Synopsis of the three major Jewish denominations:

Reform Judaism: Reform Judaism emphasizes the evolving nature of the faith, the superiority of its ethical aspects to the ceremonial ones and belief in a continuous revelation, closely intertwined with human reason and intellect. It is a form of Judaism, initiated in Germany, that has reformed or abandoned aspects of Orthodox Jewish worship and ritual in an attempt to adapt to modern changes in social, political and cultural life. Many rabbis of the Reform movement will officiate at interfaith marriages and same-sex marriages. The vast majority of Reform Jews support the secular Zionist movement. www.urj.org

<u>Conservative Judaism:</u> Conservative Judaism seeks to conserve essential elements of traditional Judaism but allows for the modernization of religious practices. Following Orthodoxy, many Conservatives insist on the sacredness of the Sabbath. Dietary laws are generally respected and observed. Starting in 1985, Conservative Judaism drew farther away from Orthodoxy by ordaining women rabbis. Many Conservatives, stressing Jewish nationalism as inseparable from the culture of the Jewish people, encourage the study of Hebrew and support the secular Zionist movement.

<u>Orthodox Judaism</u>: Orthodox Judaism is the branch of Judaism that most strictly adheres to traditional beliefs and practices. Jewish Orthodoxy believes that the Bible and other sacred Jewish writings contain not only eternally valid moral principles, but also historically and culturally conditioned modern adaptations and interpretations of the Law. In Orthodox Judaism, both the Written Law and the Oral Law remain the basis of religious observance.

Explanation of Holidays

ROSH HASHANA

Marks the beginning of the Jewish year and the period considered the High Holy Days.

YOM KIPPUR

Day of Atonement and the holiest day of the Jewish year.

SUKKOT

Harvest and thanksgiving festival observed for eight days.

SHEMINI ATZERET

Eighth and final day of Sukkot.

SIMCHAT TORAH

Celebrates the completion of the yearly cycle of reading the Hebrew Bible (Torah) and the beginning of the next cycle.

CHANUKAH*

Festival of lights observed for eight days.

PURIM*

Festive holiday celebrates the rescue of the Jewish community from a planned genocide, in ancient Persia, as recounted in the Book of Esther.

PASSOVER

A festival that comemorates the exodus of the Jews from slavery in Egypt observed for eight days. The first two days are observed as holy days.

SHAVUOT

Commemorates the receiving of the Torah by the Israelites at Mount Sinai.

SHABBAT

The Jewish Sabbath is observed every Friday night and Saturday. It reflects God's rest on the seventh day and is traditionally dedicated to prayer, reflection and rest. Observant Jews will not participate in secular events between sunset Friday and sunset Saturday.

All dates in **red** are High Holy Days. All dates in **blue** are Holy Days.

*It is permissible to work and attend school on these holidays.

Major Jewish Holidays & Religious Observances

Labor is traditionally prohibited during Jewish High Holy Days and major biblical festivals. As a result, Jewish people may be absent from work and school. All dates in **red** are High Holy Days: Expect virtually *all* observant Jewish students and staff to be absent. All dates in **blue** are Holy Days: Expect *some* Jewish students and staff to be absent.

Please note, Jewish holidays, determined by the lunar calendar, begin at sunset the day before the listed dates.

If such dates cannot be avoided, please consider the opportunity for reasonable makeups.
