

## About Jeffrey N. Gingold

Jeffrey is an internationally acclaimed and award-winning author. He has been a guest on *The Montel Williams Show*, NPR, numerous webcasts, and national talk radio shows. Jeffrey is a published freelance writer and has authored and been interviewed for numerous articles in US and international publications, including *The Times of Israel* and *The Forward*. In 2014, his first book was translated into Polish and in 2015, his second book was released in Dutch.

Based upon recorded interviews with his grandmother and father, Jeffrey's newest book, *Tunnel, Smuggle, Collect: A Holocaust Boy*, shares his father's epic survival as a young boy in the Warsaw Ghetto. The gripping true story holds nothing back, receiving worldwide acclaim and the 2016 Finalist Midwest Independent Publishing Book Award. Jeffrey also received an award from the Jewish War Veterans for his "dedication"

to telling the stories of history" and personal acknowledgment from the United States Army for supporting "Learning from the Holocaust: Legacy of Perseverance" education.

In 2018, his current book was recorded and is now available by the Audio and Braille Literacy Enhancement. Jeffrey enjoys family time with his wife, Terri, and their two bright and beautiful daughters, Lauren and Meredith.
