

Jewish Community Relations



Our Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC) continues to fight for social justice and combat antisemitism in Berks County and beyond. Building relationships with other local non-profits and governmental bodies, JCRC works to promote unity within our community.

2024 Milestones

- JCRC meets regularly as part of the Greater Reading Unity Coalition made up of JFR, NAACP, Centro Hispano, the Islamic Center of Reading, Bring the Change and the LGBT Center.
- Represents Federation at the Reading Diversity Festival.
- Organized a Diversity Night at the Reading Phillies featuring the GRUC groups and with local sponsorship, gifted 5,000 tickets to our community members to attend the game.
- Participated in and helped organize a Kristallnacht Circle of Light and service at Christ Church in Reading.
- Represents Federation as a member of the PA Jewish Coalition Committee
- Organized "Shine A Light on Antisemitism" following the annual menorah lighting in Reading, inviting community members and local elected officials to educate them on rising antisemitism and how, together, we can combat it on a local level.
- Reached out to all Berks County School Districts and provided resources to raise awareness and help combat antisemitism.
- Attended NAACP conference, Harwood Institute for Public Innovation seminar, and participated in Juneteenth Festival.
- Attended a panel with Representative Chrissy Houlihan about 'safety in your house of worship.'

Lakin Preschool

Our preschool offered programming for toddlers and children up to age 5. The preschool is located within Reform Congregation Oheb Sholom, and has been funded, in part, by the Federation's Edwin A. & Alma Lakin Philanthropic Fund. As of June, 2025, the preschool will be closing. The Federation Board of Directors has been in close contact with the Yocum Institute for Arts Education, an already established preschool, and through a strategic alliance they will be adopting some of our Jewish curriculum to transition our students to their program, for those families who choose to participate.

Israel Emergency Relief Campaign

Jewish Federation of Reading's Israel Emergency Relief Campaign, initiated after the terrorist attack in Israel on October 7, 2023, wrapped up on April 30, 2024. Chaired and championed by Vic Hammel and Michael Fromm, the Campaign raised \$435,000 by community members and was matched dollar for dollar by the Foundation of the Jewish Federation of Reading, resulting in \$870,000 being sent to Israel for humanitarian aid. Funds were designated to programs vetted by the Jewish Federation of North America, including mental health care, medical care, relocation and housing costs and more.


