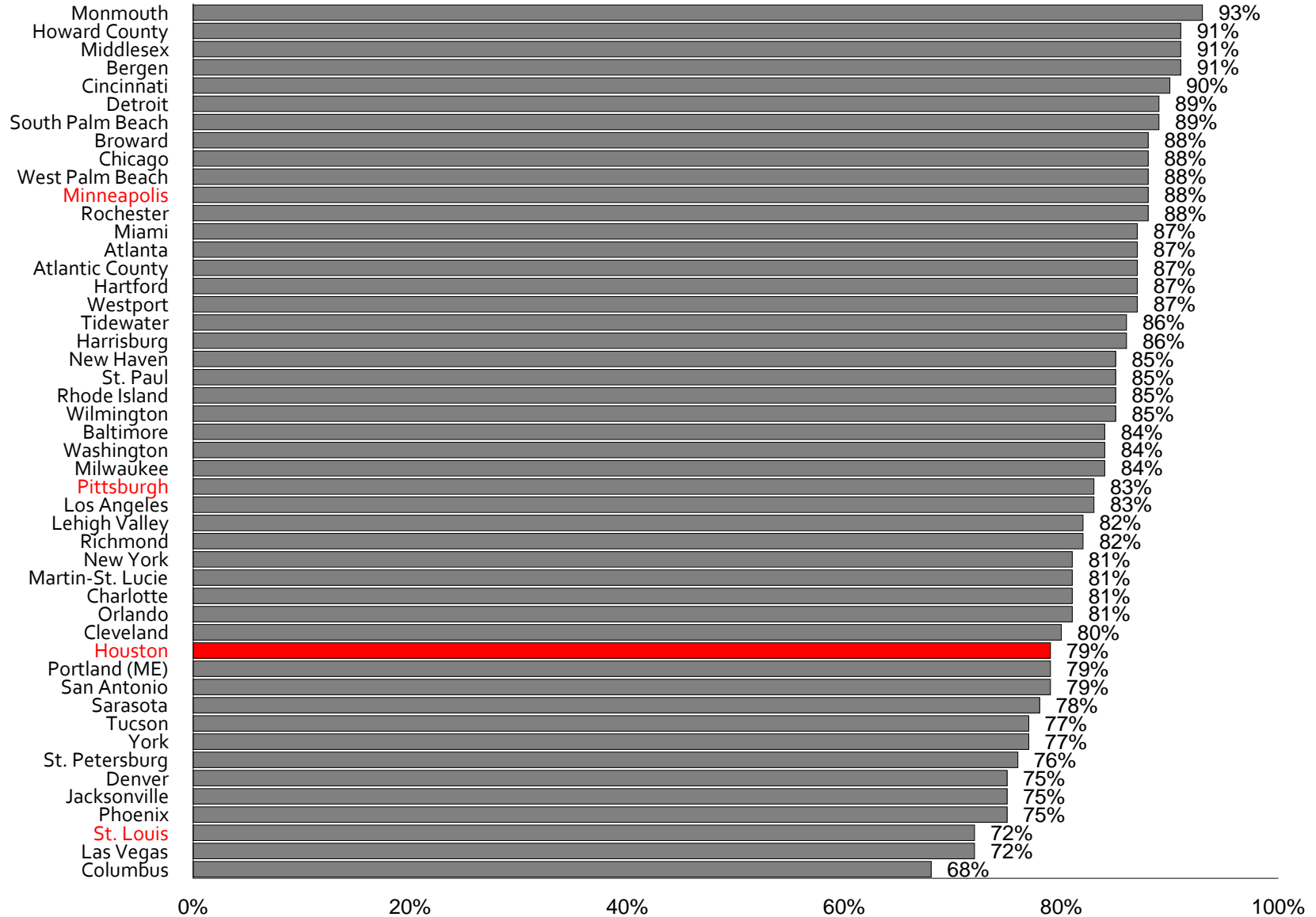
Changes in Religious Practices Over Time

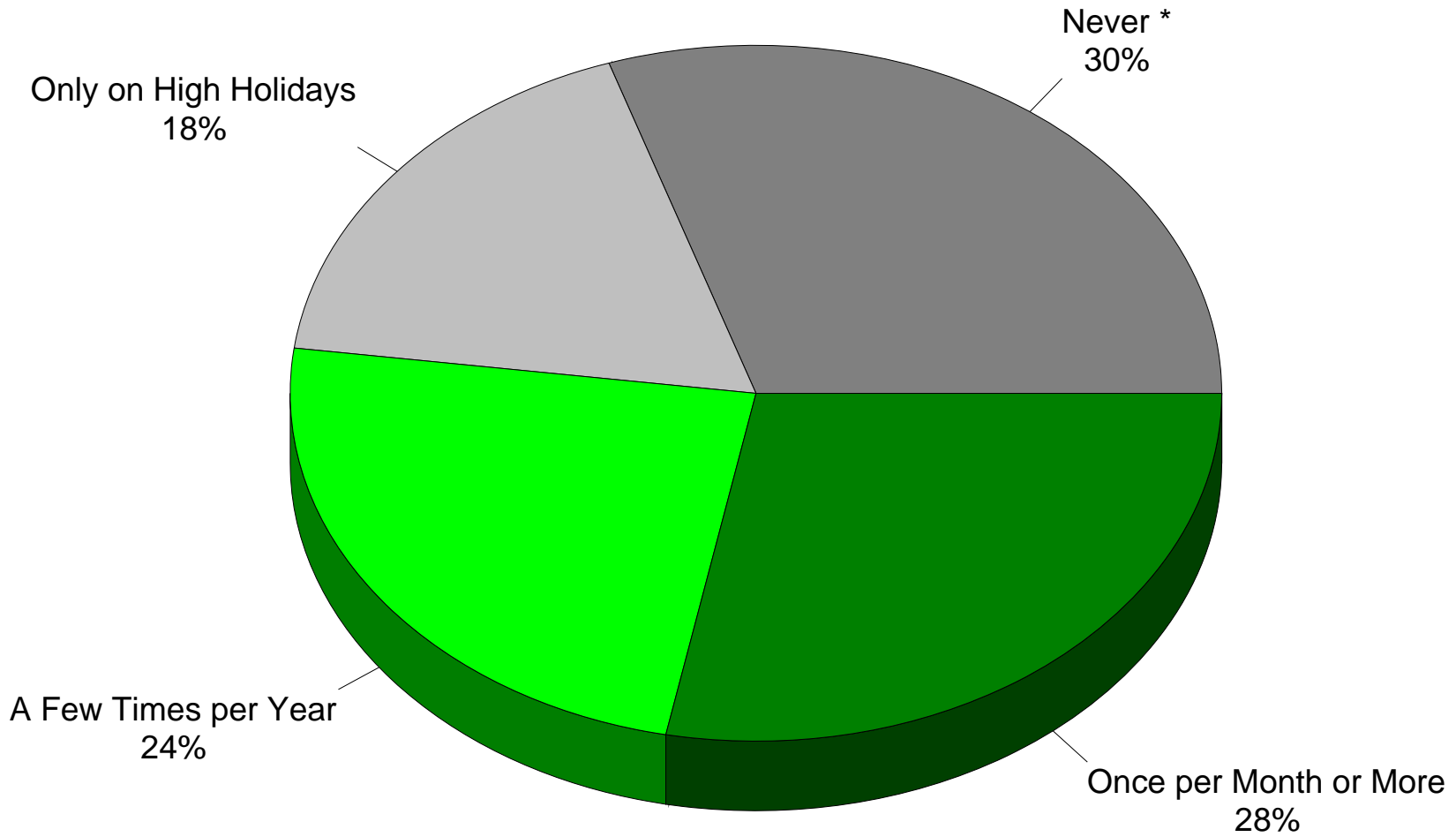

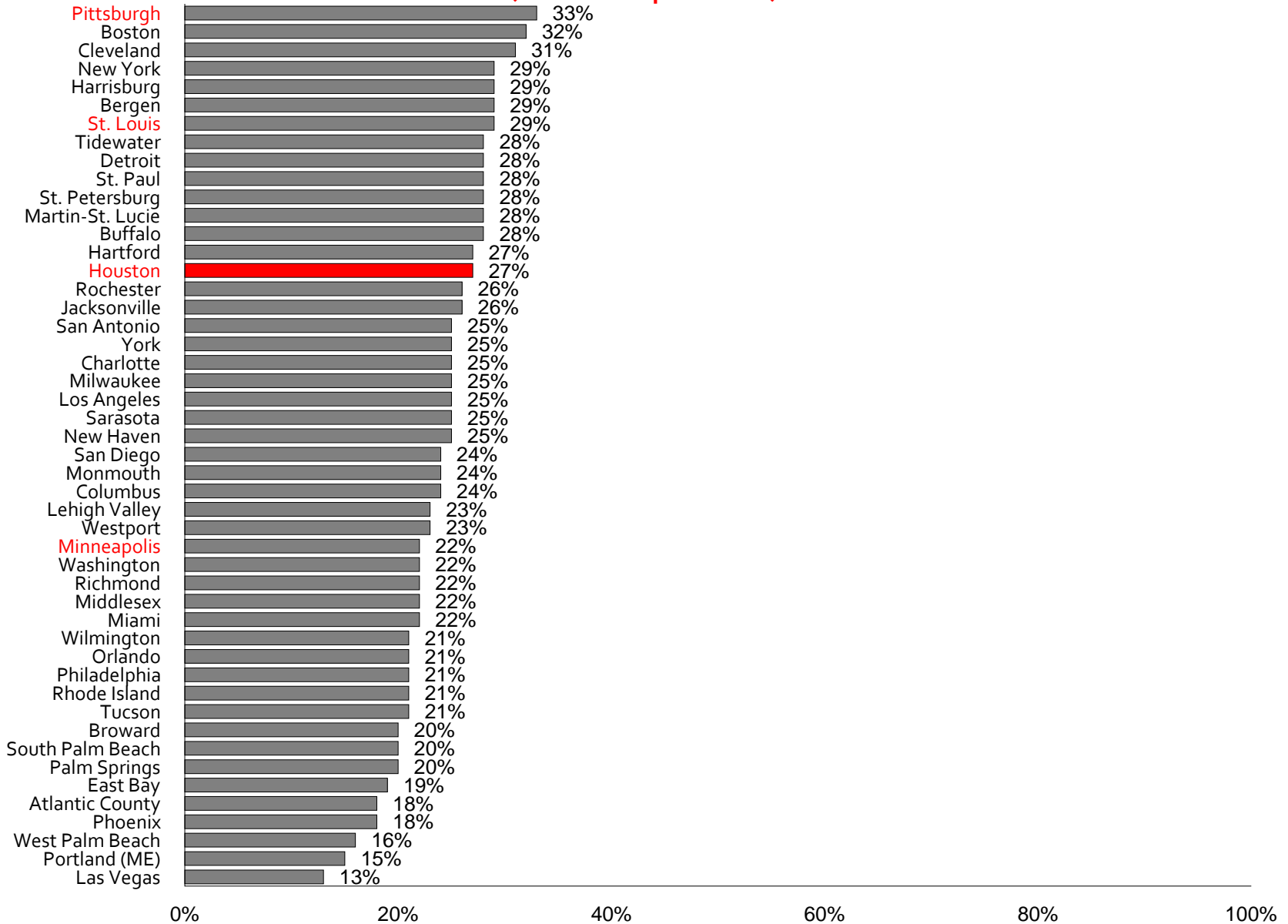

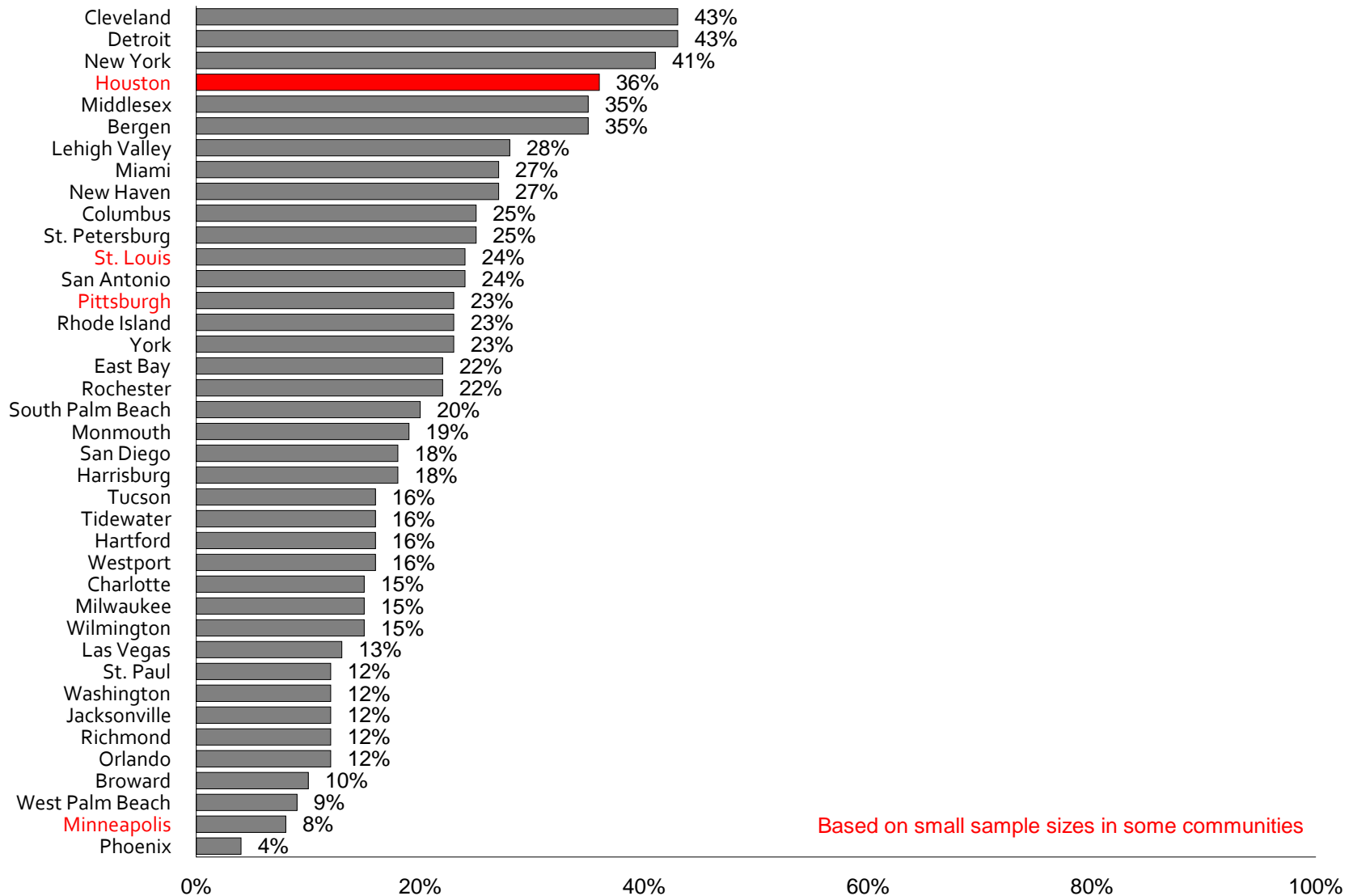
Synagogue Attendance by Age

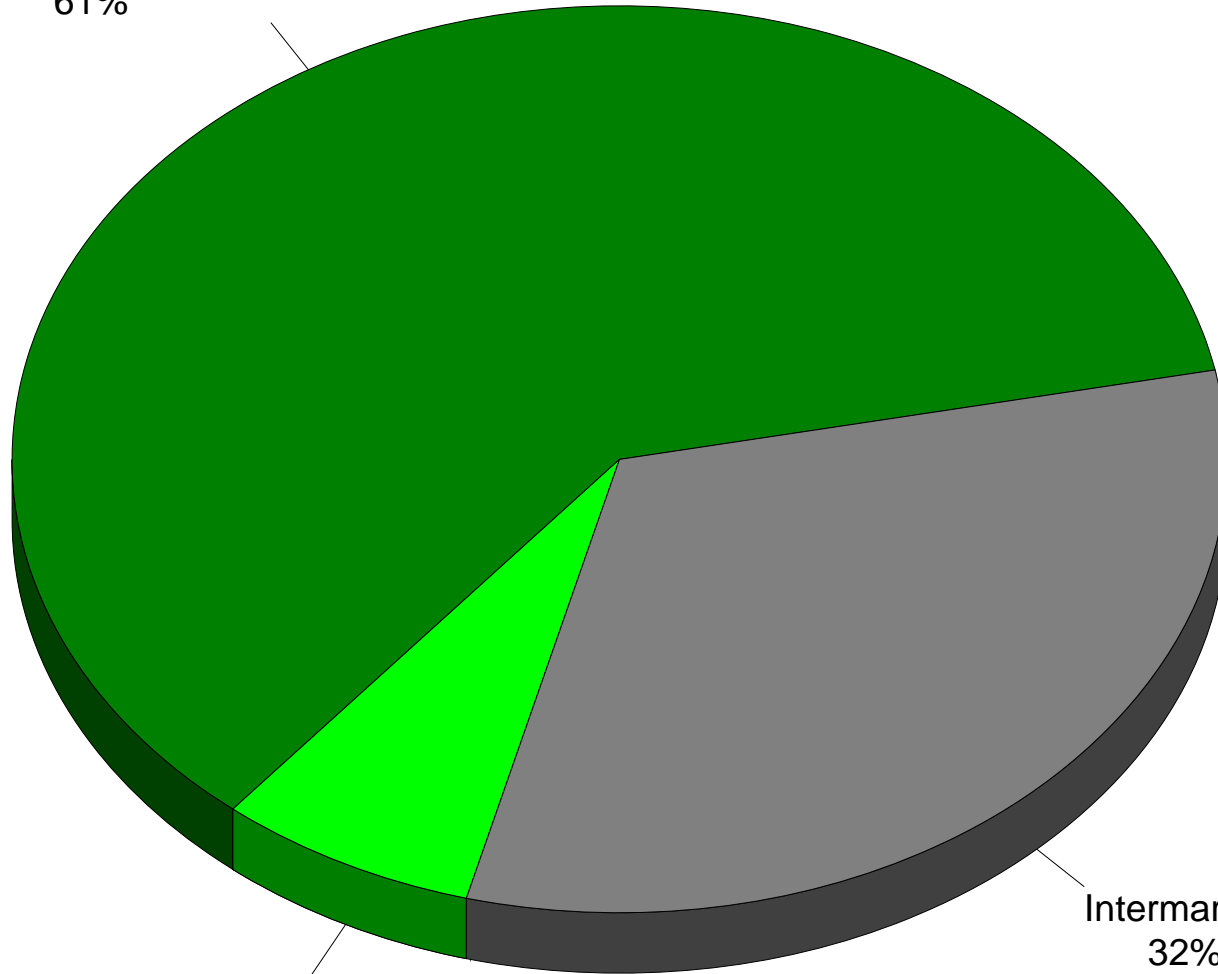

Intermarriage (Couples Intermarriage Rate)



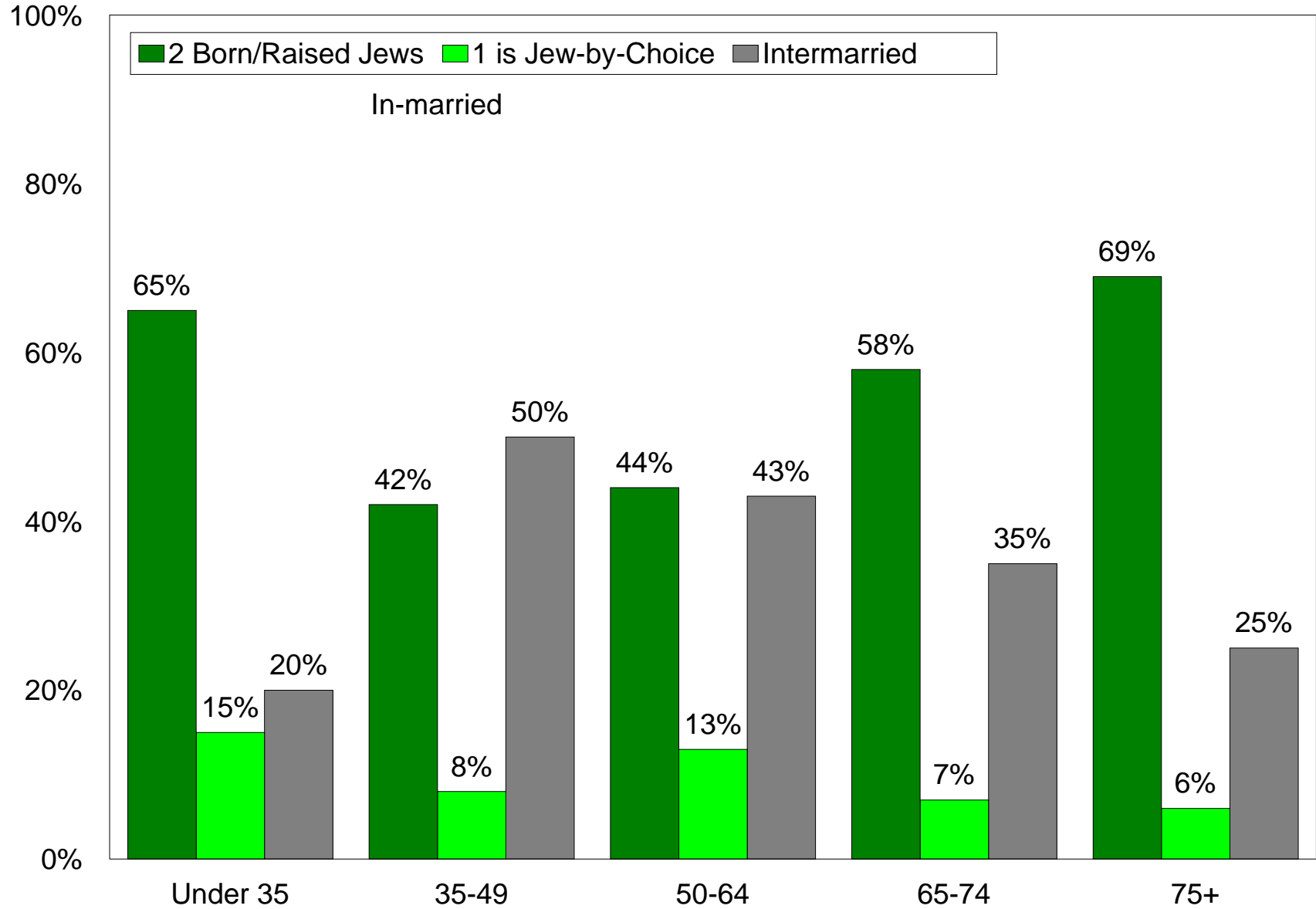

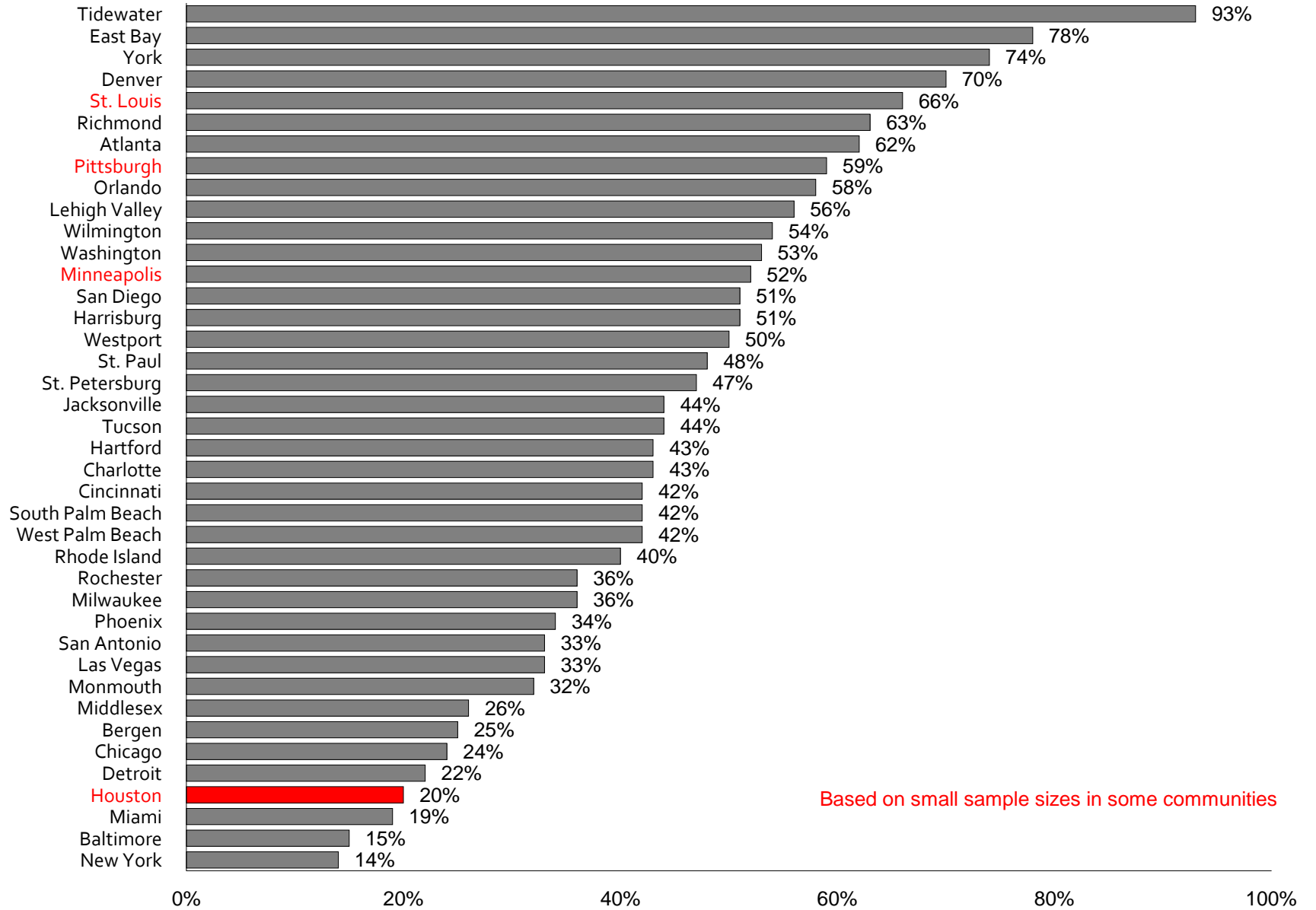

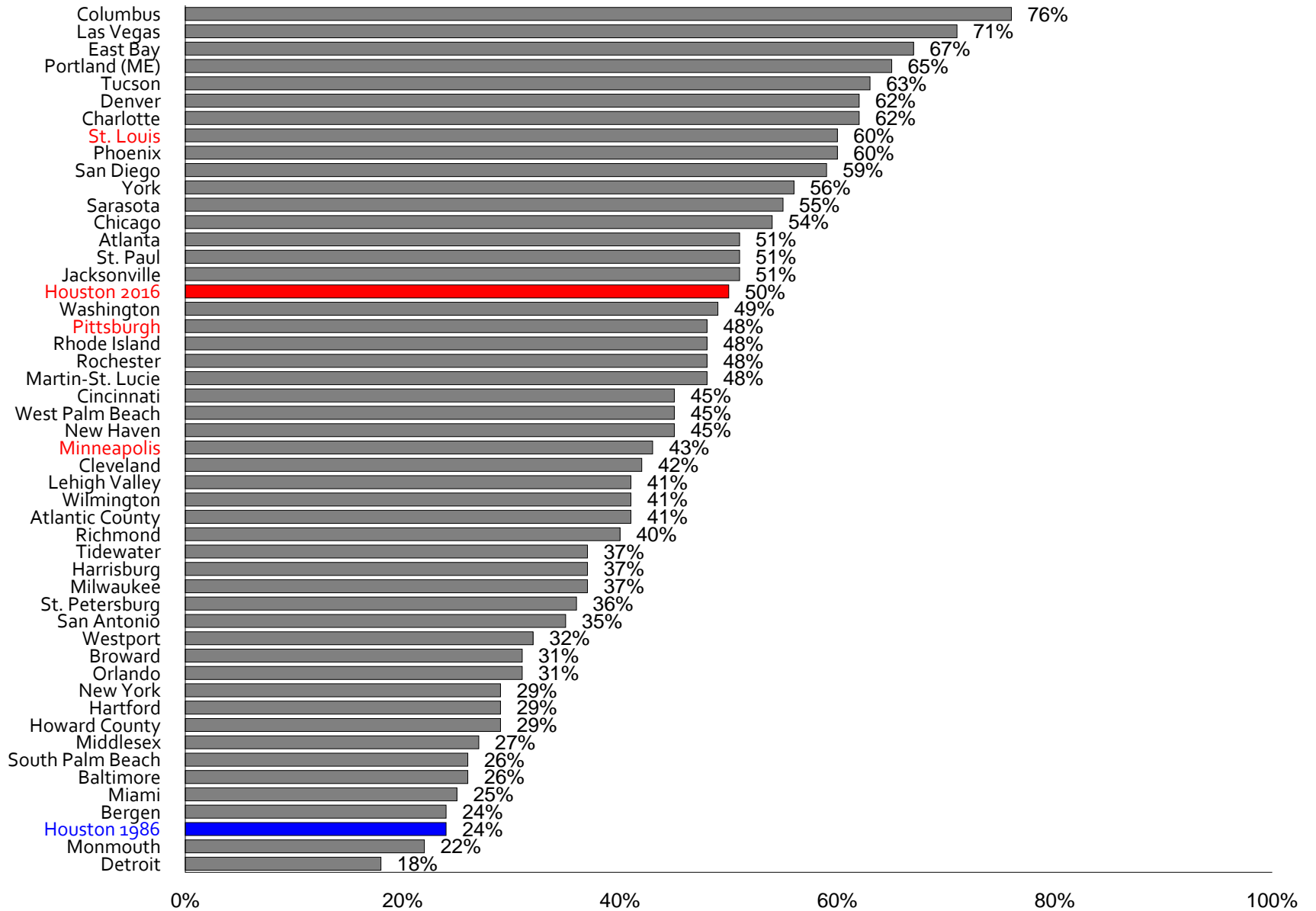

Head of Household Under Age 35 (Couples Intermarriage Rate)



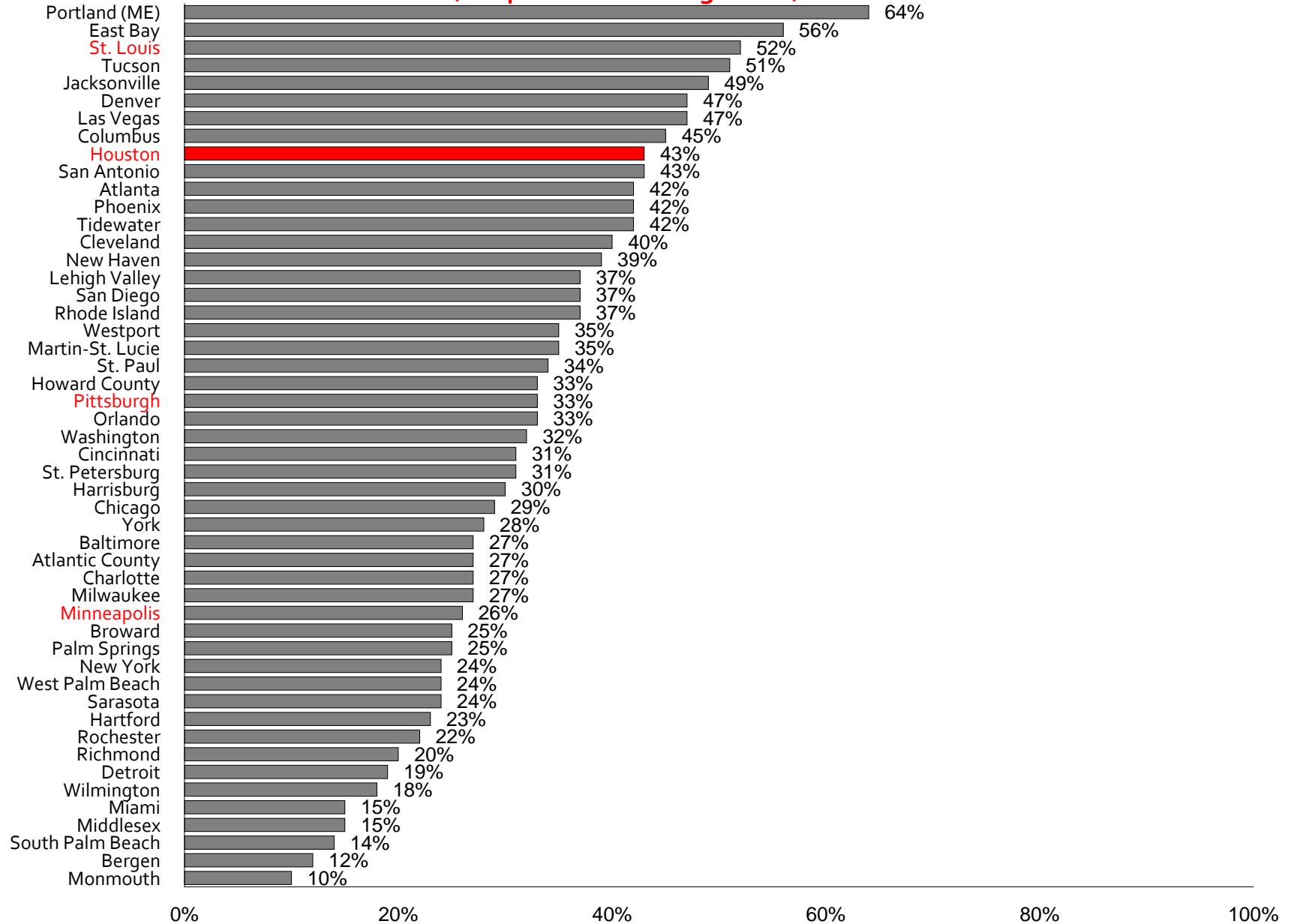

25% Individual Inter-marriage Rate

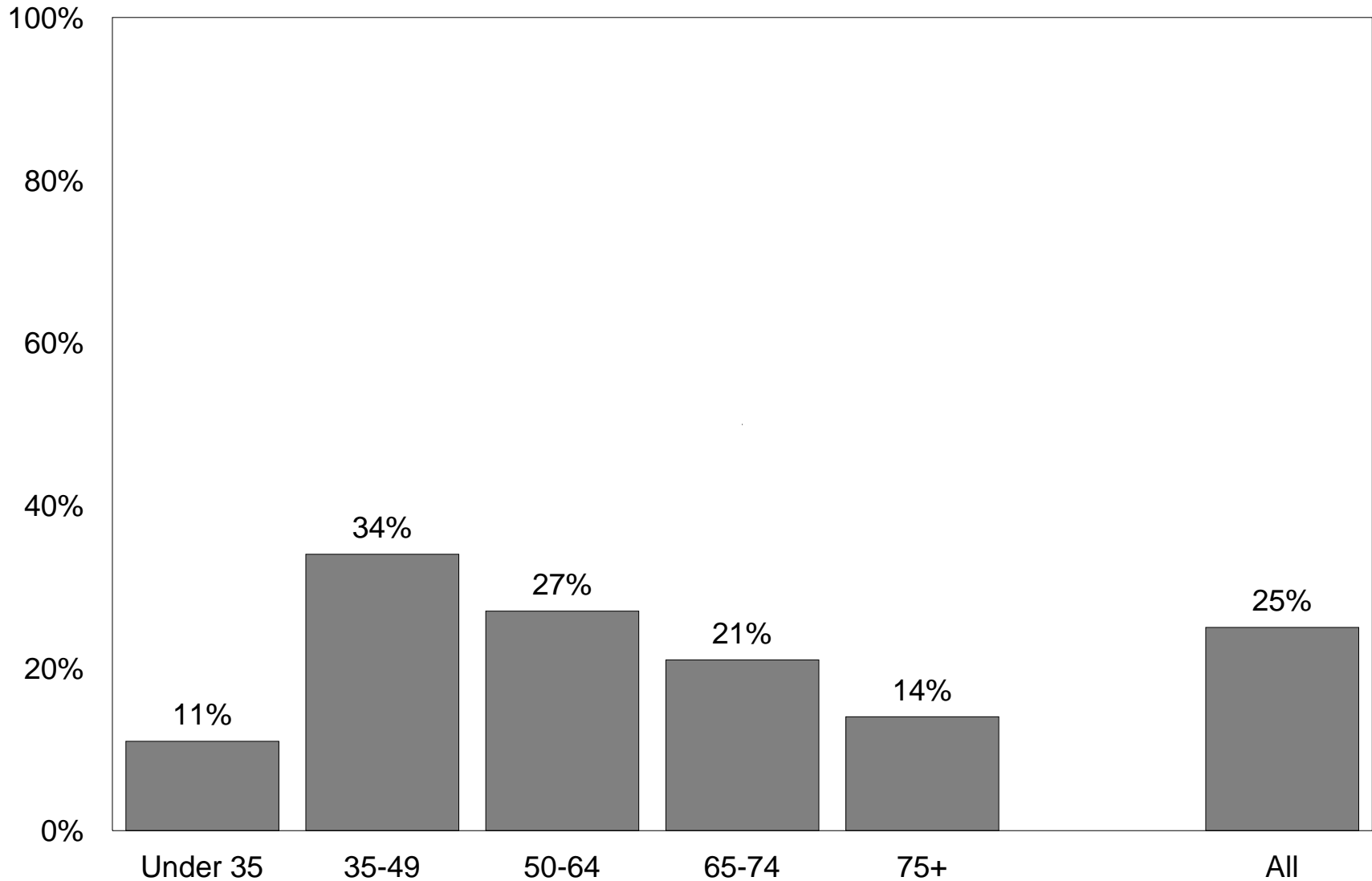

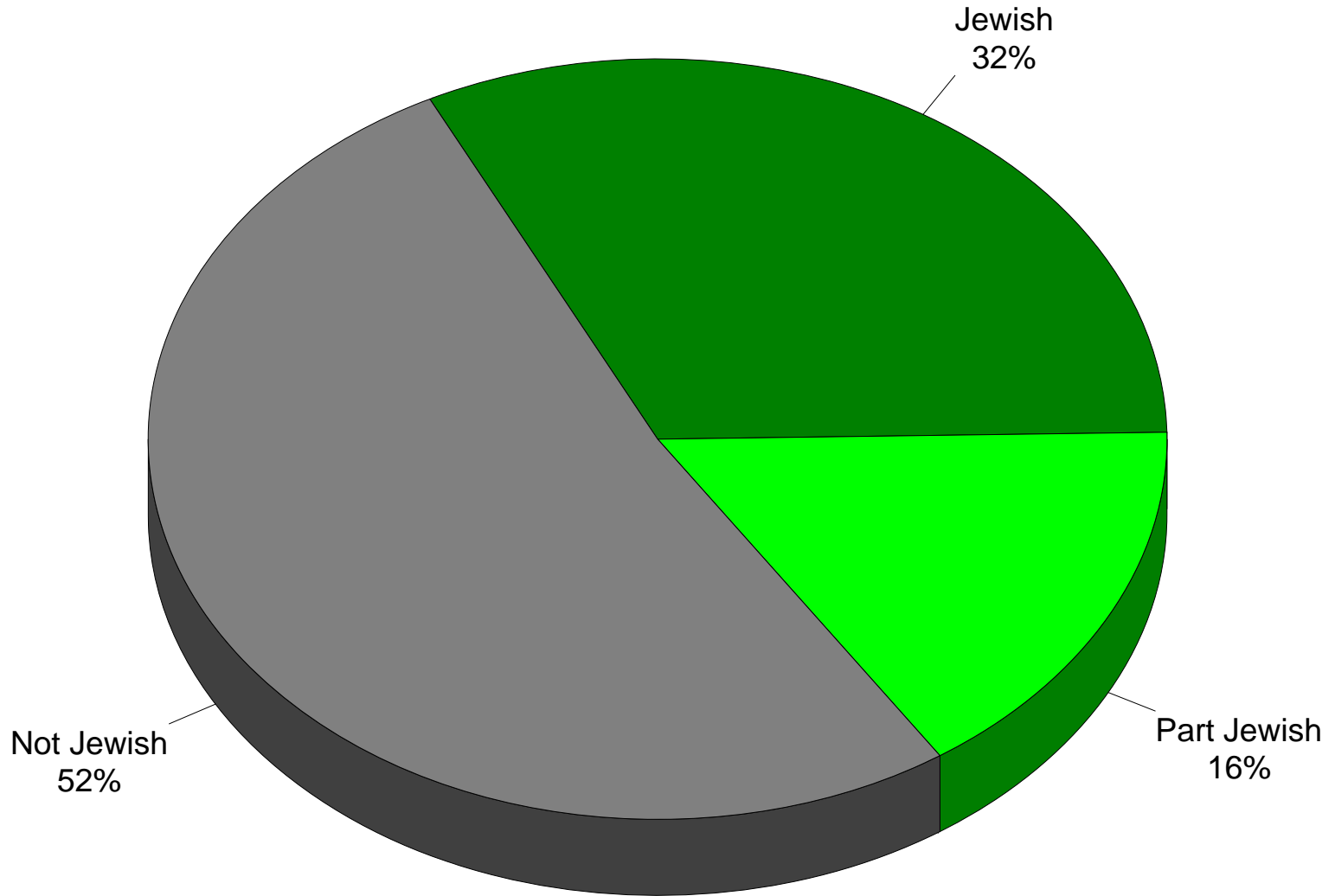
Percentage of Married Jewish Persons Who Are Married to Non-Jews by Age

(Individual Inter-marriage Rate)



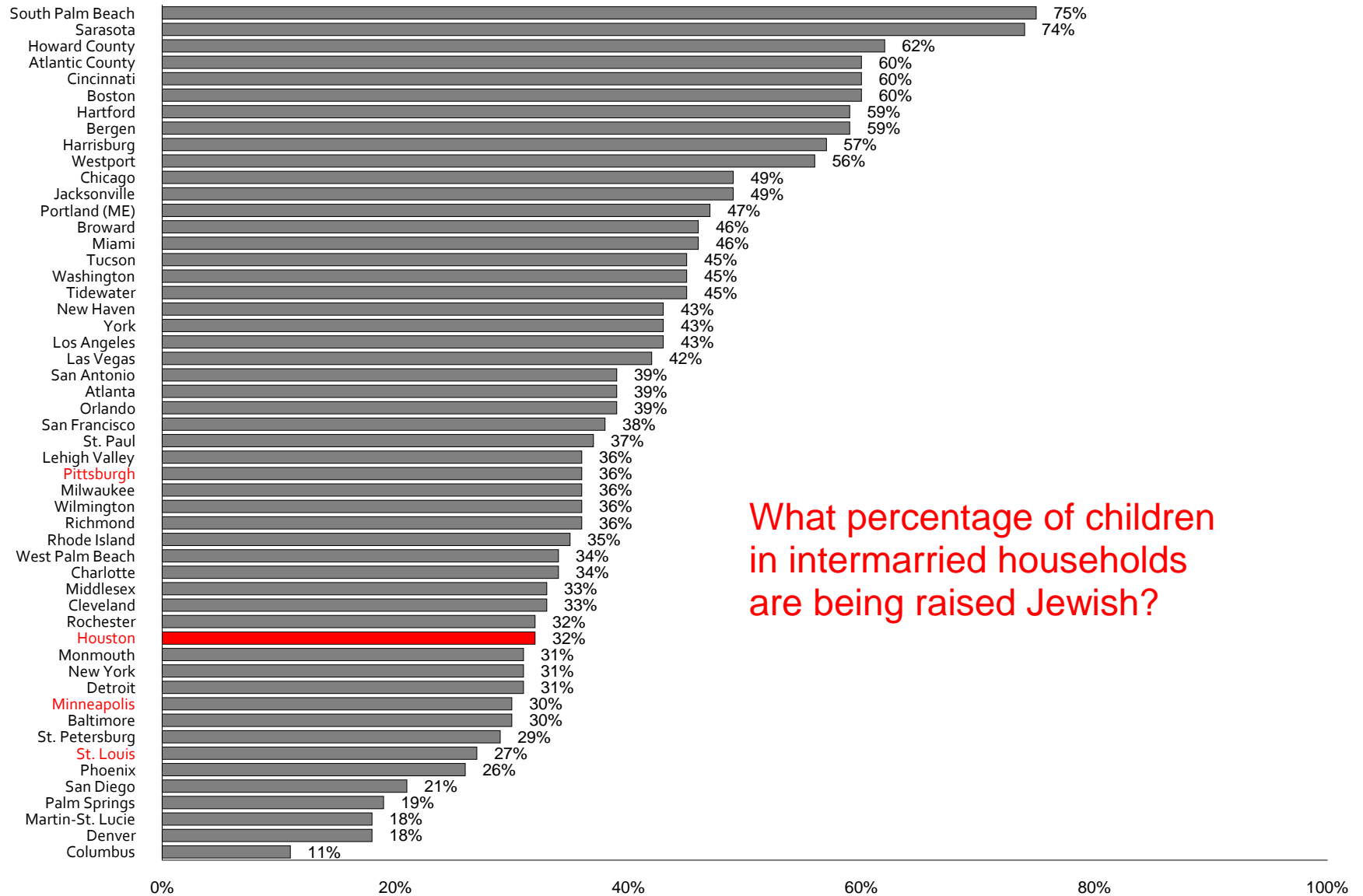

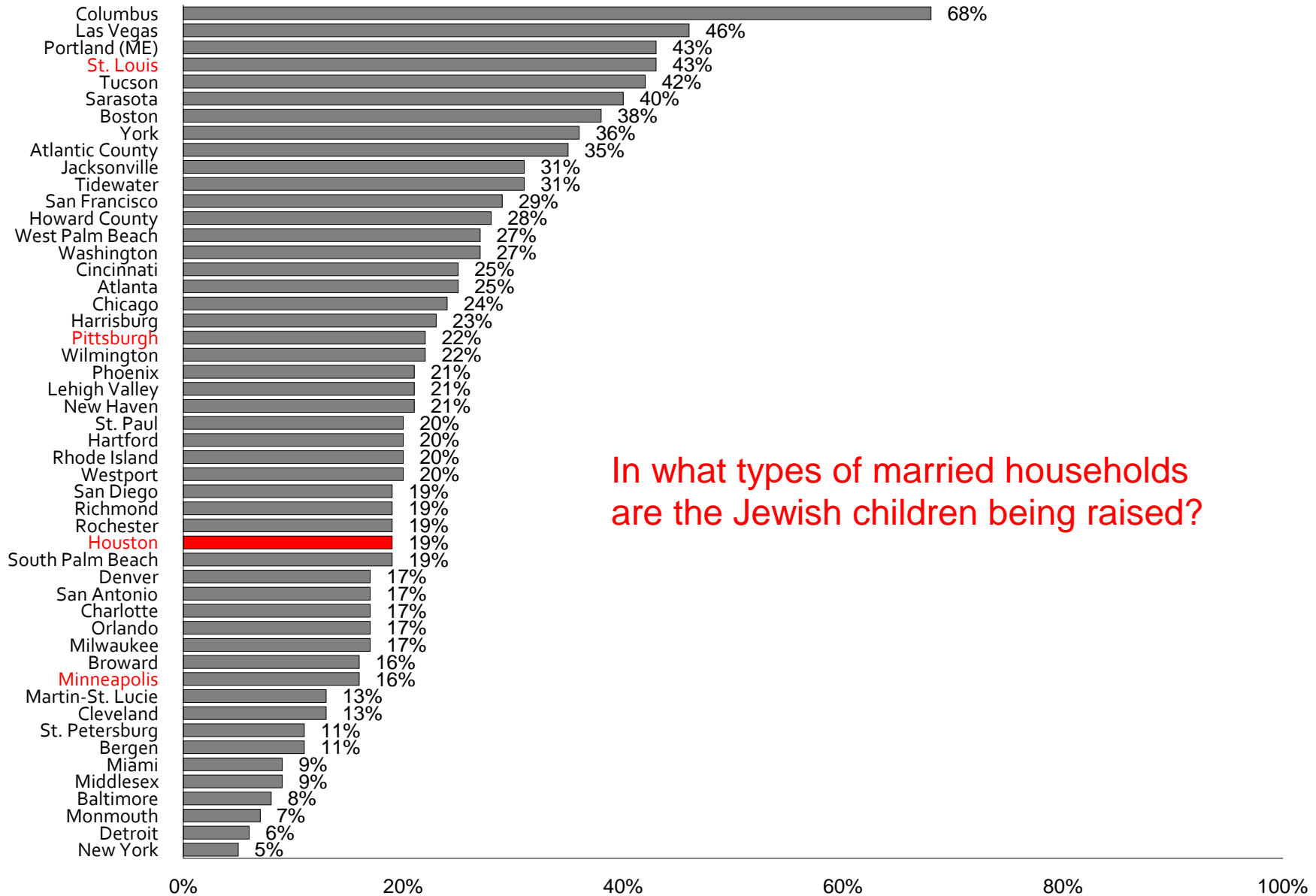

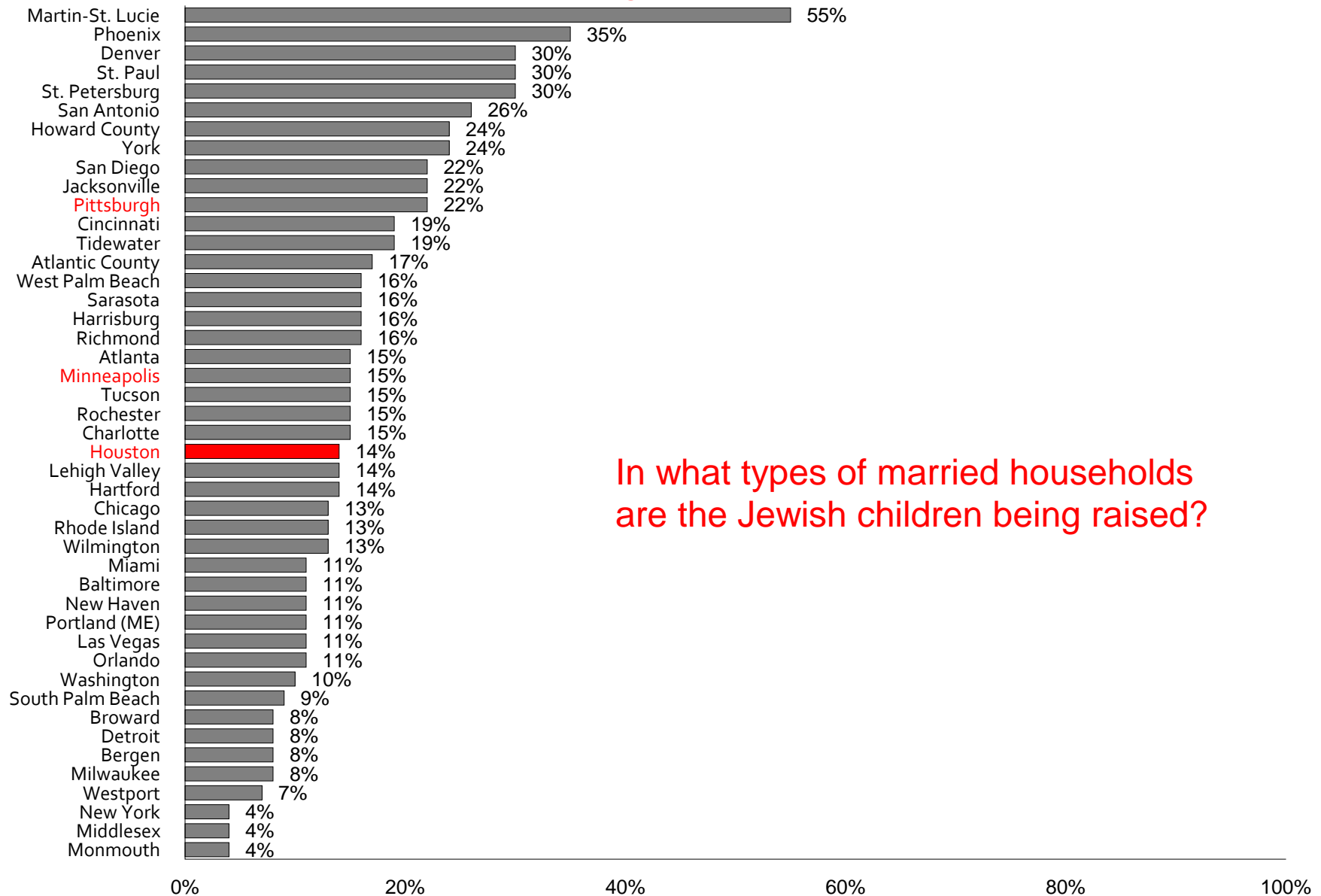

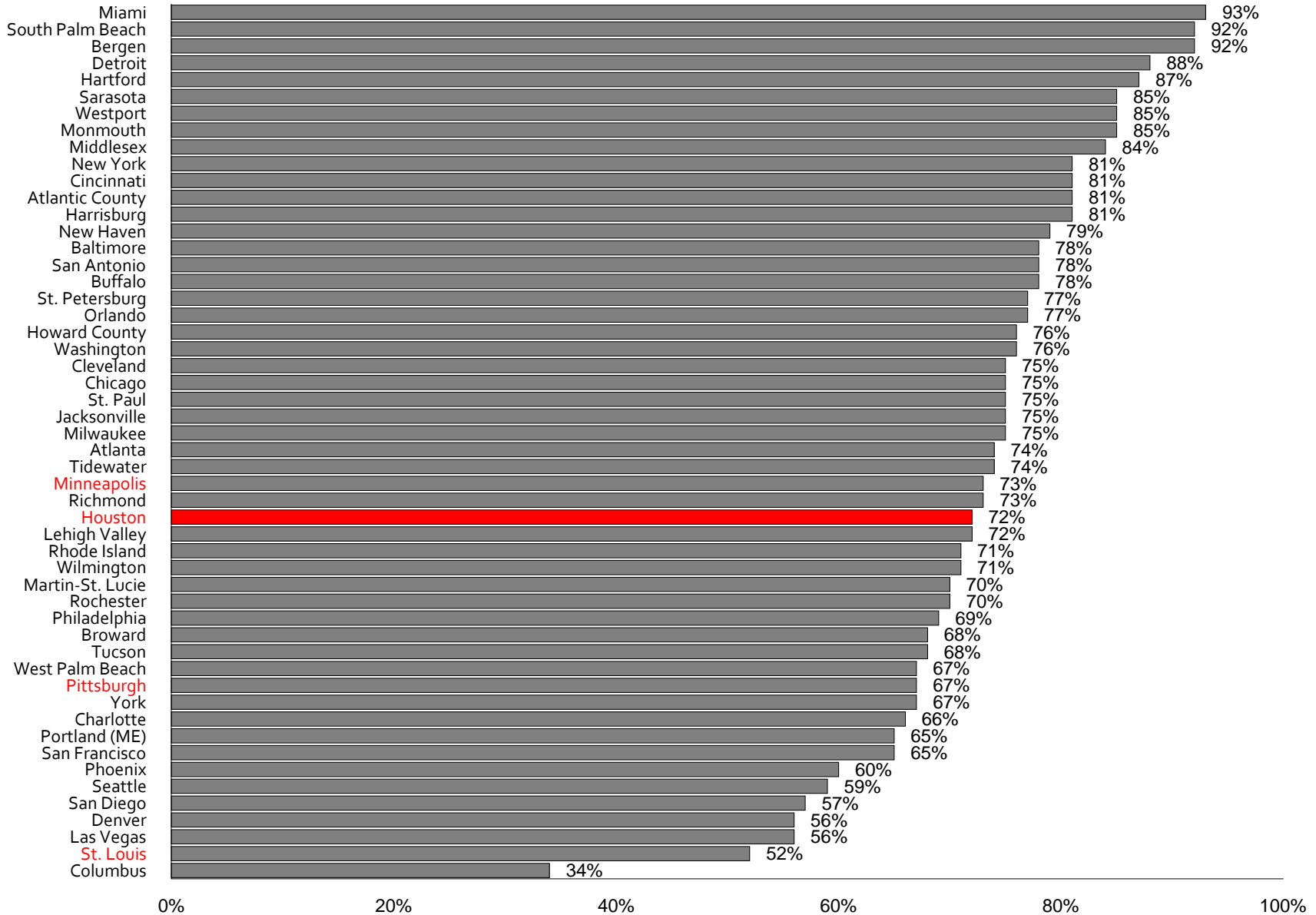

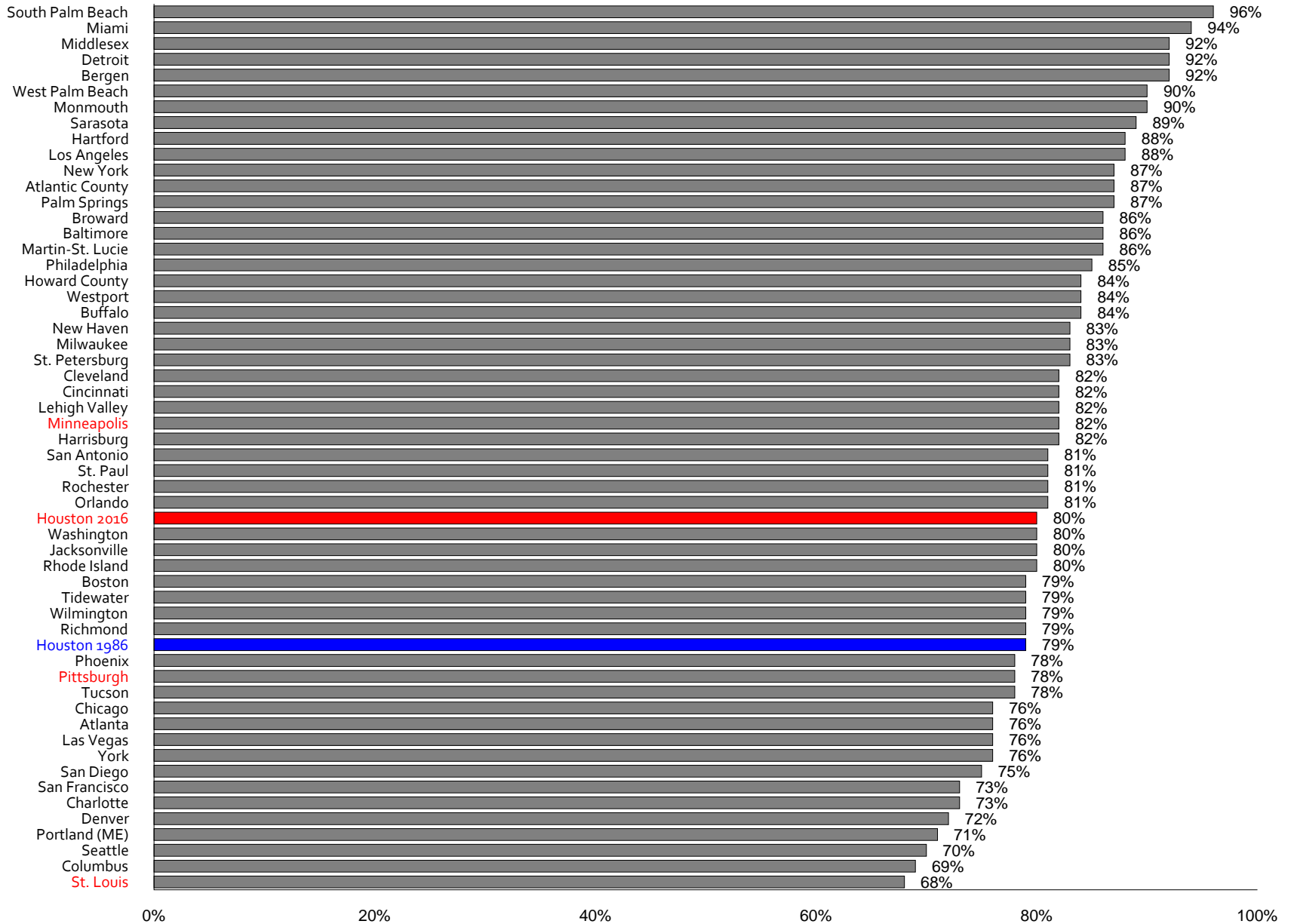
