



## **SCHOOL CLOSURE DISTANCE LEARNING EDUCATIONAL PLAN**

### **Continuity of Education**

School closure does not need to mean a loss of instructional and learning time. Thus, Ezra Academy has planned high quality, distance-learning opportunities that will begin tomorrow.

The nature of the learning opportunities may differ based on the grade/age range. For example, online learning may be more feasible in the upper grades, while print-based learning materials may be more suitable in the elementary grades. The content and execution of these learning opportunities will be tied to student level learning abilities and expectations.

In addition to robust learning opportunities, we have put into place opportunities for teacher and parent communication, teacher and student communication, teacher and administrative communication and administrative and parent communication, and Board of Directors and administration communication. As always, please feel free to reach out to me if any issues or questions arise.

Finally, let me reiterate that we will remain in constant contact with health officials so that we can determine the best time for us to return to school safely.

### **Distance Learning Plan**

#### **Expectations**

Teachers will provide daily (Mon-Fri), consistent, grade, age and developmentally appropriate learning experiences for their students. Teachers will provide students with all materials they will need to participate in the distance learning program. Teachers will communicate regularly with parents and students to be sure the programming is meeting the needs of students and that parents are knowledgeable and engaged in the process. Teachers will engage regularly with each other and with the administration to ensure that educational goals are being met and students are being properly engaged in learning.

Parents will be expected to adequately supervise their children, such that schedules are followed, children have access to electronics, books and other materials they will need. Additionally, parents will be expected to be in communication with teachers as to how their children are coping, progressing and engaging with the distance learning programs. As the first line of eyes and ears on the scene, parental feedback and input will greatly

enhance teacher and administrative understanding of how these plans are playing out in actuality in your homes.

Students are expected to comply with all teacher requests for participation in online learning. Homework, assignments and projects are expected to be completed in a timely manner. Students who take electronics home are expected to care for them in a responsible manner and return them to school in the same condition that they were loaned to you. The same applies to any books or materials that are sent home.

Students are expected to be in close and regular touch with their teachers should they have any questions, concerns or questions that need to be addressed. Students may also be in touch with Dr. Waynik, should they require any time to discuss issues that may arise. Students are expected to abide by all school rules, expectations and honor codes while taking part in distance learning programs.

## **Schedules**

They will also be posted on Google Classroom for further consultation. Teachers will send out schedules and assignments regularly for the duration of the school closure.
