Day 1 Thursday, November 6

12:00pm Arrival into Mexico City

**2:30 pm** Arrive at to **Xochimilco** "Mexico's Venice" for a ride on a Trajinera boat with mariachis

Enjoy a boat ride in **Xochimilco** where the group will float along its tranquil waterways in a colorful boat called Trajinera, while eating a **taco** sipping a local **tequila**. Listen to the sounds of the **mariachis** permeate through the air as you sail

past the beautiful floating gardens.

Czechoslovakia, and Austria during the Second World War.

most treasured architectural masterpieces; it is also Latin America's largest and oldest

cathedral.

## Day 3 Saturday, November 8

**8:45** am After breakfast, depart hotel. Drive to the **pyramids.** \*Optional hot air balloon ride over the pyramids, 5:00am departure

**10:00 am** Arrive at the **Pyramids of Teotihuacan**. What is now the heart of this modern city

was also once the center of the Aztec world, Tenochtitlan. Famous for its large pyramids dedicated to the sun and the moon, the site also contains beautiful murals and carvings and several museums through which you can explore the city's

fascinating history.

**12:00 pm** Drive back from the pyramids.

**1:30 pm** Eat lunch at **Saks** restaurant

3:00 pm Proceed to Chapultepec Park and Castle (or free time to do some shopping)

Chapultepec is one of the largest city parks in the Western Hemisphere, and the oldest and largest urban parks in all of Latin America. Once located on the outskirts of the city, today this large over 686 hectares park is completely surrounded by the urban

center of

the city. Follow your guide on a walking tour to Chapultepec Castle located in

Chapultepec Park.
