Left vs Right: The Battle for Israel's Soul

Is Israel locked in a tragic dispute between two peoples claiming the same land — or a global conflict between Western democracy and Islamist terrorism? Is partition into two states the only way to ensure Israel's survival — or is it the surest path to ever-increasing bloodshed and possibly even endangering Israel's survival? Special guests Jonathan S. Tobin and J. J. Goldberg, will debate these and other critical issues concerning the State of Israel.

Jonathan S. Tobin (senior online editor and chief political blogger of *Commentary* magazine and a frequent commentator on domestic politics, Israel and Jewish affairs) argues that Israel stands on the front line of a global conflict between Islamist terrorism and Western democracy.

J.J. Goldberg (editor-at-large of *The Forward* Jewish American newspaper and former U.S. bureau chief of the Israeli news magazine *The Jerusalem Report*. He is the author of *Jewish Power: Inside the American Jewish Establishment*) contends that Israel could enter a regional alliance with moderate Sunni states, if it accepted the Saudi-led Arab Peace Initiative leading to a Palestinian state.

Ingrid and George Rose have successfully rebuilt their lives in Britain after fleeing Nazi Germany but, when their 15-year-old son Paul is a victim of bullying and anti-Semitism at school, the trauma of their own persecution reemerges with almost deadly consequences. "The Roses in June," set in swinging London on the eve of Israel's 1967 Six-Day War, explores the struggle of love, fear, regret and forgiveness on the eve of a possible second Holocaust and against the burdens of prejudice, traumatic memory and the complex attitude of the English towards the Jews as the school attempts, at all costs, to avoid any scandal.

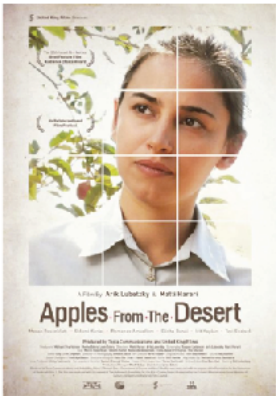

Biketown is a popular annual event hosted by the Lakin Preschool Committee in conjunction with the teachers and staff. One half of the parking lot will become a safe environment where the children can explore roads and shops on their riding toys. A mock town will be set up in the Social Hall to mimic services in the community. There will be a Grocery, Bake Shop, Salon, Book Store, Medical Office, and others. We will be offering 7:30 am drop off, regular afternoon programming and Stay and Play until 2 pm. Here are a few things to remember for the day of Biketown:

Summer Fun!!!

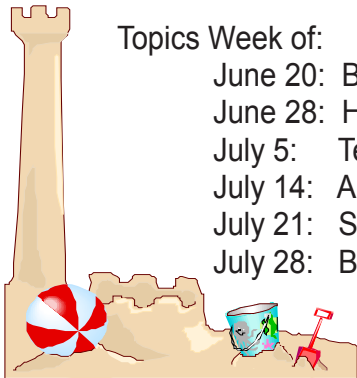
