Gov. Hogan Announces Expansion of BOOST Initiative

Governor Hogan visited our community on December 13 and announced plans to put more money into the BOOST initiative to provide scholarships to deserving families of children attending private day schools. The Governor will seek to double the \$5 million in this year's budget to \$10 million over the next three years. Hundreds of students, parents, teachers and school administrators thanked the Governor during his visit to the Bais Yaakov School. BJC Executive Committee member Elizabeth Green, who was appointed by the Governor to serve on the statewide BOOST advisory commission, spoke at the event and introduced the Governor.

Elijah Cummings Youth Program: D.C. to N.Y.C.

On December 6, the ECYP fellows visited the United States Capitol and The National Museum of African American History and Culture.
