





BIO:

Michael Craig Palmer is a photographer whose work has recently documented the architectural legacy of the German Jewish exodus from Germany in the 1930s. His first photo book, published by the Bauhaus Center, Tel Aviv in 2016, documents previously ignored aspects of 1930s buildings in Tel Aviv's historic "White City" district, a center for German and other central European refugees in the 1930s. A selection of Michael's White City photos was exhibited at the Bauhaus Center, Tel Aviv in 2016, at the Bauhaus-Universität, Weimar, Germany in April 2017, in May 2018 in Berlin at the Deutsch-Israelische Gesellschaft (DIG) and in March 2019 at the provincial parliament in Magdeburg, Saxony-Anhalt, Germany.

Michael's most recently completed project was to photograph buildings of the great German Jewish architect Eric Mendelsohn, from the Einstein Tower near Berlin, Mendelsohn's breakthrough building, to Temple Emanuel in Grand Rapids, Michigan, his last building, including his buildings in Israel. Mendelsohn's adaptation of the spare Modernist ethic to a softer, lyrical style has put him on many short lists for influential architects of the twentieth century.



Michael began his photography career in 2015 with the Tel Aviv White City project. Previously, he had a career in the quantitative sciences.

In 1942 Paris, gifted architect Lucien Bernard accepts a commission that will bring him a great deal of money - and maybe get him killed. But if he's clever enough, he'll avoid any trouble. All he has to do is design a secret hiding place for a wealthy Jewish man, a space so invisible that even the most determined German officer won't find it. He sorely needs the money, and outwitting the Nazis who have occupied his beloved city is a challenge he can't resist.

But when one of his hiding spaces fails horribly, and the problem of where to hide a Jew becomes terribly personal, Lucien can no longer ignore what's at stake. The Paris Architect asks us to consider what we owe each other, and just how far we'll go to make things right.
