A Message of Thanks

From Our Board President and Executive Director

We will undoubtedly remember 2023 as a most challenging year for the Jewish Federation of Madison and our community. The spring began with a new coalition government in Israel – the most far-right government in its history. Israelis took to the streets in great numbers to protest against the proposed changes to its judicial system and the role of religion in its society. Our organization joined the Jewish Federations of North America, along with many other local Federations and communities, in speaking out against the government’s ideology, which would leave thousands of our Jewish community members on the outside looking in, and advocating for a compromise that recognized democracy must include both majority rule and the protection of minority rights.

At the same time, our Jewish Federation programs thrived here in Madison. Camp Shalom enjoyed a fun-filled summer and is developing plans for a significant expansion to allow 150 children to get off the waiting list annually and experience all the camp offers. Gan HaYeled Preschool strengthened its partnership with Wisconsin’s Pyramid Model as a Program-wide Implementation Site to support all children’s social and emotional development. Gan is also growing, with enrollment breaking new records year after year. Midrasha Hebrew High School continues to provide our Jewish teens with the right blend of socializing with peers, a supportive, safe space, and stimulating classes that encourage them to ask questions and remain engaged in their Jewish community. Additionally, hundreds of families with young children enjoyed a wealth of in-person programs and free monthly books celebrating Jewish life and culture through our sponsorship of PJ Library.

The momentum did not stop there. The Jewish Federation of Madison Executive Committee and Board structured a plan for financial security to compensate for the loss of our largest annual contribution from the Goodman Foundation. We

welcomed members of our MadCAB leadership development program onto Federation board panels and committees, where they are bringing new perspectives and energy to our work. Our Community Grants program, supported by the generous bequest from Cheryl Rosen Westin, continued to fund local organizations, awarding grants to eight exciting projects during the year that are working to advance social justice, build community partnerships, and improve the well-being of all community members (see Agencies & Programs We Fund on page 9 for details).

Then, on October 7, Hamas horrifically attacked Israel, and our world was turned upside down. We mourn the lives of 1,200 people brutally killed by terrorists on that day and the heartbreaking losses in the ensuing war. We pray for the 134 hostages still unaccounted for, all those in harm’s way, and for a lasting peace. As we watched the frequency of local antisemitic acts rise sharply, we responded to incidents reported, supporting parents, school districts, and youth alike. We are working closely with law enforcement and the ADL to create new partnerships beyond the Jewish community to counter antisemitism and fight all forms of hate.

The vital work we do to serve our community is only possible with the support of our board leadership, our dedicated volunteers and activists, and the generosity of hundreds of donors to the 2023 Annual Tzedakah Campaign. Because of your compassion, combined with that of many others in our community, we grew our annual campaign from last year, raising \$960,380, and additionally raised \$303,000 for the Emergency Campaign to Support Israeli Victims of Terror. We want to recognize the contributions of every one of you with our heartfelt thanks!

Together, we will work in good times and challenging ones to provide spaces for connection and healing and build our flourishing Madison Jewish community – today, tomorrow, and always.

We engaged with Jewish life and each other



Creating moments of togetherness

Our **community annual events brought us together in celebration** of Yom HaAtzmaut, a Pre-Hanukkah Party, and the Hava Nagila Jewish Community Picnic, and **meaningful commemoration** for Yom HaZikaron and the Yom HaShoah Service and Program - which featured "Singing the Shoah: Songs of Pain, Songs of Strength, Songs of Life, Songs of Remembrance," an incredible performance of music from the Holocaust. Our **monthly adult programming** included nature hikes with time for schmoozing over bagels and coffee.

Creating moments strengthening Jewish identity and learning

38 teens attended our **Midrasha Hebrew High School** program offering Judaic and Hebrew classes this fall semester, growing to 40 by winter. At the graduation celebration in May, we proudly **presented all 10 Midrasha Class of 2023 graduates with a Midrasha Incentive award**, eligible for up to \$2,000 toward continued Jewish education.



Creating moments celebrating Jewish values and culture

We became the local implementing partner of **PJ Library** in the Madison area this year. Our sponsorship of this exciting program **provided 416 children with 1,747 free monthly specially curated storybooks** celebrating Jewish values and culture, delivered a monthly e-newsletter to 290 subscribers, and offered 15 engaging events and activities throughout the year attended by 322 families with young children.



Creating moments of life-changing magic for kids

Camp Shalom and **NOBO** had another fantastic, fun-filled, inclusive summer with **613 campers (filling 976 spots) and 111 staff and CITs**...and winter with 57 campers and 19 staff. In December, we hired our first Assistant Director of Staff Recruitment and Retention in a newly created year-round position to support Camp Shalom's growth.

Creating moments of welcoming (and farewell)

Through our **Shalom Baby** and **Shalom Madison** programs, we **welcomed 41 new babies and 80 new residents** to our Madison Jewish community with a special gift bag, helped connect people to local Jewish resources, and make social connections. We bid l'hitraot to our Community Shlichim, Hanna and Oz, after 2 incredible years.



Creating moments of kindness (and budding entrepreneurialism)

What began as a kind gesture with a few **Gan HaYeled Preschoolers** offering extra challahs to the staff who work in the building transformed into a full-fledged, weekly challah-baking venture, **Café B'Gan**. 18 three-to-five-year-old classmates run the entire enterprise (except for using the oven). On Thursdays, the children partner up to take orders, and on Fridays, ten children typically elect to stay in from recess and spend one and a half hours braiding challahs and reading the order forms to place on the appropriate toppings. Gan HaYeled had **40 children enrolled during the summer and started this fall with 41**.

We cared for the vulnerable



Creating moments that empower people to thrive

We awarded **8 inspiring and impactful projects** with a Jewish Federation of Madison **Community Grant** of up to \$10,000 each through the Cheryl Rosen Weston Fund to support projects that work to advance social justice, build community partnerships, and improve the well-being of all community members. We **packed 46 emergency food pantry bags weighing 842 pounds** on National Day of Jewish Service; donated 458 pounds of food and detergent and **filled bags with approximately 400 meals** for Way Forward Resources; made cards

and Purim bags for **Mishloach Manot** delivered to older adults through Jewish Social Services; 40 older and young adult volunteers participated in a **co-generational program** to share and helped document their stories; and we sent a group of **21 emerging and seasoned Jewish leaders** on a 3-day Civil Rights Social Justice Journey to the Southern United States through our **MadCAB program**.

We built and strengthened communal networks and security



Creating moments that countered antisemitism and hate

We partnered on local and national social media initiatives, including Stand Up to Jewish Hate, to **raise awareness against antisemitism**. Our online reporting form provided a way to track antisemitic incidents in our community and get support. We joined more than a dozen other community organizations asking the Madison School District to remove Charles Lindbergh's name from the elementary school. Our Executive Director, Alan Klugman, gave the invocation at the King Coalition Madison-Dane County MLK Day Observance, the keynote address at Mt. Horeb School District's diversity, equity, and inclusion learning session, and was quoted in the press every opportunity he got to speak out against hate. We were honored to accept the Middleton Common Council's proclamation to raise awareness against antisemitism on behalf of our Jewish community.



Creating moments to foster dialogue

Representatives from our organization’s leadership attended the **General Assembly (GA)** hosted by the Jewish Federations of North America, which **brought together 3,000 Jewish leaders** of diverse backgrounds to foster productive dialogue and debate. A first-of-its-kind JEDI (Jewish Equity, Diversity & Inclusion) Leadership Mission to Israel for nearly **30 Jewish leaders of Color** preceded the GA. Chancellor Jennifer Mnookin presented at our Community Forum in January, reflecting on the **shared values and strong connections** between the university and the Madison Jewish community.



Creating moments of belonging

At our 2023 Annual Tzedakah Campaign Kickoff, keynote speaker Stacey Aviva Flint, Director of Education and Engagement for Jewish Federation of North America’s Jewish Equity Diversity and Inclusion (JEDI) department, shared her personal story and inspired us with this message: **“We have an amazing opportunity to create a culture of belonging by giving the currency of belonging, having the vision of belonging, [...] Jewish Madison, you are the leaders for such a time as this.**



We connected with Israel and the Jewish people worldwide

Creating moments of solidarity

In the immediate aftermath of the horrific attacks on October 7 by Hamas, our Madison Jewish came together for a Community Prayer Vigil for Israel; we curated and offered resources online for how to help and stay informed; **joined 290,000 people in Washington DC** (and 250,000 online) at the **March for Israel**; and launched our Emergency Campaign to Support Israeli Victims of Terror **raising over \$303K locally to date**. As of December 31, **Jewish Federations have collectively raised more than \$768.5 million** system-wide and allocated over \$270.2 million to a wide range of humanitarian organizations in Israel (see page 6 for details).



Creating moments of speaking out

In March, our Executive Director Alan Klugman and Executive Committee Board Member, Overseas and National Panel Chair, and Past President Deborah Minkoff joined **30 Federation leaders from over 20 different communities** on a special **24-hour fly-in** to Jerusalem to meet with Israel’s political, civic, and business leaders to express concerns over proposed judicial reforms, issuing a joint statement at the conclusion.

Jewish Federations' Response In Israel

Our Impact Since October 7

On October 7, Jewish communities around the world awoke with horror and disbelief as we learned that terrorists from Gaza had infiltrated Israel and committed unthinkable violence. More than 1,200 innocent people lost their lives, 240 Israelis and people of other nationalities were abducted and taken hostage to Gaza, and nearly 2,000 people were wounded during the brutal terror attacks.

The Need

239,000+ people in Israel evacuated

117,000+ individuals do not know when they can return home

As communities around the world processed the worst atrocities in modern Jewish history, they knew they could count on the Jewish Federation system. Thanks to our powerful network across North America, global reach, and vetting process that allows us to get dollars where they are needed most, Jewish Federations were there, ready to respond. Our system launched in full force, assessing needs, connecting with NGOs on the ground, and coordinating in real time with foundations and the Israeli government. We raised an incredible amount of funding and began making a significant impact.
