Minutes of the 74th Annual Meeting: Rob Roquitte moved for their adoption. Joe Shumow seconded the motion. The minutes of the 74th Annual Meeting were approved as distributed.

Financial Report: The Financial Report of the Jewish Federation of Madison, covering the period ending February 28, 2015, was printed on pages 6 and 7 of the 2015 Annual Report. The report was audited by the public accounting firm of Reilly, Penner, & Benton, LLP. Deborah Minkoff entered a motion for its acceptance. Alicia Schiff seconded it. The Financial Report was approved unanimously.

Awards: The Jewish Federation of Madison has a history of recognizing outstanding volunteer contributions through several awards. It is the tradition of the Federation to have the previous award recipient announce the award winner for the current year. Miriam Singer Sulman Young Leadership Award: Zach Galin, the 2014 recipient of the award, presented the 2015 award to Lainie Minkoff. Lainie shared a few remarks after accepting the award. Congratulations to Lainie on this well-deserved award.

Ben Minkoff Volunteer Service Award: Jordy Loeb presented the award to Eric Schwartz. The speech can be read in the December 2015 edition of the *Madison Jewish News*. Congratulations to Eric on this well-deserved award.

Andrea J. Stein Jewish Community Professional Award: This award was established in 2014, after Andrea, a beloved community and staff member, died suddenly and unexpectedly in October of 2013. It is awarded annually to a Jewish community professional who promotes Jewish community outreach, engagement, and action that best serves k'lal Yisrael. It comes with a \$250 stipend to be used by the awardee for career development. The award will be made yearly by the Jewish Federation of Madison executive committee with input from the Jewish Federation of Madison staff and the Stein family. James Stein presented the award to Ellen Weismer. Congratulations to Ellen on this well-deserved award.

Nominating Committee Report: Alicia Schiff reported. The members of this year's nominating committee included Deborah Minkoff, Dan Mitchell, Marc Shovers, James Stein, Dan Weiss, Alicia Schiff, and Stefanie Kushner. The report of the nominating committee can be found on page 15 of the 2015 Annual Report. Board members were asked to stand up to be recognized. New board members were recognized and welcomed as well: Mark Blitz, Randy Blumenstein, Janet Frenz, Lee Lazar, Jon Rozenfeld, Jesse Sondel, and Faye Zemel. A motion to approve the slate was made by Joel Minkoff, seconded by Joe Shumow, and unanimously approved. Special recognition was given to those board members who completed their terms of service. The annual meeting recessed and the newly-elected board of directors (page 15 of the 2015 Annual Report) was called into session. Steve Lipton made a motion to elect the new officers and at-large members of the executive committee. Lester Pines made a second. The slate was approved.

James Stein, upon completion of his presidency, was presented with a shofar and Dina Weinbach shared some accolades in honor of his leadership.

2016 Annual Report The Year In Review

The Jewish Federation of Madison's mission guides us as we work toward building a strong and unified Jewish community which will ensure the survival, well-being and continuity of the Jewish people locally, in Israel, and throughout the world. Our community strives to accomplish these goals through the many services and programs the Jewish Federation of Madison provides and supports.

SUPPORTING THOSE IN NEED

The 2015 **Tzedakah Campaign** closed at \$999,469. The goal for the 2016 Tzedakah Campaign, led by Alicia Schiff, is **\$1,018,000**.

From its very inception in 1940 and to this day, we fulfill our strong commitment to the **collective responsibility** for Jews throughout the world through our support of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, the Jewish Agency for Israel, World ORT, the Jewish Federations of North America, and several national Jewish organizations: Jewish Council for Public Affairs, Anti-Defamation League, Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society, and the Jewish Labor Committee.

This past year our community helped resettle refugees from Syria in Jordan, Israel, Europe, and other places through the work of the Joint Distribution Committee and Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society. Our community helped victims of Hurricane Matthew and continues to help hurricane victims in Nepal. When terror strikes the people of Israel help arrives through the Jewish Agency for Israel and the Fund for Victims of Terror.

Camp Shalom Scholarship Fund - \$105,500 was awarded to 193 campers who would otherwise be unable to attend camp. Camp Shalom has never denied a child a camp experience based on financial need. We are extremely proud of this accomplishment, and are thankful for the generous support of our scholarship donors.

Gan HaYeled Scholarships - A total of \$15,500 in full and partial scholarships was given to students in one or more of Gan HaYeled's preschool programs. Not surprisingly, the financial needs of our community's preschool families continue to grow.

STRENGTHENING OUR COMMUNITY

The Jewish Federation of Madison was one of the founding members of the Madison Metropolitan School District's Superintendent's Human Relations Advisory Council (**SHRAC**) in the 1960's. The Federation is involved in the ongoing work to assure the success of all students in our public schools. The Federation's Executive Director, Dina Weinbach, is currently one of the co-chairs of SHRAC.

The Federation monitors and responds to incidents of **anti-Semitism** in our community and is ever vigilant in protecting individual and civil rights and safety for Jews and indeed for all people.

Community Outreach efforts this past year included meeting with over 50 families who are new to Madison, who recently had a baby, or who want to learn more about the Jewish community. The primary charge of our Outreach Program is to connect and engage individuals and families with the many opportunities available to live Jewishly in the Madison area. Programs this past year included twenty-eight families in the Yad B'Yad (parent/caregiver/baby) group; thirty-four active players on the "Matzah Balls" sports team (since fall 2015, they have played five sports: kickball, dodgeball, volleyball, flag football, and basketball); two clothing swaps a year; created a JAM (Jewish Adults of Madison) group geared toward those with more time for themselves; and a SPF (Singles, Professionals and Families) group to help build a strong Jewish community and develop new leaders through meaningful social, educational, and philanthropic activities for adults in their 20s, 30s, and 40s.

Other programs through the Jewish Federation of Madison that engage and involve community members of different ages include **Future Directions**, a leadership development program where participants learn, engage, and decide their path for future involvement in the Jewish community; **Yom Ha'Atzmaut**, an opportunity for the local community to celebrate Israel's Birthday; **Yom Hashoah**, a community-wide program to commemorate the Holocaust; annual **Teachers' Convention**, open to all Jewish educators; the **Hava Nagila Jewish Community Picnic**, an annual event to gather people in the community to kick off the summer and experience the vibrancy of Jewish life in the area.

Madison Jewish News, the Federation's monthly newspaper, in its 49th year, continues to fulfill its commitment to excellence as a vehicle for reaching our growing Jewish community, emphasizing local Jewish news and information in a colorful and contemporary newspaper format. **Jewish Madison**, published every two years, showcases the breadth of Jewish life in the Madison area, including information about religious institutions, social service resources, educational opportunities, community groups, social-action organizations, and cultural resources.

The Jewish Federation of Madison continues its online presence with our website, **JewishMadison.org**, Twitter, Insta-

gram, and Facebook. More than 1,400 community members also subscribe to our weekly Monday morning e-newsletter to receive timely and important information and announcements. JewishMadison.org is underwritten by our generous corporate sponsors: BMO Harris Bank, Madison Computer Works, and Rubin's Furniture.

The Jewish Federation of Madison continues to fund and support **Jewish Social Services, UW Hillel, the Wisconsin Jewish Conference, Chabad at the University of Wisconsin**, and the **Madison Jewish Community Day School**.

ENGAGING OUR CHILDREN

Camp Shalom, for campers entering kindergarten through grade five, completed its 62nd summer, the sixteenth at the Irwin A. and Robert D. Goodman Jewish Community Campus. We served a total of 656 campers this summer. **Camp Shalom Noar Bogrim**, completed its fourth summer. This program, for sixth through ninth grade children, served 225 campers. The ninth grade program itself served 50 campers.

The success of Camp Shalom is due to many factors, the staff being the most important. We were privileged to have 115 staff serving our two day camps this past summer.

Winter Maccabiah, the winter version of Camp Shalom held over winter break, served 31 campers with 17 staff.

One Happy Camper - In partnership with the Foundation for Jewish Camping, the Federation made available up to \$1,000 per camper and helped send thirteen children to Jewish resident camps for the first time.

The **Hilde L. Mosse Gan HaYeled Preschool** offers programs for newborns through age five with year-round, all-day offerings. We have eight children enrolled in our Dalet program (4-and 5-year-olds), six in Gimel (3-year-olds), nine in the Bet (2-year-olds) program, and we also offer a Schmooze and Tunes music program for children three years and younger. We served twenty-seven children in Camp Shalom Katan, our summer program. Gan HaYeled, now in its 46th year, continues to offer excellence in curriculum, programming, and Jewish learning.

Midrasha Hebrew High School, the joint post-B'nai Mitzvah program of the Federation, Beth Israel Center, and Temple Beth El, began its 41st year with seventy students enrolled. Seventeen are newly-entering eighth grade students. Twenty-two students are studying Hebrew. The eleventh and

twelfth grades have twenty-three students enrolled; thirteen of them seniors. Since its inception, the Federation has provided incentive scholarships to graduating seniors. For the sixth year in a row, the Laurence A. Weinstein Midrasha Incentive Award of up to \$2,000 was awarded to graduating seniors - ten last May - for continuing Jewish education in college or educational trips to Israel taken within the first two years after High School graduation.

Yonim, Madison's outstanding Israeli folk dance program, is open to all students from kindergarten through 12th grade. Fifteen students take part in Yonim.

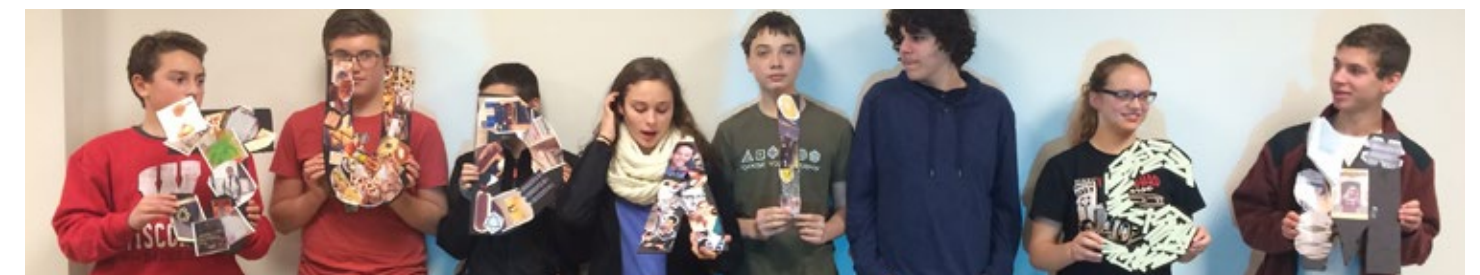
Family Education Programs included Spirituality in Early Childhood, Tu B'Shvat Seder and Slides, Kindness Wins Online Safety Workshop, Michael Twitty Kosher Soul, Hamantashen Baking Workshop, Pizza by the Pool, and a Hanukkah Mitzvah Day.

CONNECTING WITH ISRAEL

Partnership Together (P2G) is a program of the Jewish Agency of Israel and has become a paradigm of success, partnering 550 global Jewish communities directly with 45 Israeli communities, the majority of which are in national priority areas. Communities share ideas, strengths, challenges, and models of success, empowering one another to generate waves of change. And the impact of these projects goes far beyond the community level - each of us has the opportunity to become directly and personally involved. Madison has joined Milwaukee, Tulsa, and St. Paul in partnering with the Sovev Kinneret region in Israel. P2G programming this past year included a visit from ten Israelis who came to Madison to run the marathon; Project Tzeva (art projects done simultaneously with Madison and Sovev Kinneret participants); and more.

Community Shlichim - In August, we began the fourteenth year of participating in the Shlichut program offered by JAFI (Jewish Agency for Israel). Daniel Gil and Shirly Raiz-Gil entered their second year of Shlichut. The Shlichim work hard to develop, organize, and facilitate educational programs about Israel for all parts of the Jewish community. They offer resources related to travel to Israel and promoting Aliyah; they enhance the development and commitment of lay leadership; and they reinforce the community's enduring connection to Israel and the Israeli people.

Israel Trip Stipends for High School Students - Four grants of \$1,500 each were awarded to high school students who participated in a three week or longer organized trip to Israel.

Ben Minkoff Volunteer Service Award

Named in memory of former Jewish Federation of Madison president and founder of Camp Shalom, the Ben Minkoff award honors an individual with a record of committed service to the Jewish Federation of Madison and the Madison Jewish community stretching over a period of time, doing volunteer work beyond its usual definition.
