Some Jews will not participate in events during Shabbat. Hanukkah and Purim do not require an absence from school or work.

EXPLANATION OF HOLIDAYS

ROSH HASHANA

Jewish New Year; marks the beginning of the period considered the High Holy Days.

YOM KIPPUR

Day of Atonement, the hollest day of the Jewish year.

SUKKOT

Eight-day harvest and thanksgiving festival.

SHMINI ATZERET

The final day of Sukkot.

SIMCHAT TORAH

Joyous holiday that marks the completion of the yearly cycle of reading the Hebrew Bible (Torah) and the beginning of the next cycle.

HANUKKAH*

Eight-day festival of lights, commemorating the rededication of the ancient Temple in Jerusalem.

PURIM*

Festive holiday commemorates the rescue of the Jewish community in ancient Persia based on the Book of Esther.

PESACH (PASSOVER)

Eight-day festival that celebrates the exodus of Jews from slavery in Egypt. The first two and last two days are observed as holy days.

SHAVUOT

Celebrates the receiving of the Torah by the Israelites on Mt. Sinal.

SHABBAT

The Jewish Sabbath is observed every Friday evening to Saturday evening. Observant Jews refrain from work to devote time to prayer, reflection, and rest.
