### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO**

It has been a year of growth and change for the Winnipeg Jewish community, filled with challenges that we have overcome and successes that must be celebrated. As we reflect back on 80 years of serving our community, we do so with the awareness that we must continue to build on the foundation of what has allowed our community to flourish, while addressing the needs of a community that is constantly undergoing renewal and change.

It is after this reflection that we also realize that we would not be where we are without you, our loyal donors, to whom we are so grateful for your enduring support. The 2017 Combined Jewish Appeal (CJA) Campaign, chaired by Steve Kroft, successfully raised \$5.7 million (including our endowment interest income). In addition, the Federation's "Leave More Than Memories" endowment fund at the Jewish Foundation of Manitoba has exceeded \$4.6 million.

Unfortunately, it was a year also marred by tragedy. The attack at the Tree of Life synagogue in Pittsburgh that left 11 people dead was a painful reminder that the world's oldest hatred, antisemitism, is unfortunately still alive and well. Since that horrendous event, we have been surrounded by those who have rallied around us to stand up in the face of hatred.

Our community consultations resulted in the development of committees that will focus on the key areas of Jewish Education and Engagement, Connections and Jewish Identity, Programming for the Diverse and Modern Jewish Community, Strengthening Community Caring, and Infrastructure and Community Capacity, allowing us to focus on priorities of importance to our community.

Our continuing relationship with the Centre for Israel and Jewish Affairs (CIJA) will allow us to continue advocacy work, addressing issues that affect our community. Building upon recent successes, we look to maintain the momentum from last year on issues such as combating antisemitism, advancing inclusion for people with disabilities, countering radicalization and terrorism, improving Canada's immigration and refugee system, strengthening the volunteer sector, among others. Working with CIJA, we are continually improving security through initiatives in our community.

Operation Ezra, the initiative dedicated to the rescue and resettlement of Yazidi refugees from Iraq, continues to gain momentum. As of September 2018, we successfully settled 55 refugees in Winnipeg, who in turn are now significantly involved as volunteers for Operation Ezra, helping many of the new Yazidi refugees who are arriving. Operation Ezra continues to provide day-to-day settlement support services, furniture and clothing drives, food, housing and employment assistance, as well as social programs to Yazidi families trying to build new lives as members of our community.

This year, we celebrated 20 years of the Manitoba Provincial Nominee Program that has welcomed new families from across the globe to our growing community. Through our partnership with the government, we have created a successful process for welcoming newcomers to our city that has become a model for other communities. Since the program began, we have received over 6,000 individuals who have become important contributors to our community.

As we enter 2019, our staff looks forward to serving the needs of the community with renewed energy and purpose. Our new Public Relations and Communications Director, Adam Levy, and new Campaign Director, Rebecca Brask, joined our team at the beginning of November and look forward to cultivating relationships and strengthening the CJA campaign.

Lastly, we would like to thank the tireless work of our dedicated board, volunteers and staff without whom none of this would be possible. We look forward to working with you to continue to grow and build upon our success for many years to come.



### **AUDITORS' REPORT**

#### INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Directors of Jewish Federation of Winnipeg Inc.

The accompanying summarized financial statements, which comprise the statement of financial position as at August 31, 2018 and the statement of revenue, expenditures and allocations for the year then ended, are derived from the audited financial statements of Jewish Federation of Winnipeg Inc. for the year ended August 31, 2018. 
