This is a self-nomination and nomination process. Please attach a letter to the end of the application written by yourself or the nominating party expressing your leadership experiences and potential.

Selection Criteria

No more than twelve individuals will be selected to participate in Cohort 2 for the Greensboro Federation Leadership Institute (“G-FLI” or “the program”). The Greensboro Jewish Federation encourages applicants who are not selected to reapply in subsequent years due to the limited number of participants. Participants will be chosen by a G-FLI Selection Committee. Selection will be based upon the information provided in the application and the following:

- Individuals who have demonstrated leadership through community service and a sincere commitment, motivation and interest to continue to serve the Greensboro Jewish Community in leadership roles and as an ambassador to the greater community.
- Individuals who have committed to making the necessary time *and financial* commitments necessary to complete program via attendance to all meetings and events, active engagement, and *paid deposit of \$150*.
- Individuals who intend to seek leadership roles with the Greensboro Jewish Federation and its constituent agencies upon completion of G-FLI.
- Individuals who are willing to commit to living in Greensboro for a minimum of three (3) years.

Couples are welcome to apply, but separate applications must be completed by each individual.

Expectations

- Attendance at all sessions.
- Active involvement in mentorship component.
- Serve in leadership role or conduct leadership project during Year 2.
- Ability to travel for conferences and or study mission (1-2 times) during program.

G-FLI provides leadership development through a Jewish lens; highlighted by immersive experiential education combined with active learning, in an effort to strengthen our Greensboro Jewish Community. G-FLI Session Outcomes: Year 1

G-FLI Orientation: Federation 101

- Develop an overall understanding of G-FLI; including an overview of the program, introduction of program participants, program outcomes, expectations, and responsibilities.
- Become knowledgeable about the mission, goals, structure, and staff of the Greensboro Jewish Federation.

G-FLI Launch: Learn to Soar!

- Explore how knowledge of one's personal social identity can enhance or detract from leadership effectiveness.
- Identify personal leadership strengths and attributes as compared to leaders identified as both good/strong and bad/weak.

Leading Self- The Power of Perception and Relational Leadership

- Increase self-awareness around 3 specific interpersonal skills: inclusion, control, affection, including information on how others may perceive you.
- Examine the power of perception and the impact on relational leadership skills.

Religion- How Am I JEWnique?

- Identify qualities and strengths of Jewish leadership.
- Achieving a level of comfort talking about authentic Judaism and continuous Jewish growth.

Leading Self and Others-Leadership and Management- A Balancing Act

- Examine the differences between Leadership and Management.
- Learn how to apply these concepts to day-to-day operations on committees and boards and in the workplace and community.
- Examine two pillars of communication: establishing common meaning and shared understanding.

Legacy of Leadership

- Identify preferences and leadership qualities in Jewish leaders.
- Determine what can be gained from learning from a diverse group of Jewish Leaders.
- Applying Myers-Briggs to Jewish leadership.

Leading Others- Managing Change

- Identify your preferred style in dealing with change.
- Explore strategies for managing change and transition in the community.

Israel- A Deep Dive into a Complex Nation

- Deepen knowledge about the history and political climate of Israel.
- Learn to advocate for Israel through honest and difficult conversations about the country.

Leading in the Jewish Community Part 1- Leading Effectively by Applying Emotional Intelligence

- Identify Emotional Intelligence - one's ability to use emotions effectively in four areas: self-management, self-awareness, social awareness, and relationship management.
- Explore approaches for improving behaviors that promote more effective conflict resolution.

My Jewish Voice

- Exploring your changing and developing Jewish Identity in order to own your personal and authentic Jewish Leadership style.
- Discover what has shaped your Jewish identify, and reflect on how it has changed through G-FLI.

Leading in the Jewish Community Part 2- Building Strong, Positive, and Highly Functioning Teams

- Explore strategies for building more positive, collaborative relationships.
- Create strategies for building stronger teams within the community via inspiring commitment and accountability.
- Incorporate tools that will support the development of highly functioning teams.

G-FLI Year 2: Overview

G-FLI Year 2 is focused on experiential learning through mentorship combined with volunteer leadership roles. Each Fellow will be paired with a Mentor to help guide them through the process of choosing a leadership opportunity that best fits their interests and passions. Examples of past roles/projects have included; Campaign Chair, Event Chair, JFS Volunteer, and Constituent Agency Board Member. Fellows are welcome to develop their own unique project to satisfy this requirement.
