### **KARYN LAZARECK**

#### **Sol Kanee Distinguished Community Service Medal**

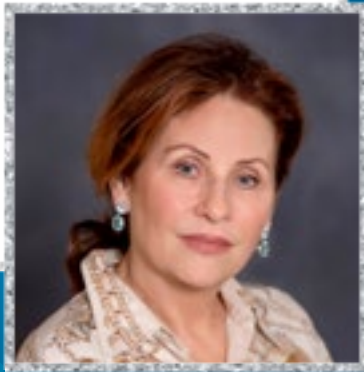
Karyn Lazareck has been a lifelong volunteer both in Canada and Israel. She has a wide variety of interests ranging from the arts to humanitarian needs, in particular those in support of children.

For many years she co-chaired the Youth Aliyah Scholarship committee, which provided funding for children in Israel with cognitive and emotional disabilities.

Karyn is best known for her commitment to improving the lives of individuals with special needs. She is the founder of G.R.O.W. (Gaining Resources Our Way), a non-denominational outreach and life skills program for young adults with special needs seeking to become more independent.

She currently sits on the planning committee for the first ever Canadian conference, "Pushing the Boundaries: Disability, Inclusion and Jewish Community" sponsored by the Jewish Federations of Canada.

Karyn is exemplary in providing philanthropic leadership and is a role model in our community. She is a past Women's Division Chair and a past recipient of the Max and Mollie Shore Memorial Award.



## MAJOR COMMUNITY AWARDS

### **ROBERT (BOB) I. SILVER**

#### **Max and Mollie Shore Memorial Award**

For more than 30 years, Bob Silver has made an extraordinary contribution to the business and community sectors at the local, national and international levels.

He is the president and co-owner of Western Glove Works Ltd. and co-owner of the Warehouse One and Urban Barn retail chains. Additionally, he is a co-owner of the Brandon Sun, the Winnipeg Free Press, the CanStar Weekly, and Derksen Printers in Steinbach.

In the business community, he has been involved on a number of boards including CentrePort Canada, the Business Council of Manitoba, the First Peoples Economic Growth Fund and the Winnipeg Convention Centre. He has served as co-chair, since its inception, of the Premier's Economic Advisory Council.

In the community-at-large, he gives his time to a multitude of causes such as the Winnipeg Library Foundation, where he helped spearhead the campaign to build the new Millennium Library. Bob was the first chair of the GrowWinnipeg initiative of the Jewish Federation. Additionally, he was the co-chair of the CJA Annual Campaign in 2014. Presently, Mr. Silver serves as the chancellor of the University of Winnipeg and as co-chair of WE Day.





# LARRY HURTIG JEWISH COMMUNAL PROFESSIONAL AWARD

## BOB FREEDMAN

Some thirty years ago, Bob Freedman, together with community leadership, developed a vision for the future of the Jewish community of Winnipeg. A plan was developed that addressed the then issues of failing infrastructure and falling demographics. This was the impetus for GrowWinnipeg – the community’s program to encourage immigration and to increase and strengthen the community’s population. After over 40 meetings with community groups big and small, formal and informal, and individuals from all walks of life, everyone understood the significance of the greatest undertaking of the time: a capital fundraising campaign that raised close to 30\$ million to build the Asper Jewish Community Campus – the diamond of our community.

After serving for a full 28 years as the CEO of the Jewish Federation of Winnipeg, Bob retired in 2014.

Bob served the Central Council of B’nai Brith, the Main Street Project, the first chair of the Board of Jewish Education and also served as the president of the Manitoba Intercultural Council. With Federation (or as it was then known – the Winnipeg Jewish Community Council), he served as chair of the Budget and Allocations Committee and as Senior Vice President. Bob also served on the boards of the St. Boniface General Hospital and the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority.

Bob has been married to Shirley for 47 years. Together, they have 2 daughters, Pam and Susie (Jason), and 5 grandchildren who are Bob’s pride and joy: Eliana, Gaby, Zach, Maddy and Emily.
