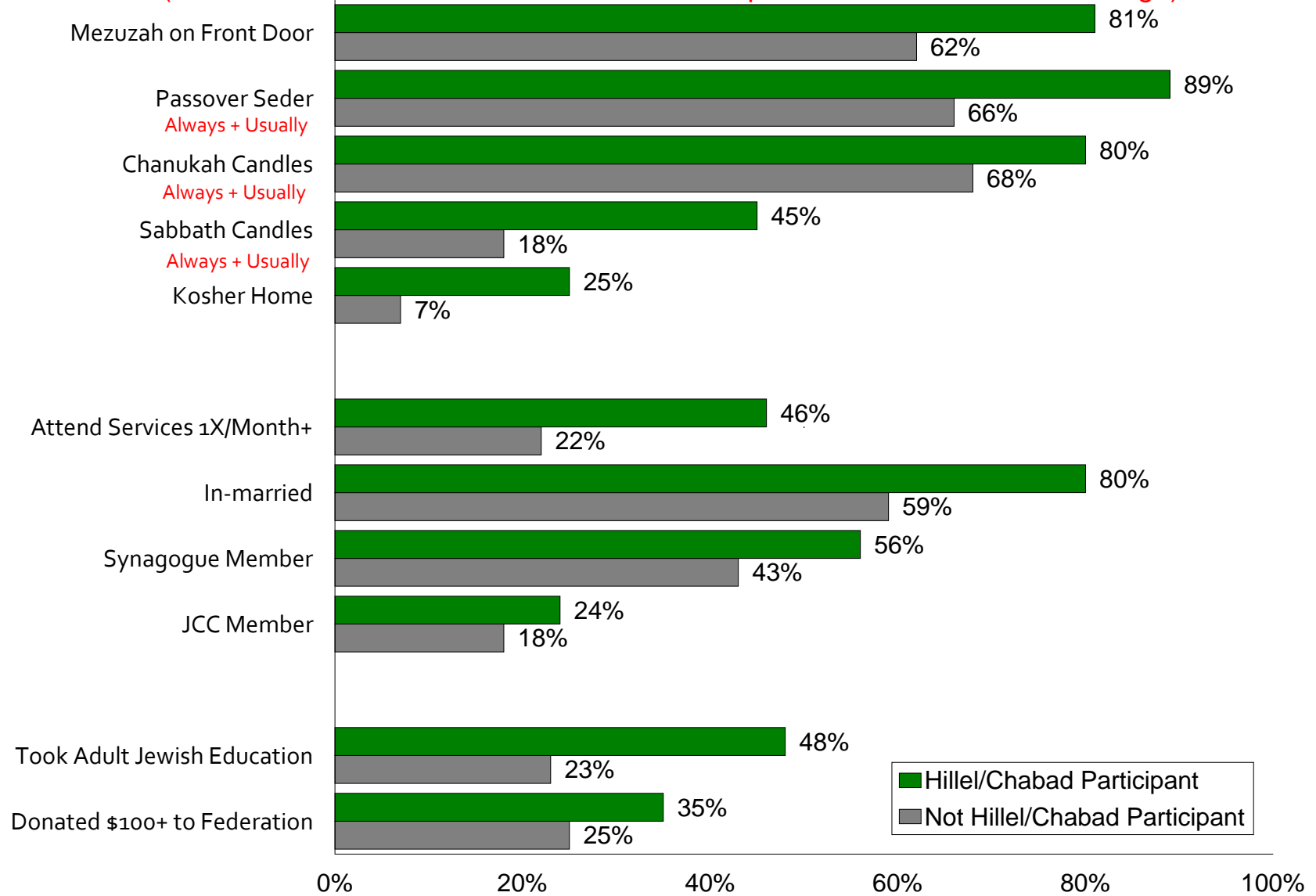

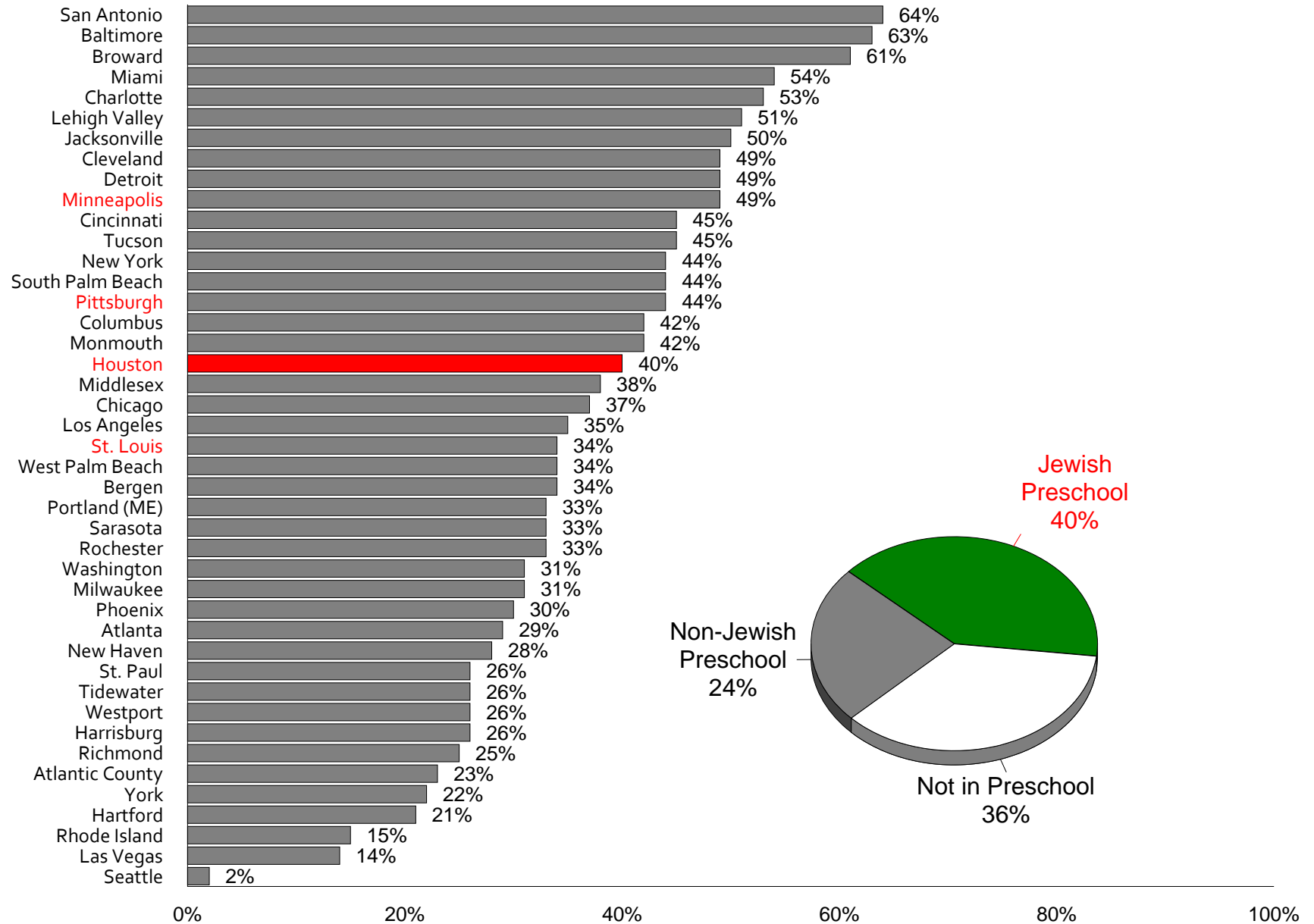

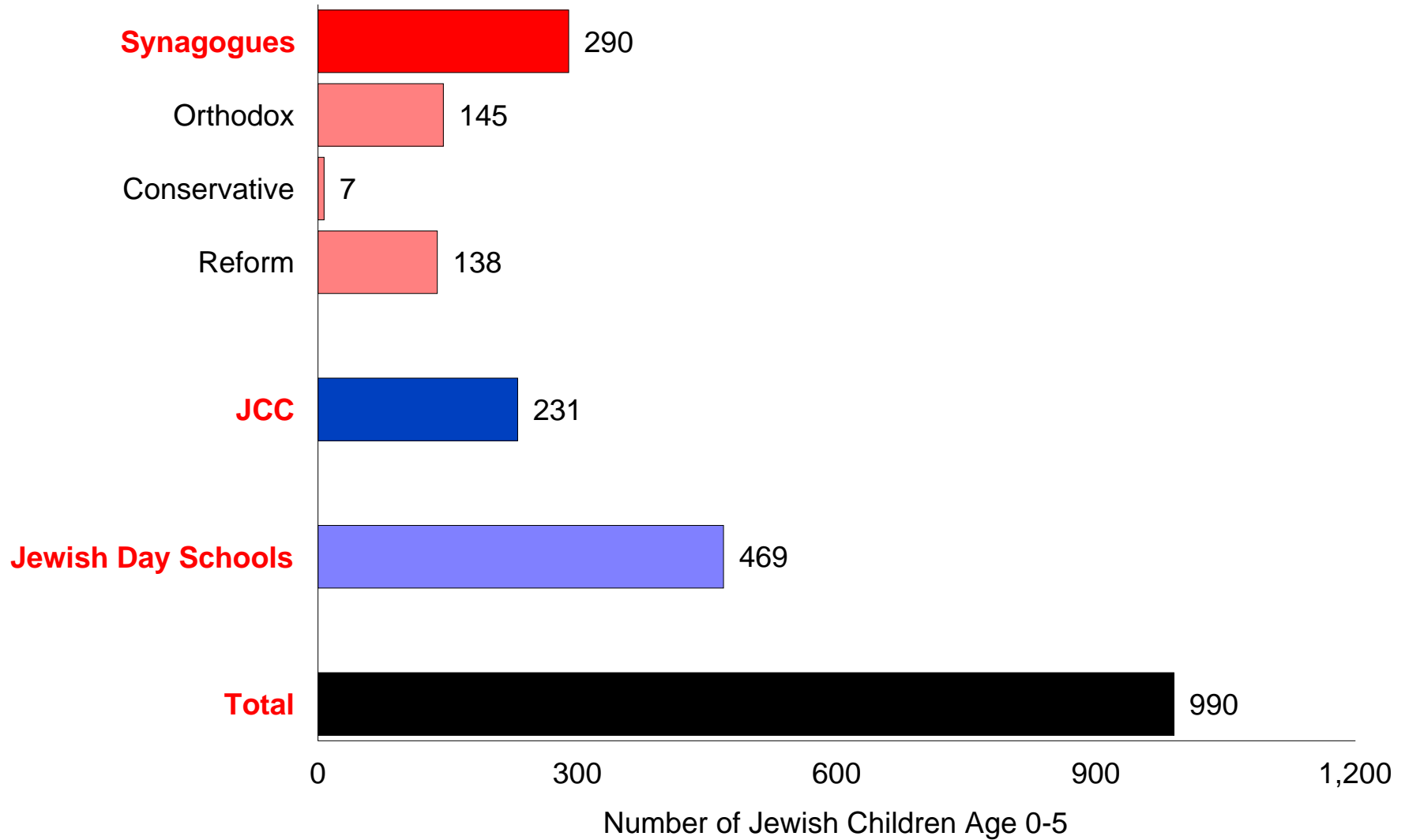

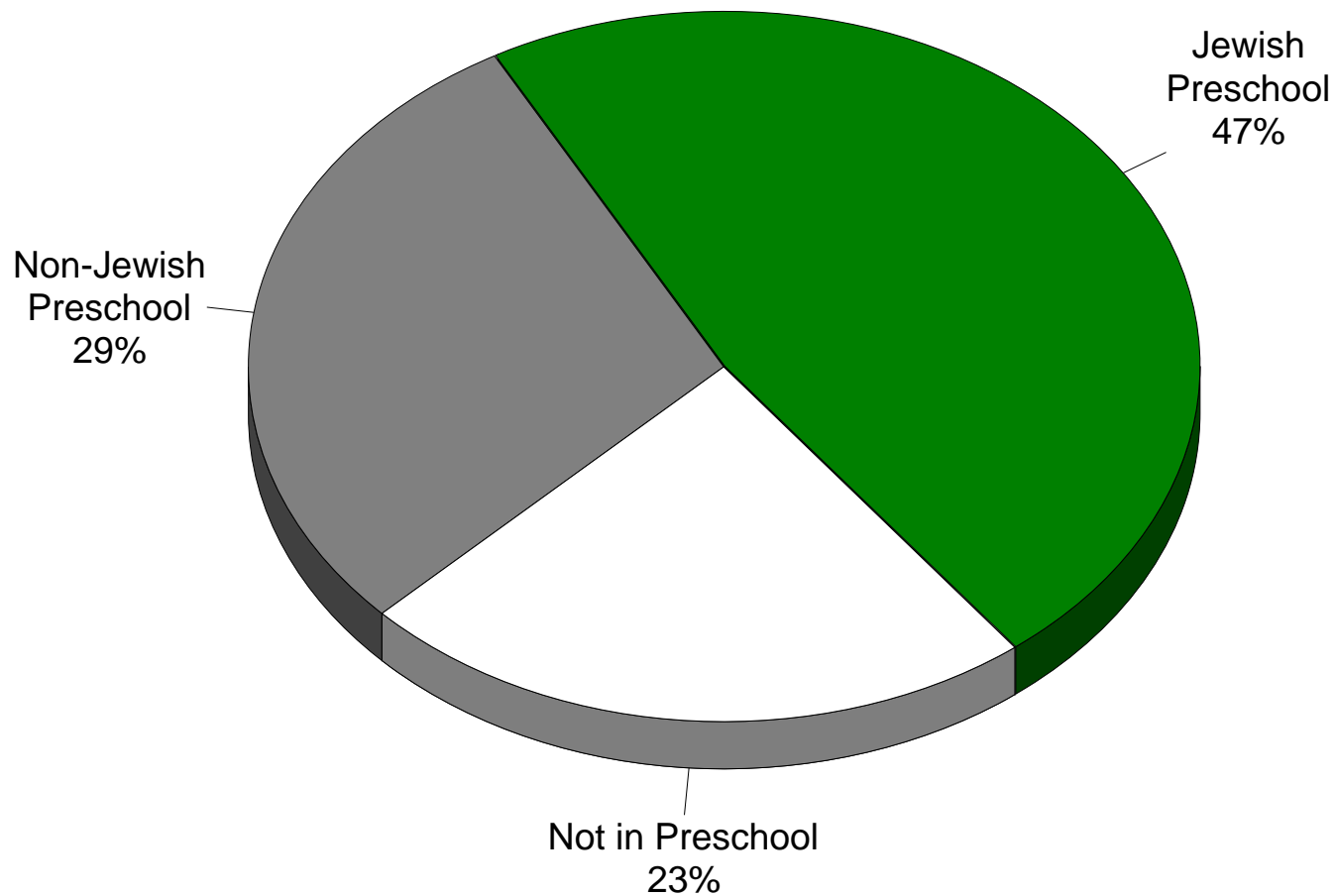

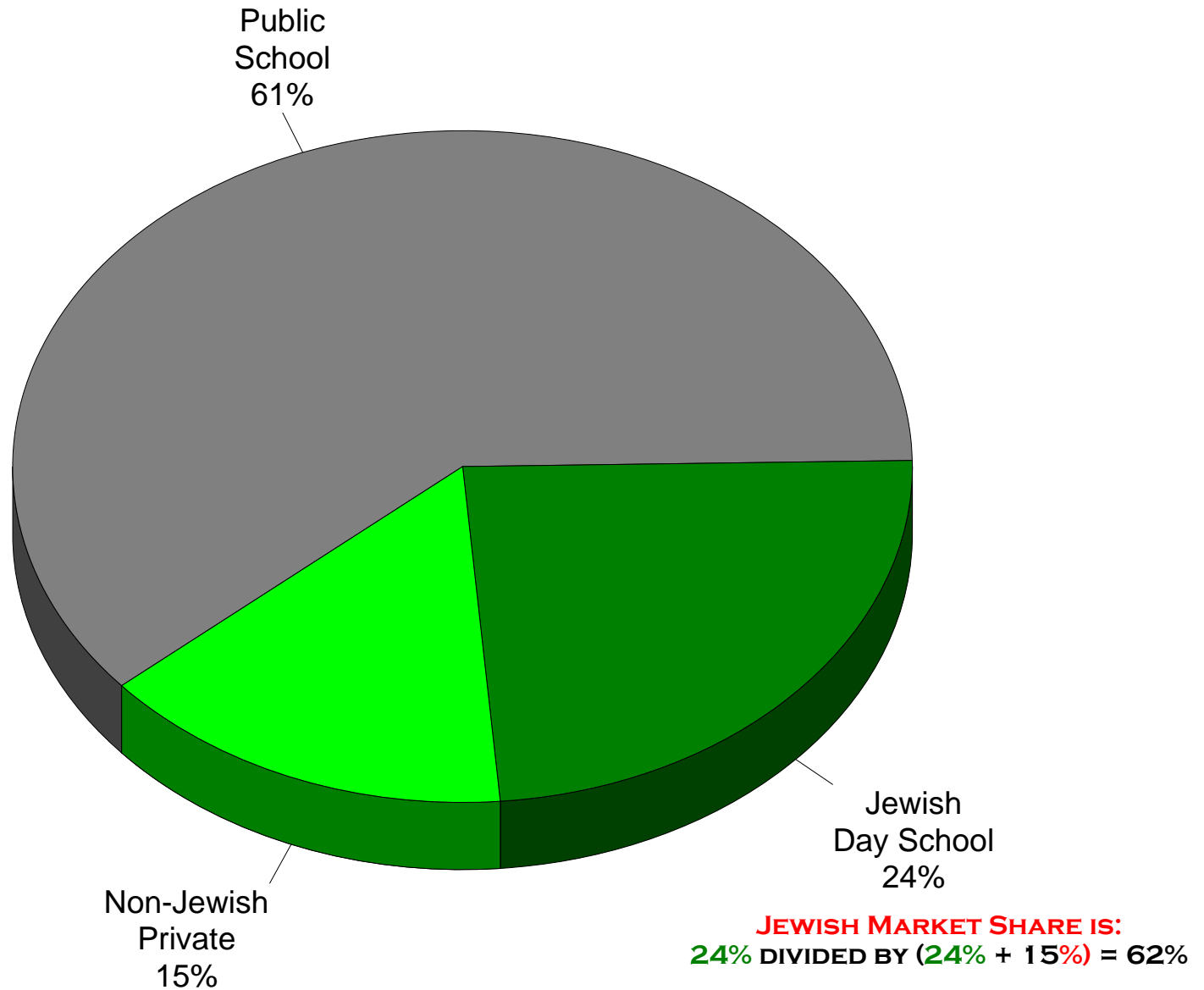
Market Share for Jewish Day School

(Jewish Children Age 5-17)

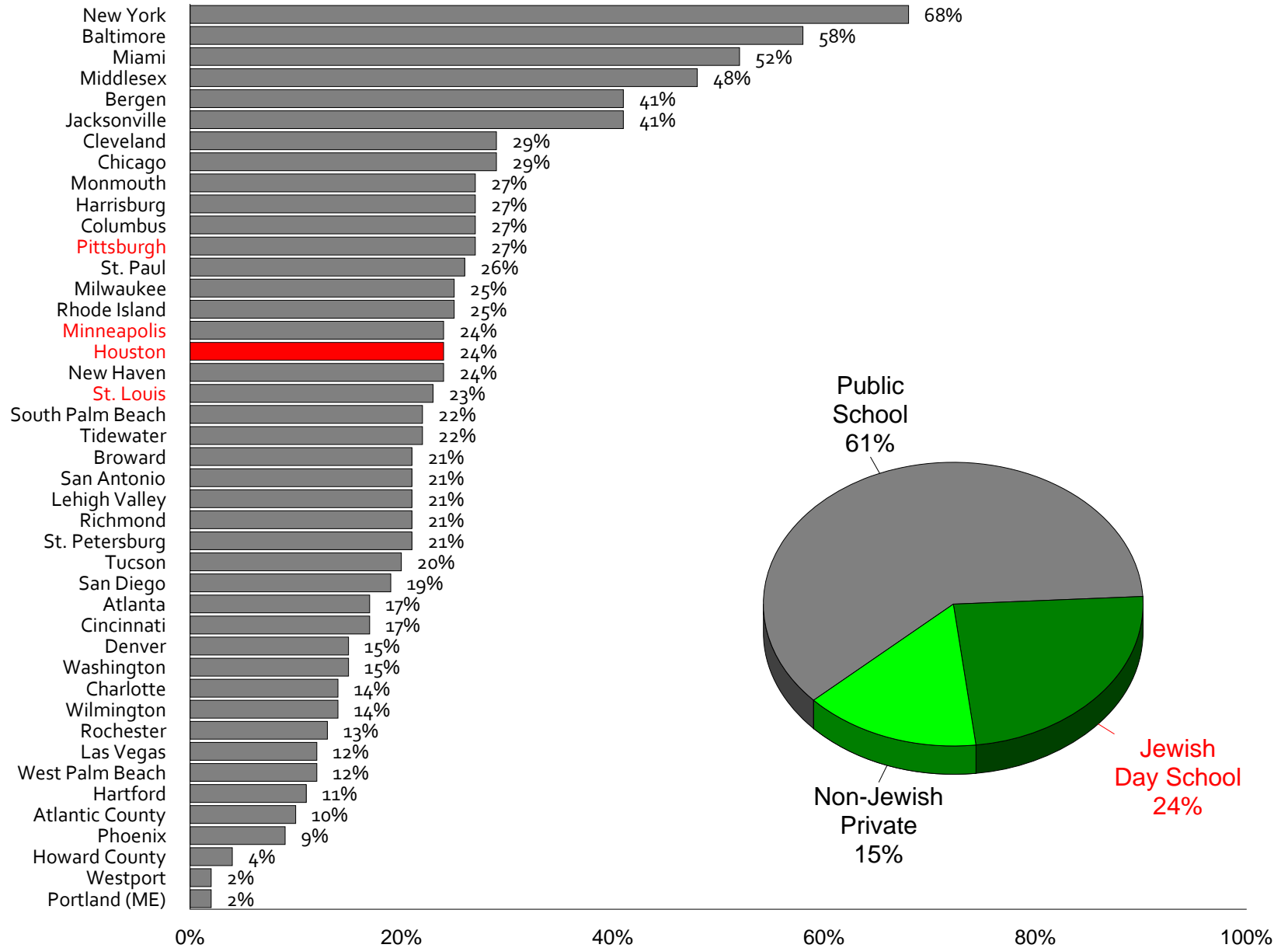

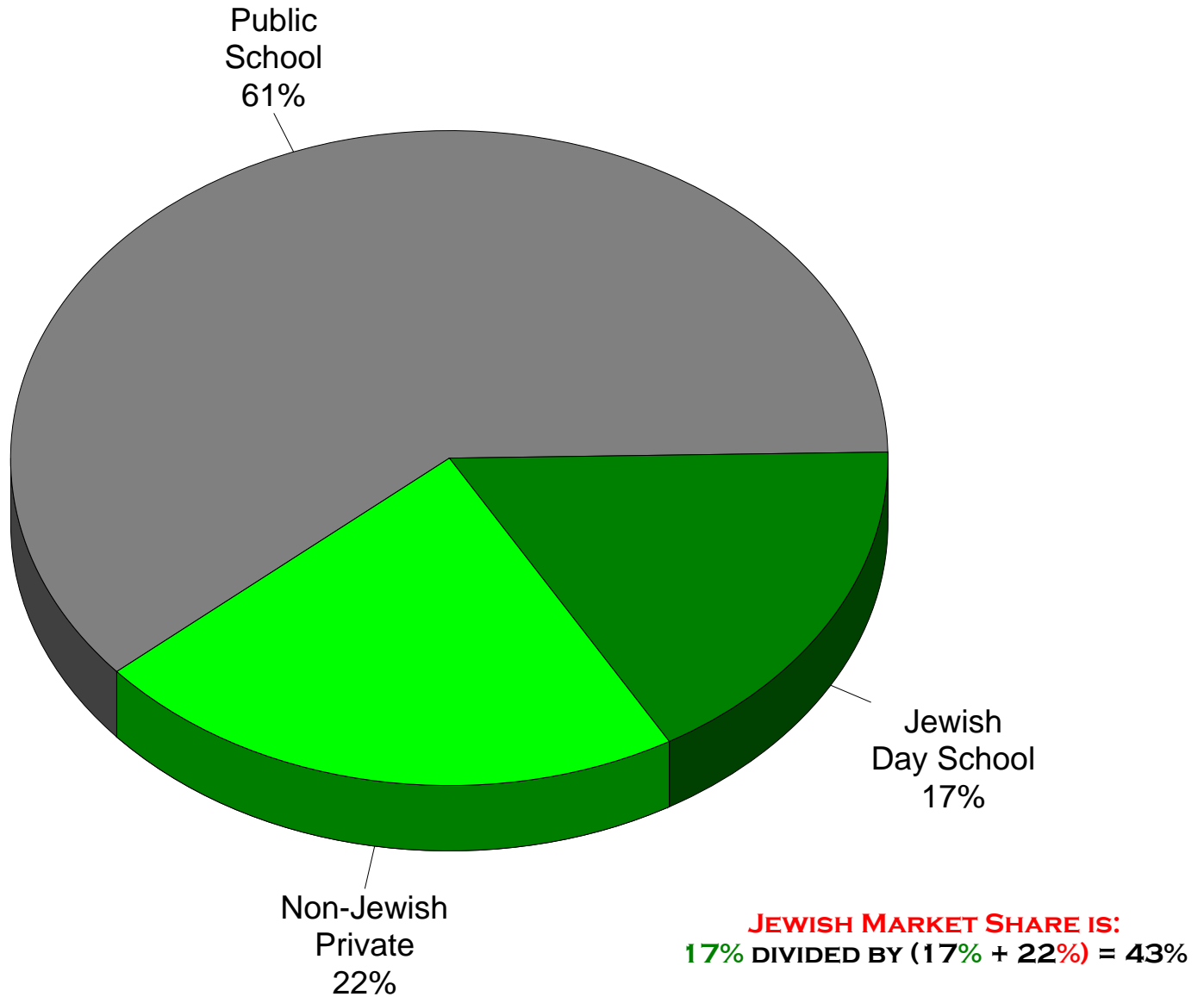
Market Share for Jewish Day School

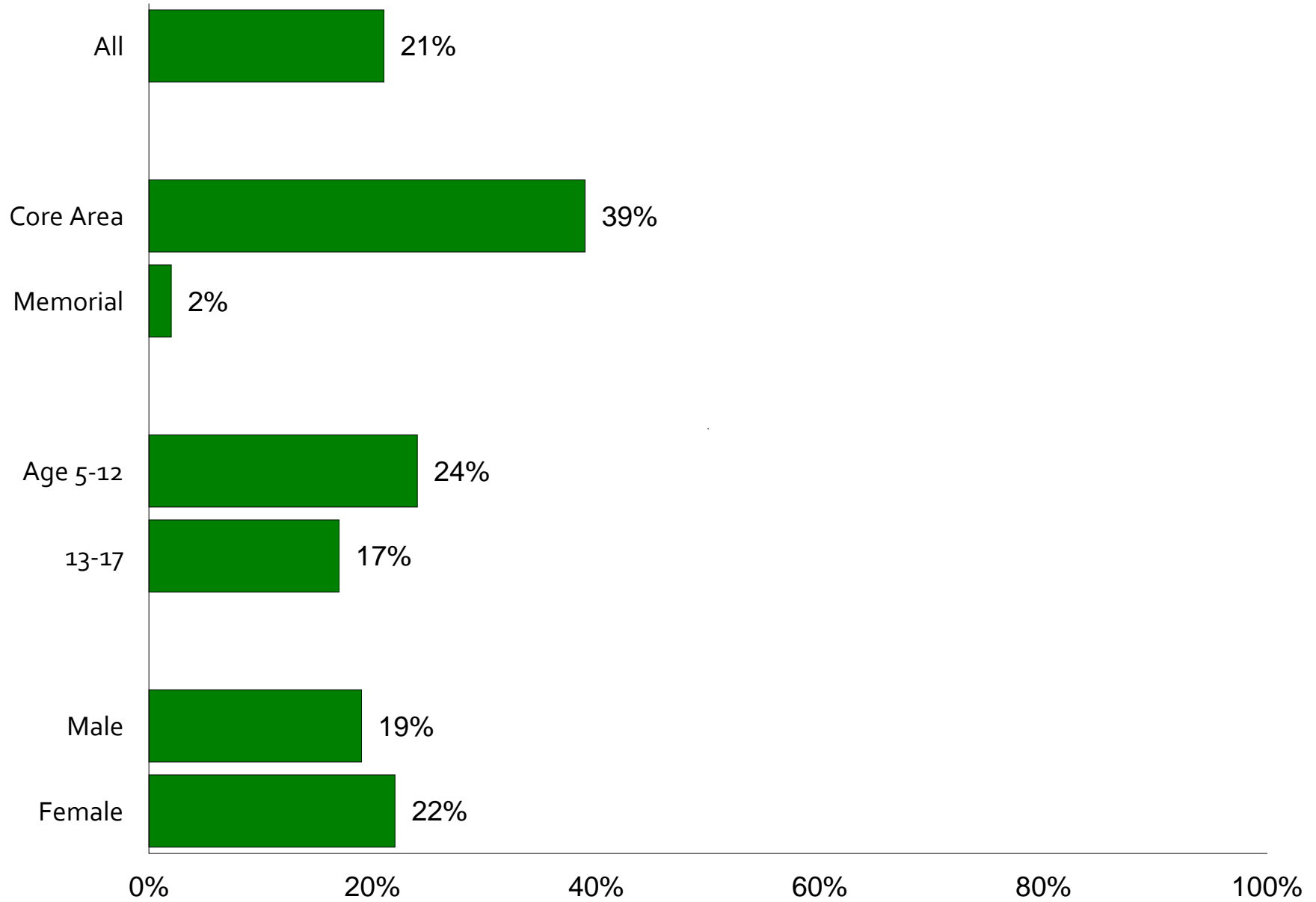
Market Share for Jewish Day School

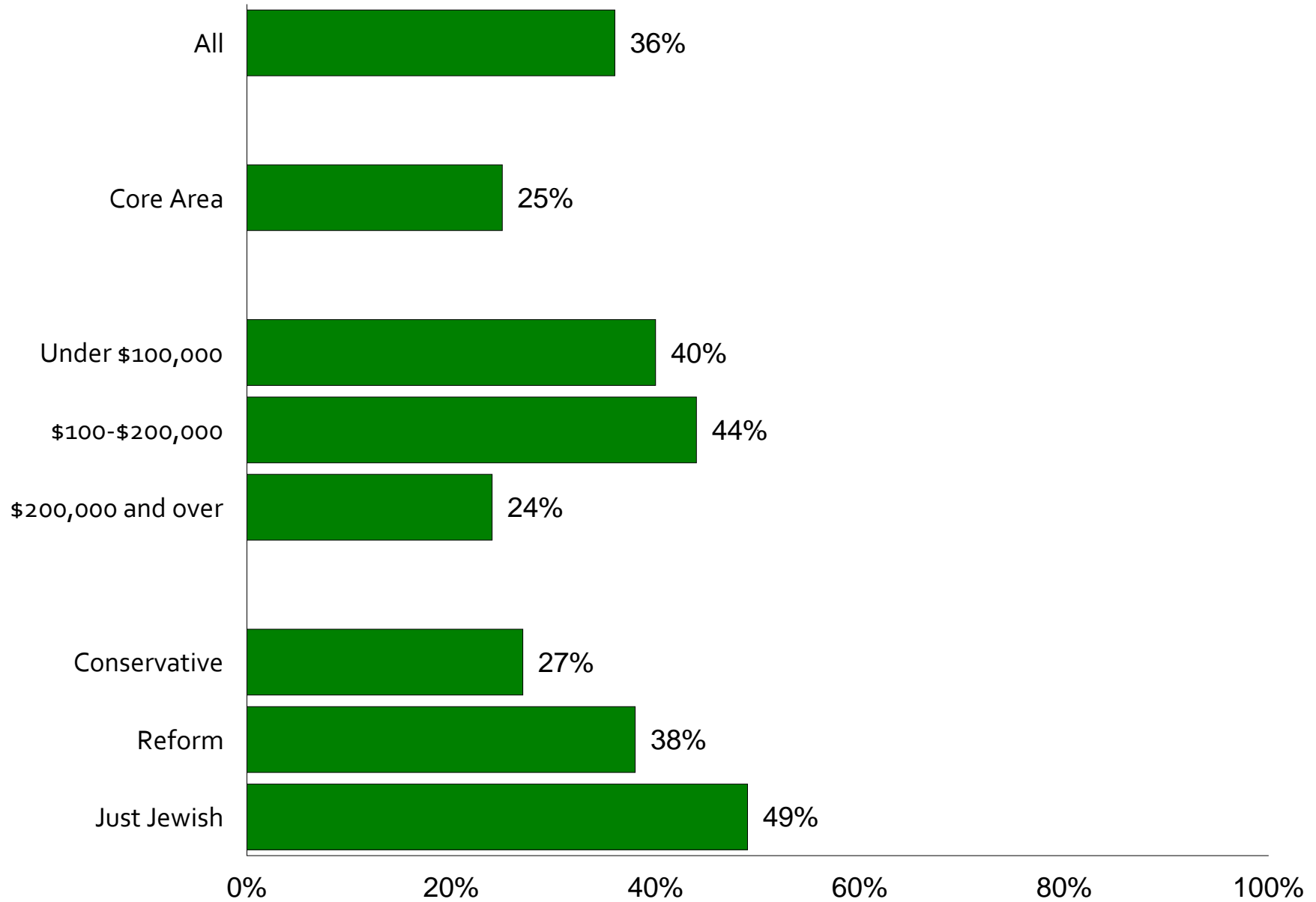

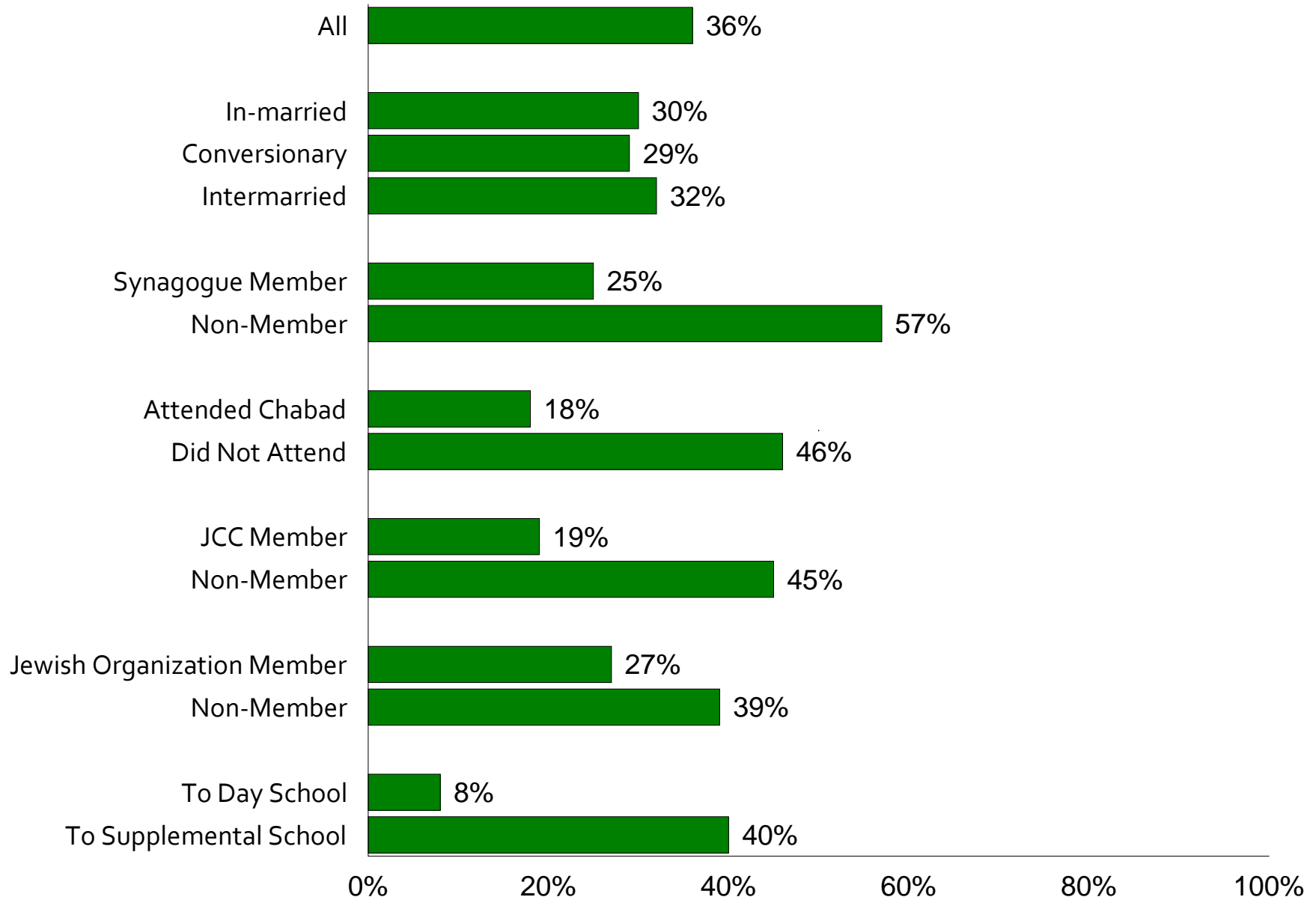

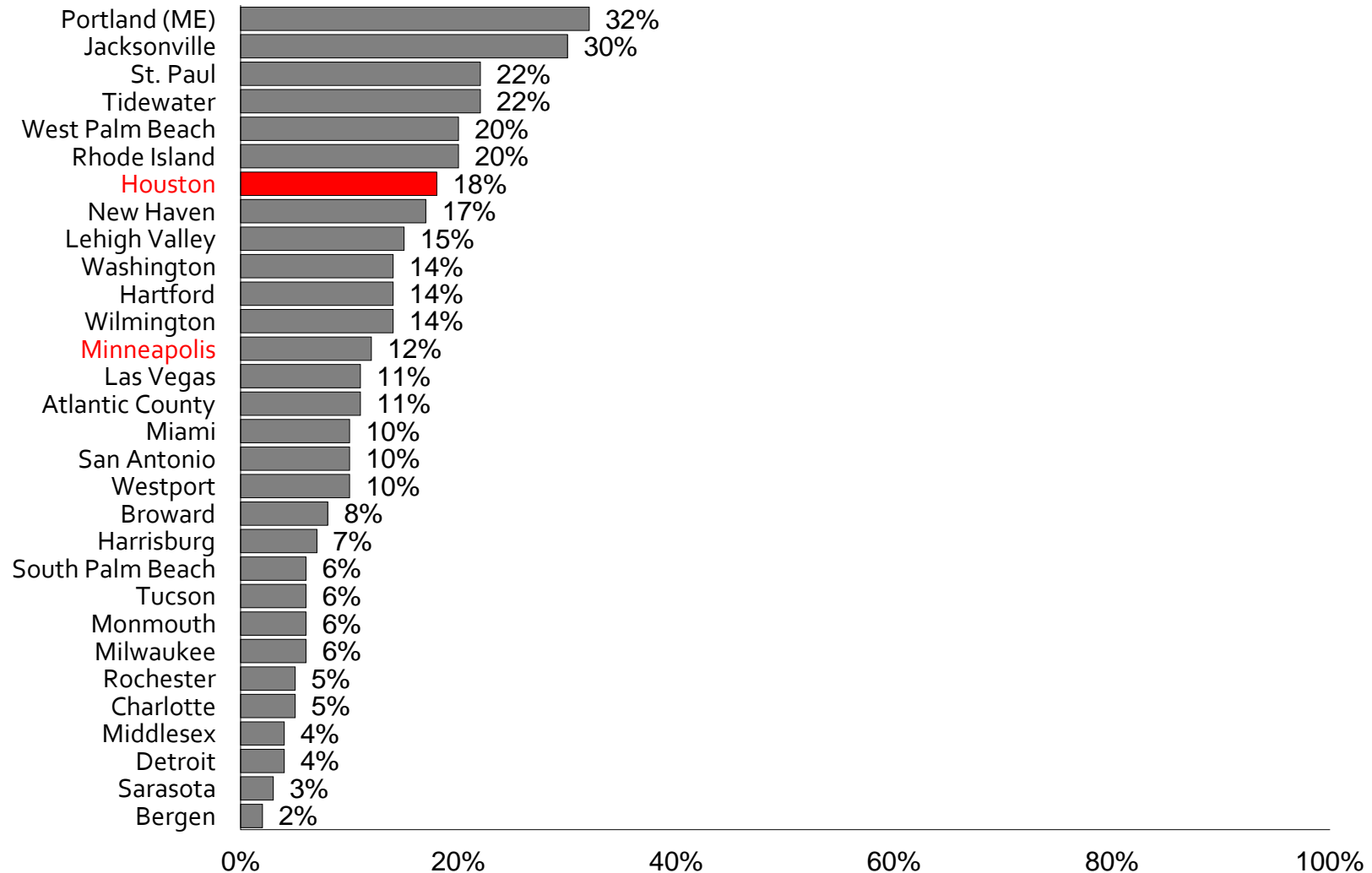
Tuition Cost as a Major Reason for Not Sending Jewish Children to a Jewish Day School

Distance from Home as a Major Reason for Not Sending Jewish Children to a Jewish Day School

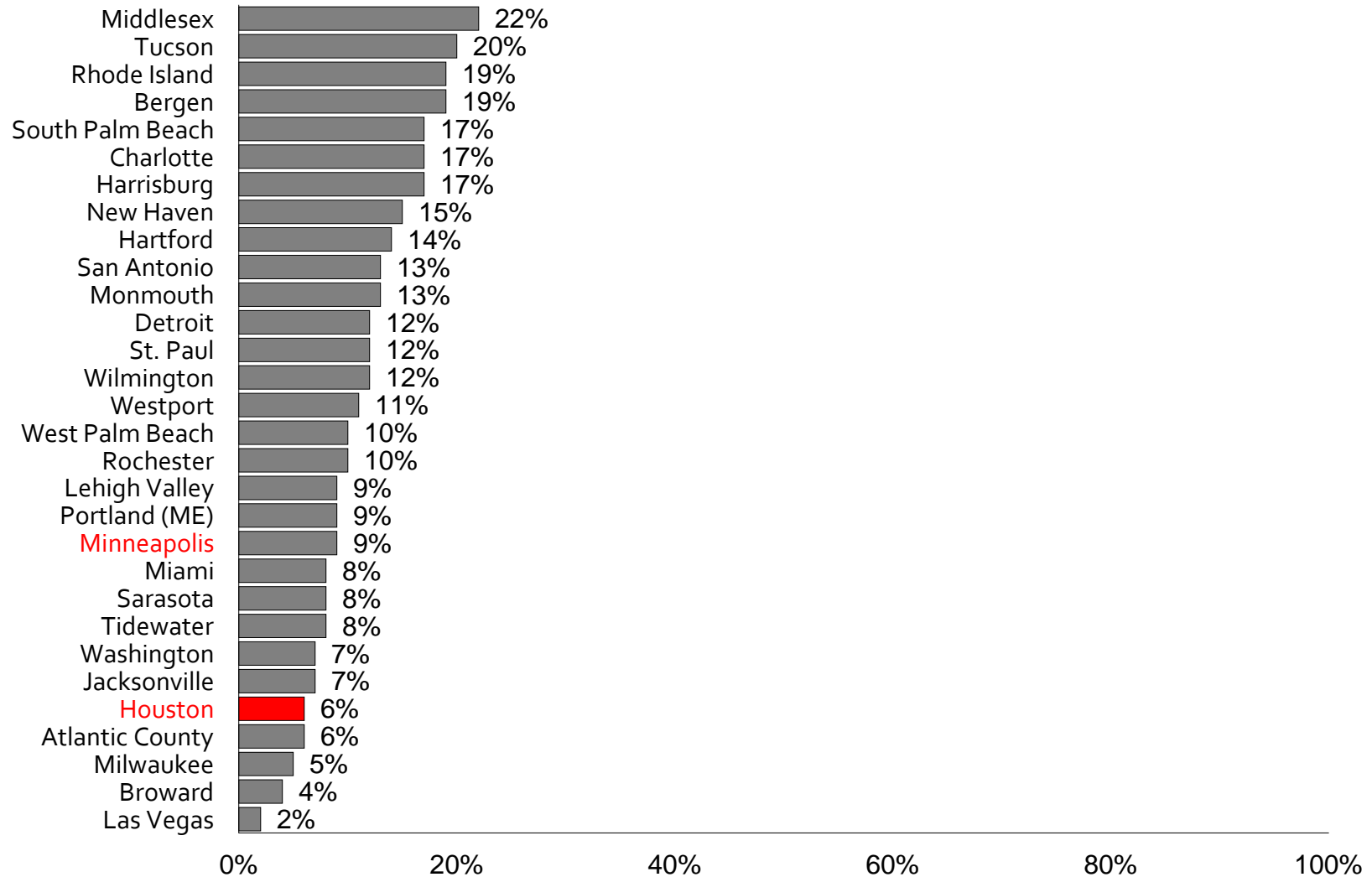

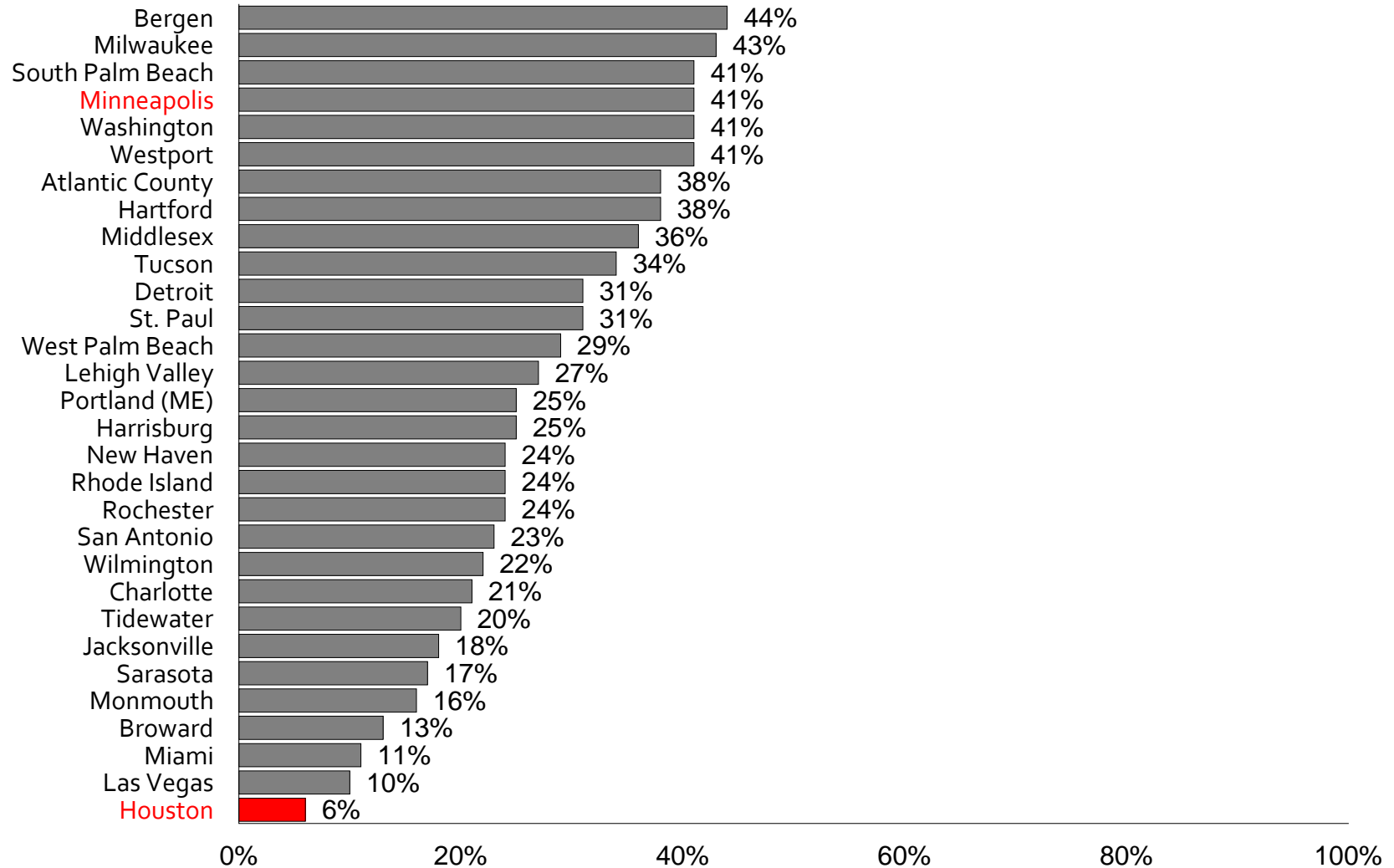

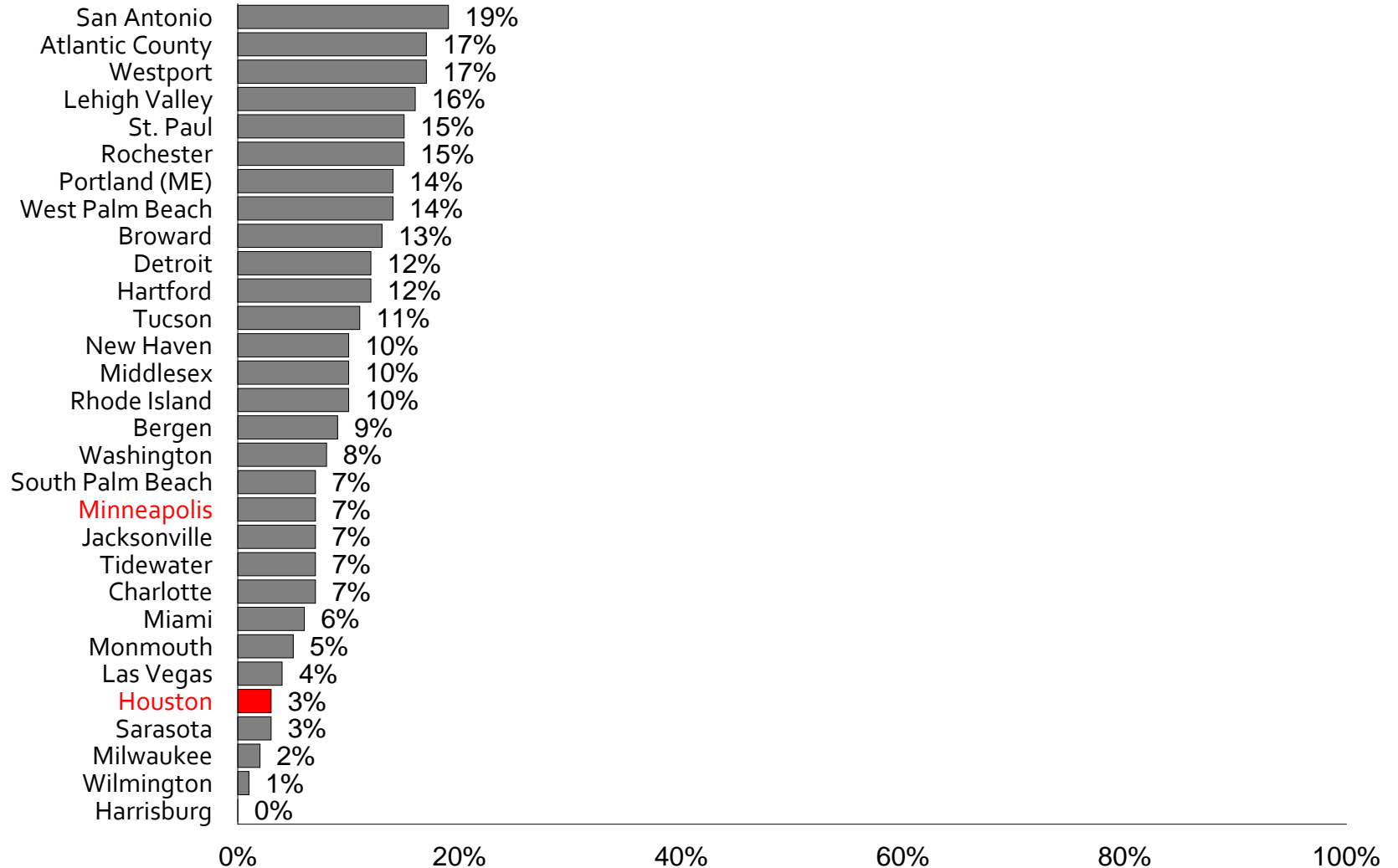

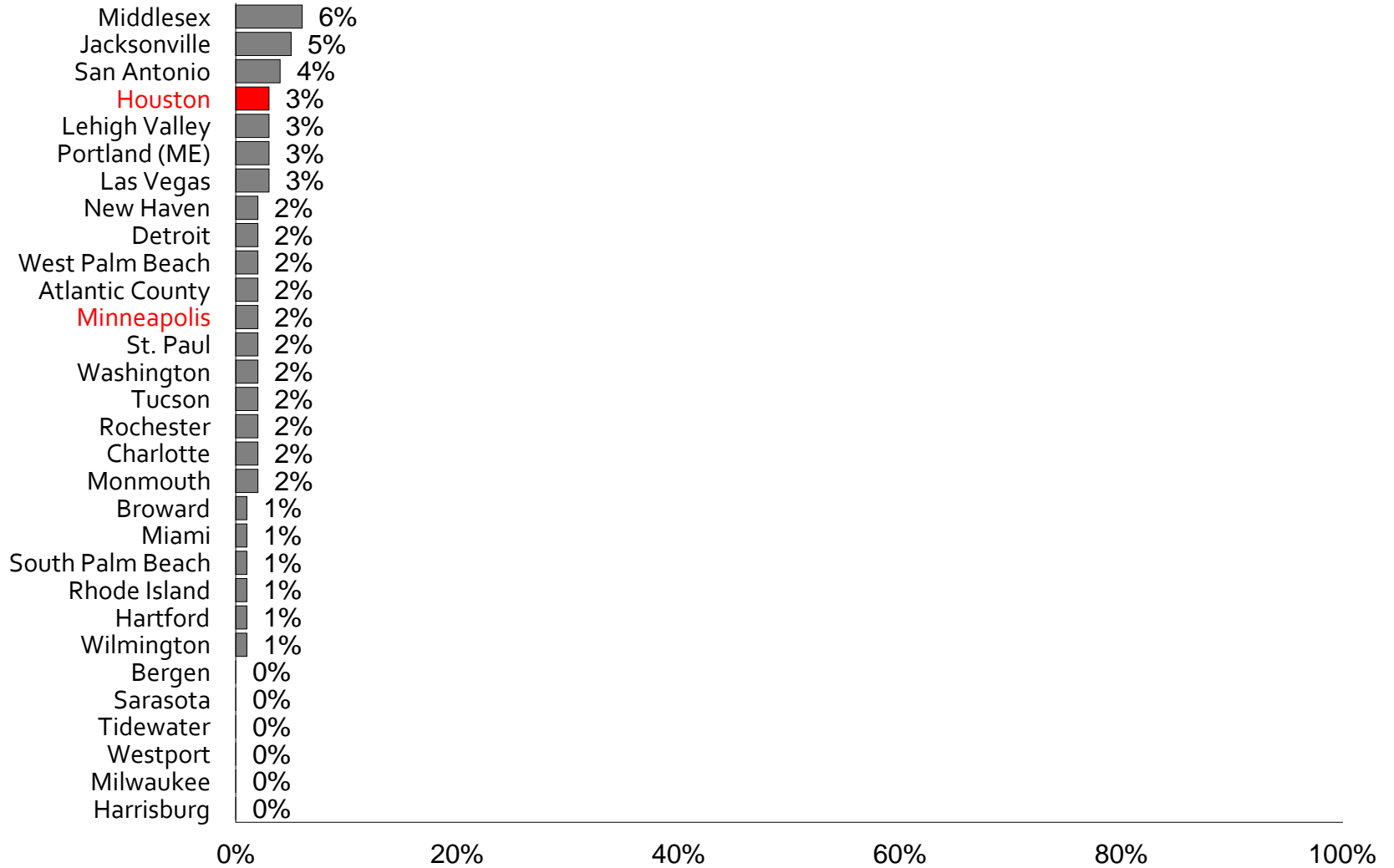

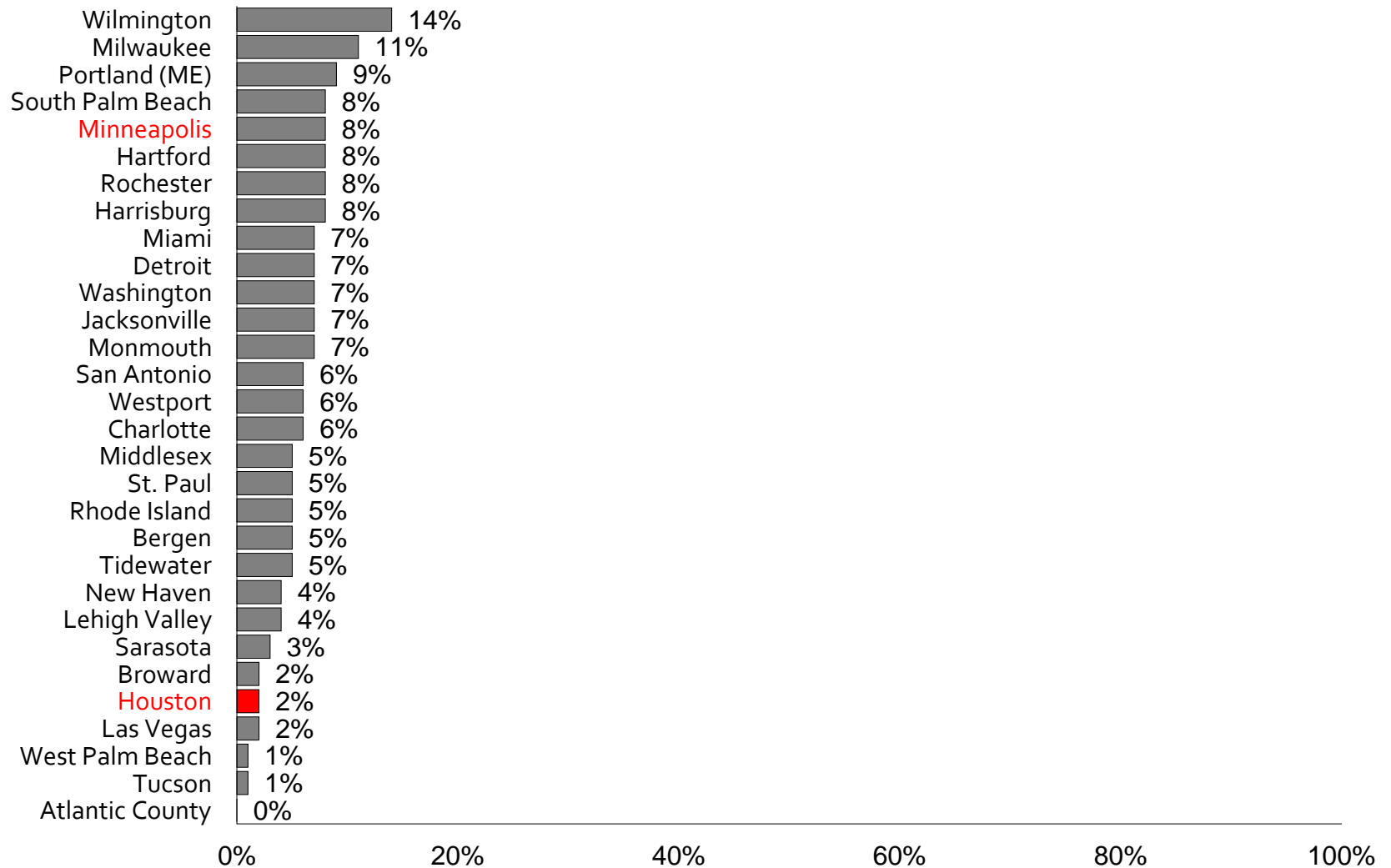

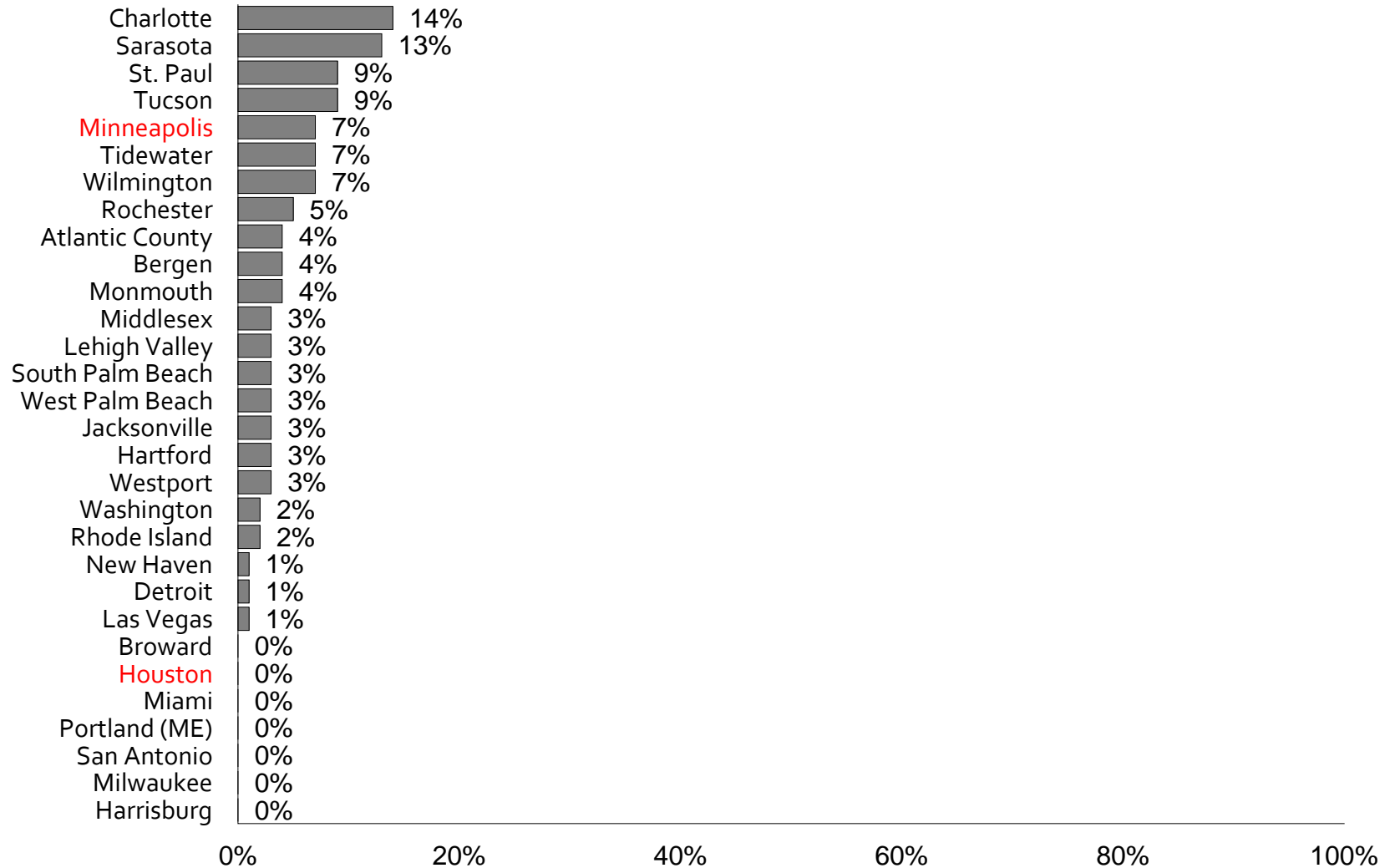

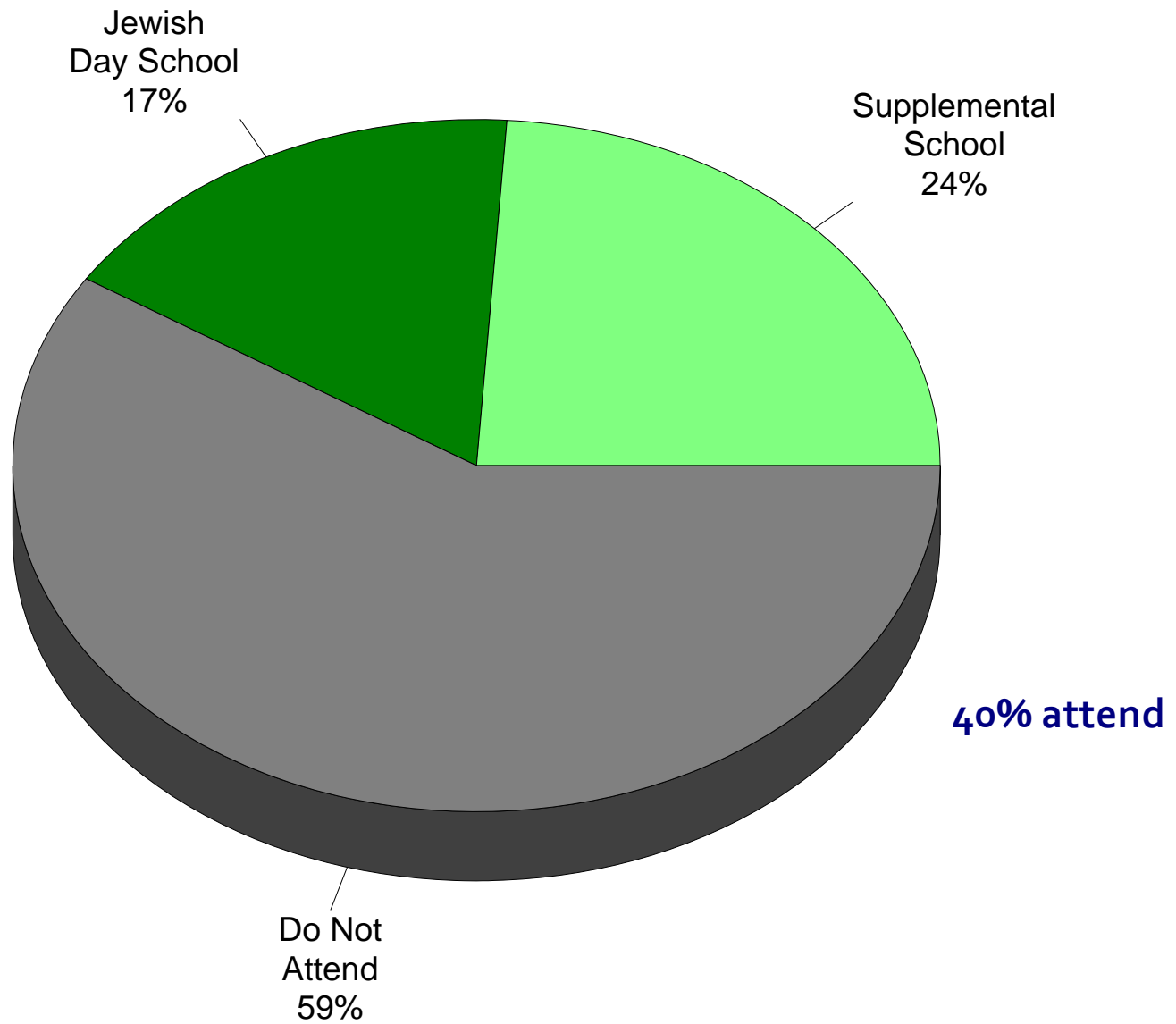

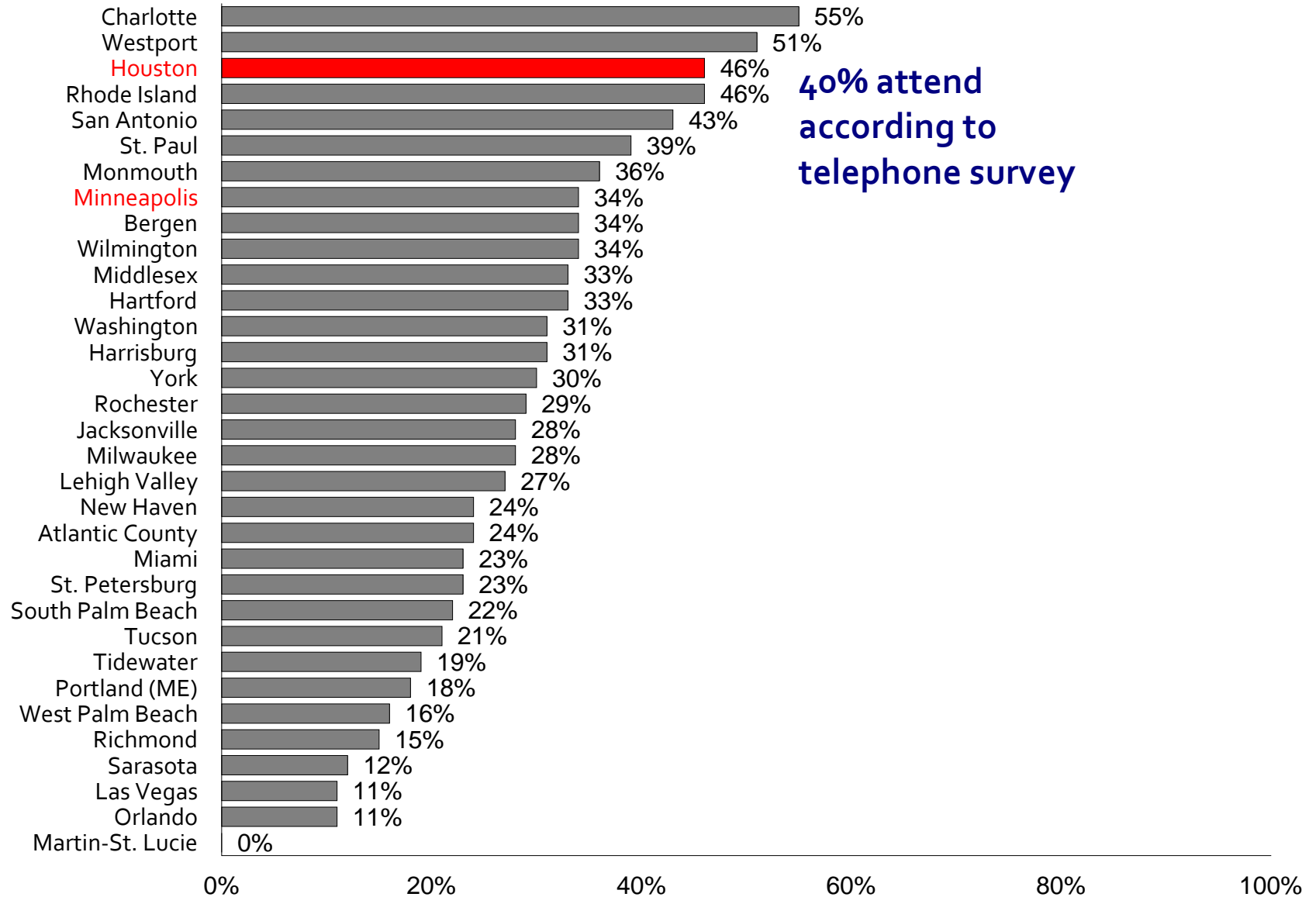
Who Currently Attend Formal Jewish Education

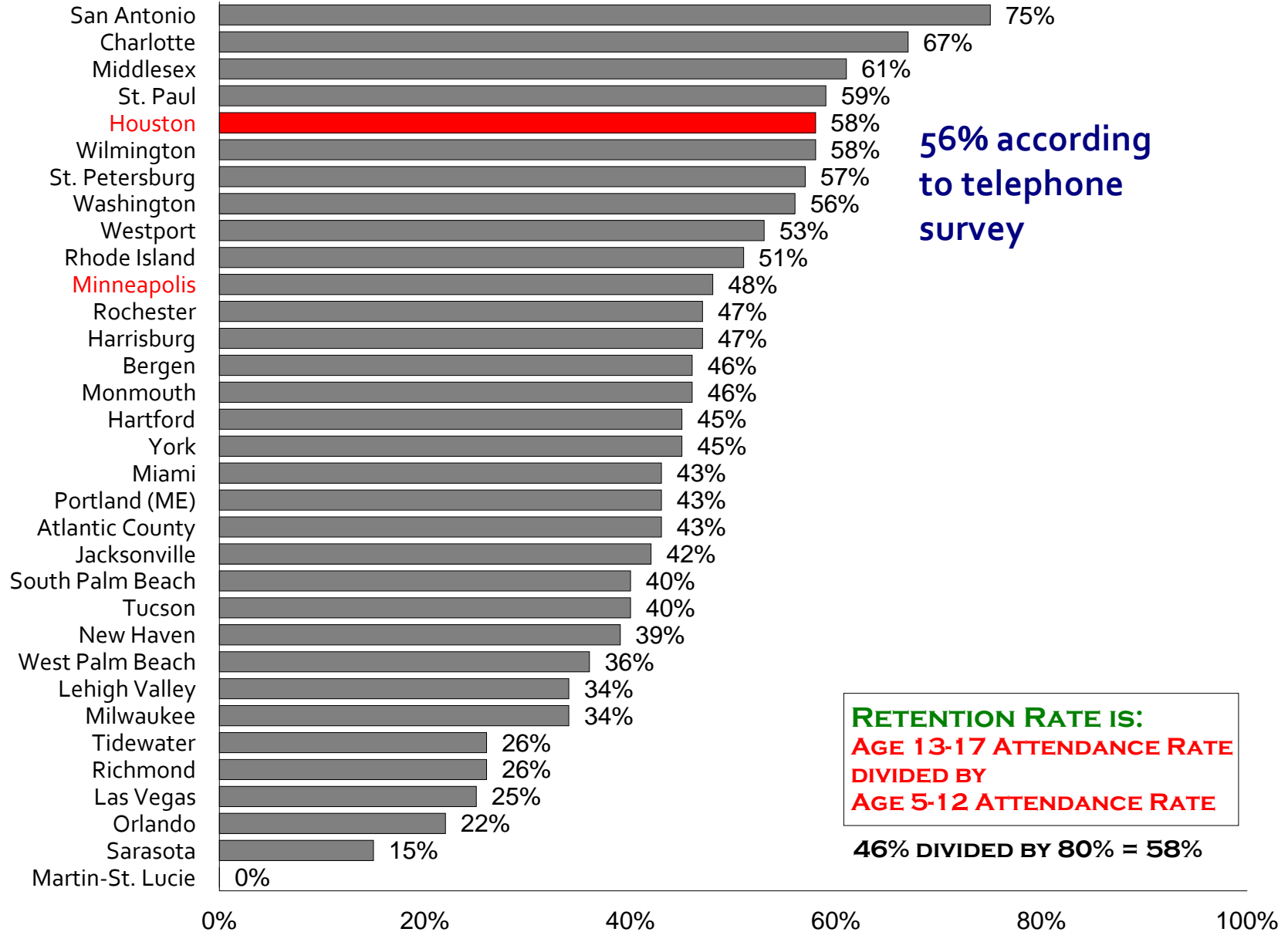

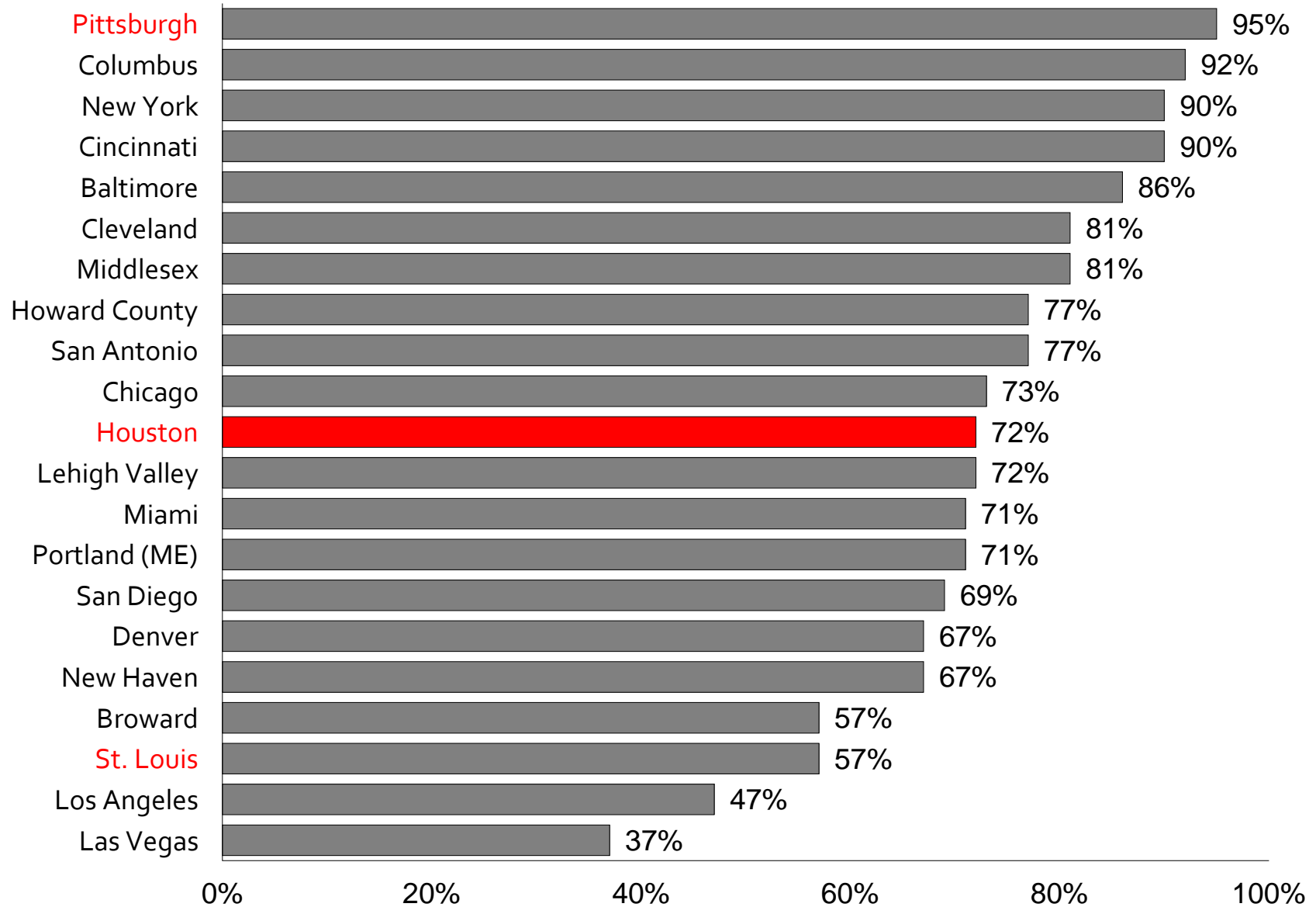

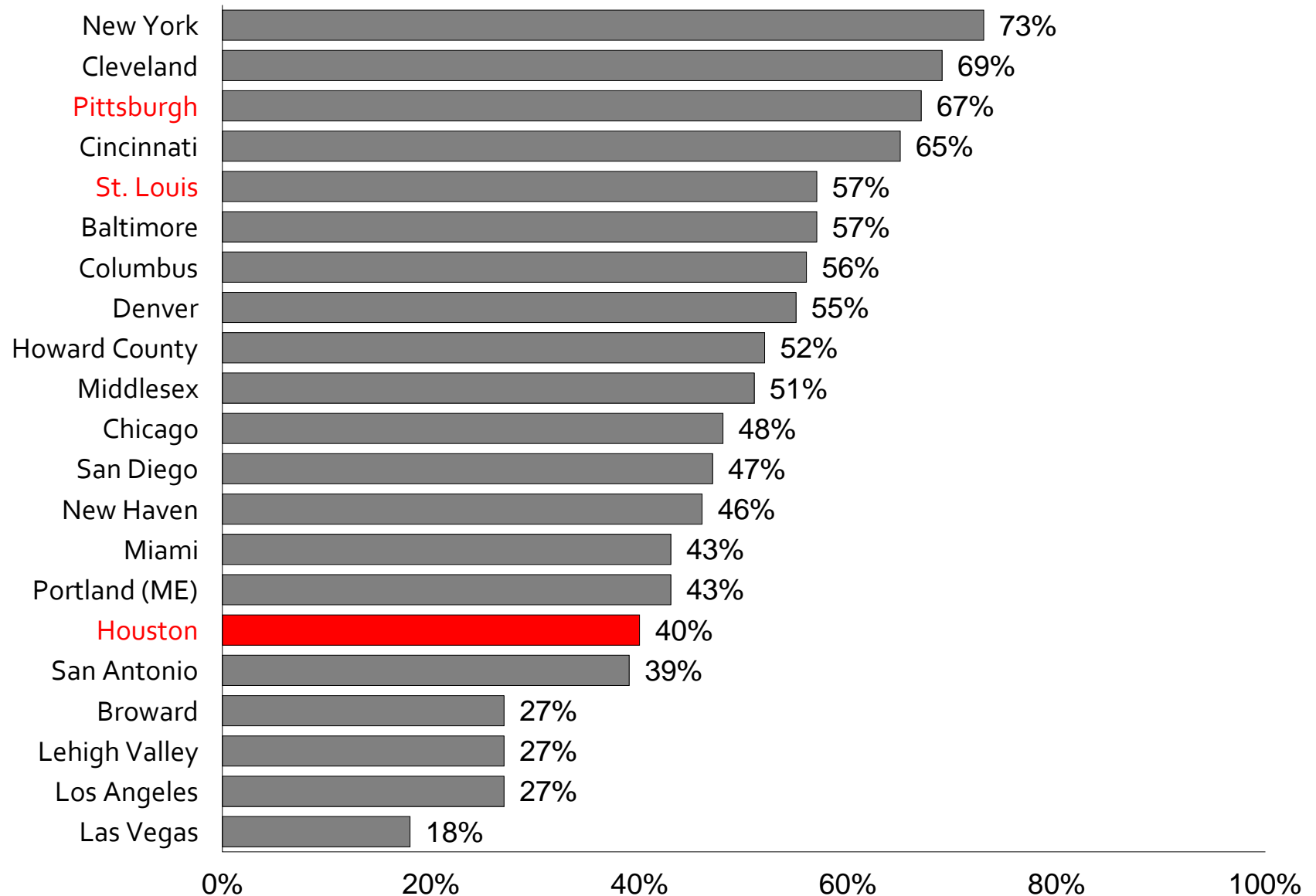

Retention Rate in Formal Jewish Education

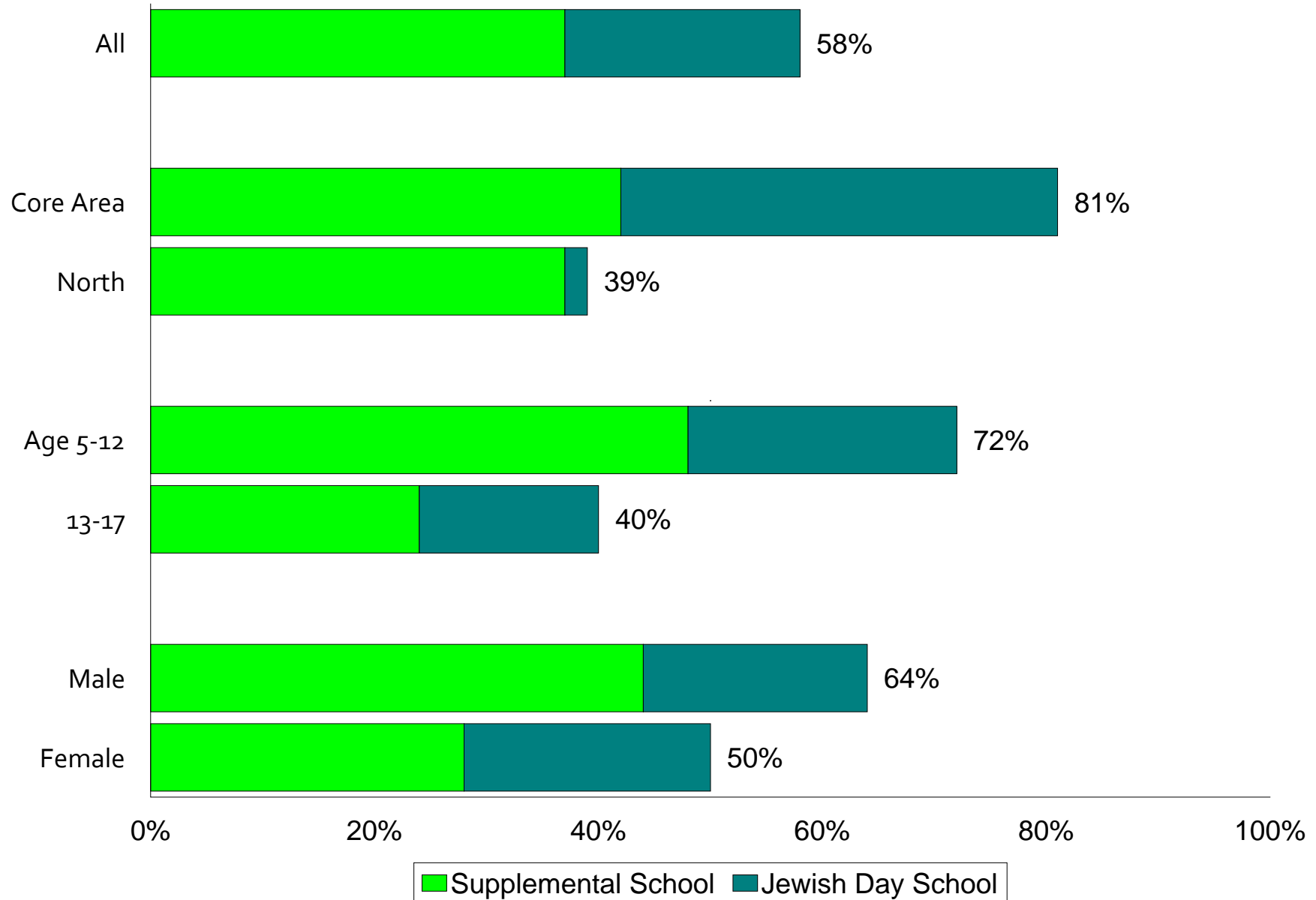

Ever Attended Formal Jewish Education

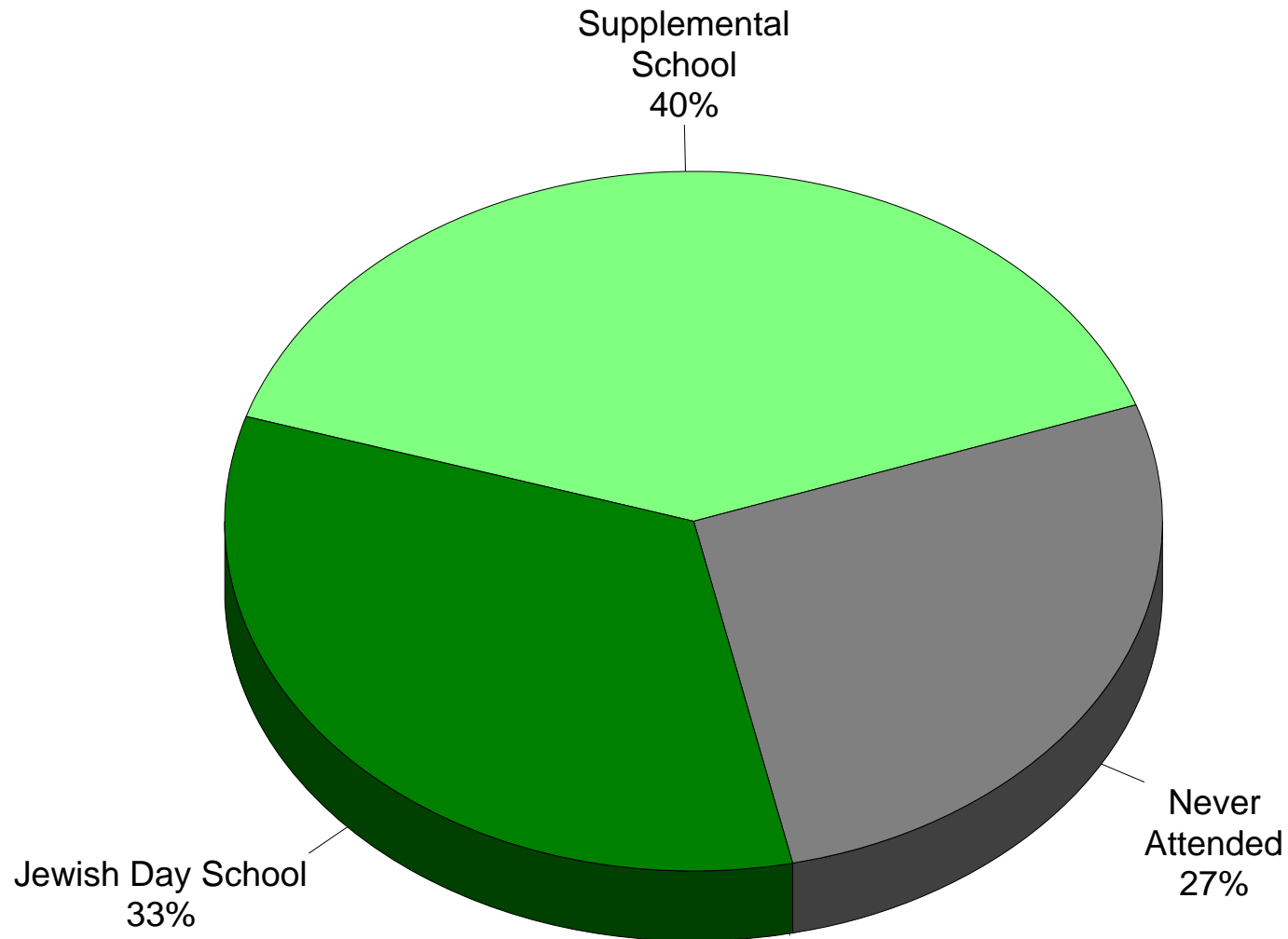

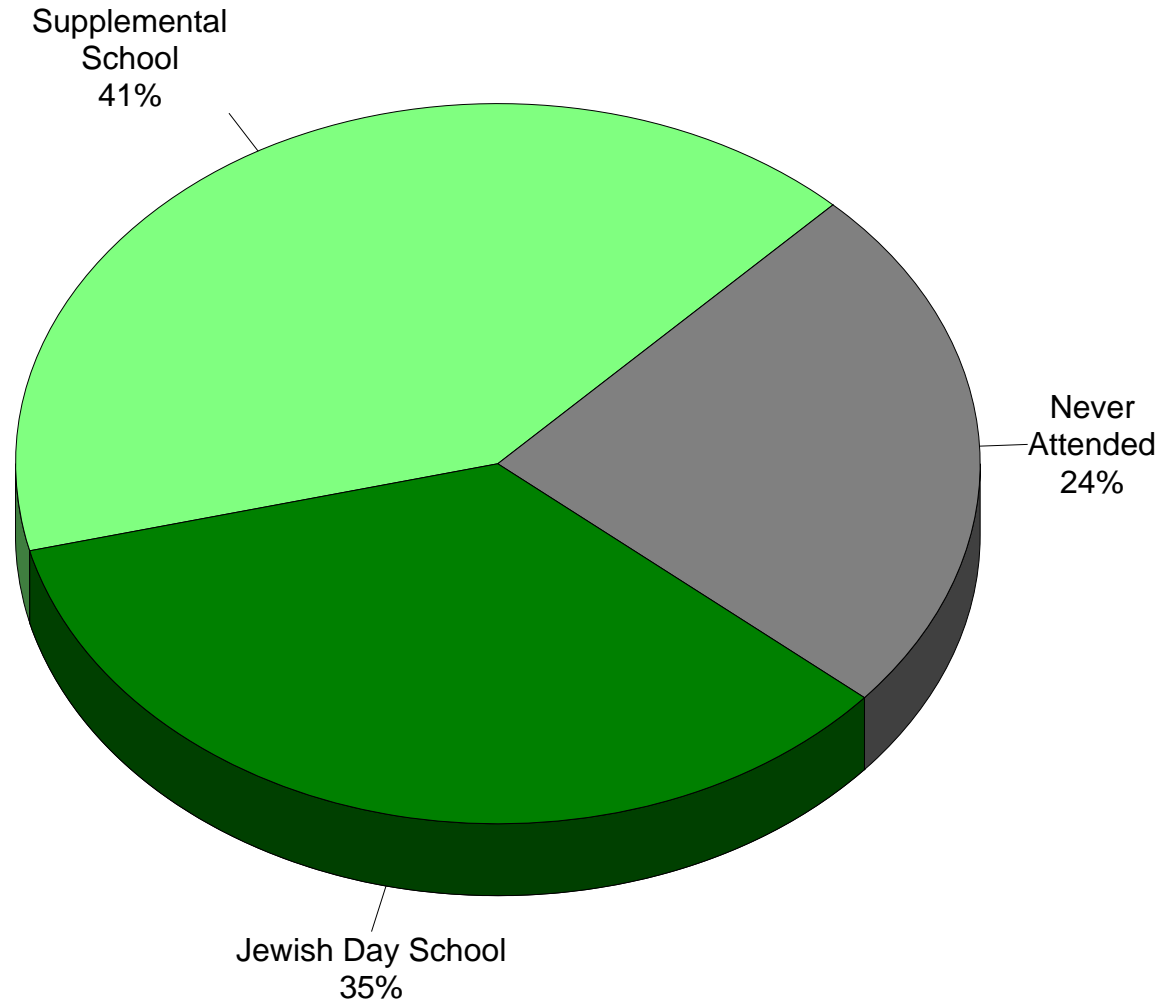

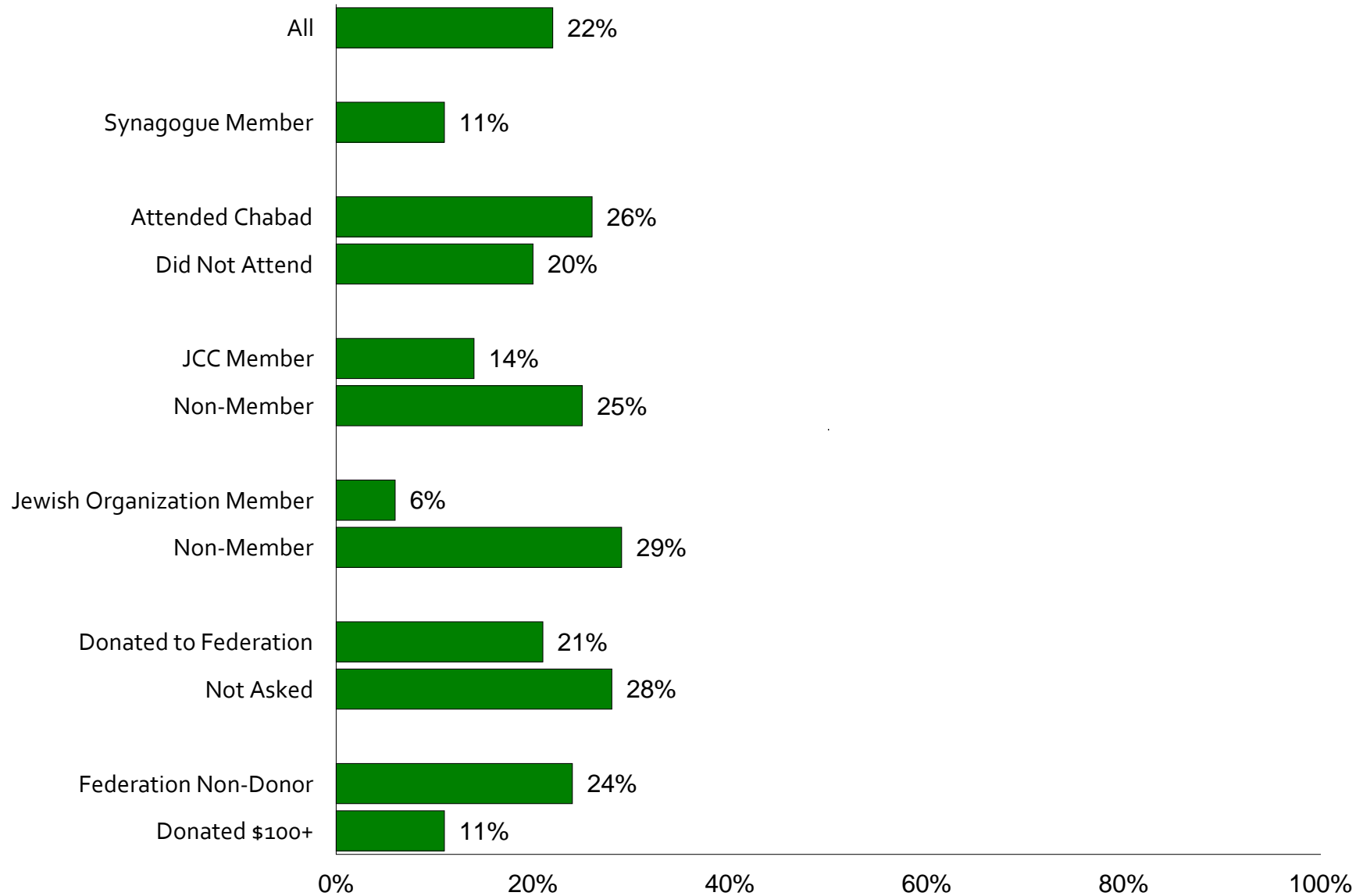
Cost Prevented Sending Child to Jewish Overnight Camp This Past Summer
